

the standard deputy sheriff patches. Deputy indicated members of the GCSO are not issued body worn cameras and his cruiser is also not equipped with a camera. Deputy said he did use some issued medical supplies during the incident (chest seals and gauze) however none of his issued equipment was damaged in any way. Deputy reported he was not physically injured as a result of the incident.
Deputy reported the only firearm he carried during the incident was his issued Glock 45, which is a 9mm handgun. Deputy did have his firearm out of the holster during the incident, however he confirmed he did not fire at any time.
Deputy signed written witness statement (statement) indicates Deputy (Deputy Deputy Deputy and he proceeded to Meade's camper in an attempt to locate and arrest Nancy Johnson (Johnson) on an active warrant. Deputy described previously encountering Johnson at the residence in the recent past.
Deputy statement describes the three deputies parking out of sight and approaching the camper on foot with Deputy proceeding to the front door to initiate contact, while he and Deputy maintained a position on the front corner of the camper. Deputy statement describes Deputy as knocking on the front door "approximately 9 times" and receiving no response. Deputy statement indicates there was a window near his position that Deputy moved to and looked in.
In reference to the events of Deputy ooking through the window and immediately surrounding the shooting Deputy wrote the following:
"Deputy then came over to where I was standing and was able to see through the window. He then advised me that he had a visual an Rodger Meade and a female laying in the bed. Deputy then announced "Rodger, it's vith the Sheriff's Office. Get your ass out here and talk to me." At that point it sounded as though someone got up and began moving inside. Deputy then moved back to the door which was on the North End of the camper."
"We could hear noise at the door which sounded like someone shaking the door knob. About that time a gunshot rang out. I then drew my firearm and looked towards Deputy  The door of the camper then opened, however from my point of view I could not see directly into the camper. By that point Deputy had drawn his firearm as well and was pointing towards the camper door. Deputy then discharged his firearm three times."
In reference to the events immediately after the shooting, Deputy wrote the following:
"I immediately ran to Deputy and we approached the door of the camper. I was able to pull the door on open and could see inside the camper. Deputy then reached down and grabbed the firearm and threw it out of the camper. We began yelling verbal commands for the occupants to show us their hands. The female that was inside then came to the doorway and exited the camper. Deputy took her and began securing her."

It was then that Deputy had made it to me and we made entry inside the camper. As I entered immediately to my left was Mr. Meade laying facedown in the bathroom area of the camper. Deputy and I continued giving verbal commands as we moved towards him. Once I realized he was unresponsive we began pulling him out into the larger portion of the camper. Deputy came back in to assist us briefly. I was able to get handcuffs on Mr. Meade and then lay him on his back where we began our initial assessment of what medical aid he would need.
I advised Deputy to go check Deputy for injuries he then exited the camper to complete that task. I then began CPR on Mr. Meade as I could see that he was not breathing. Once Deputy came back inside, I advised him to take over CPR as I was going to retrieve my patrol car for medical supplies. I then sprinted back to Bull Run Road and got my patrol car. While running back I radioed dispatch and advised them that shots had been fired and one individual was down. I requested they notify Sheriff Champlin, Chief Deputy Johnson, and Lieutenant Holcomb. I also requested that Gallia Emergency Medical Services respond, along with dispatch contacting air medical and putting them on standby. I then drove back to the driveway leading to the camper where I had to exit briefly to remove small branches and pieces of wood that were blocking entry into the driveway.
Once back on scene I collected my medical supplies and rushed back into the camper. I then began to cut off the shirt of Mr. Meade to better see his chest and back. I located a hole in the center of his chest right around his solar plexus. I applied a chest seal to this area. I then cleared the airway of Mr. Meade as it appeared he was regurgitating blood clots. We then turned Mr. Meade onto his side and I was able to locate a send hole near the center of his back. I then applied another Chest seal and we turned him back over.
I advised Deputy to begin applying chest compressions once more. I then opened my manual resuscitator pump and used it to administer breaths. Deputy and I continued administering CPR and first aid until additional Law enforcement showed up. Trooper J. Trelka and Sgt. B. Haislop of the Ohio State Highway Patrol had arrived on scene to assist us. Trooper Trelka eventually came inside and relieved me. Once outside I went to my patrol car with Deputy At this point Gallia County Emergency Medical Services had arrived on scene along with additional Law Enforcement units.

11/2/23

On October 22, 2023, I, Deputy along with Deputies and went to the residence of Rodger Meade in an attempt to serve an arrest warrant on Nancy Johnson. Deputy and I had been to the residence of Mr. Meade together over the last two to three months. When previously there we encountered Ms. Johnson, therefore we believed there was a high probability that she would be present at the residence again. Mr. Meade's residence was a camper/travel trailer that set parallel to State Route 160 and approximatley 60 yards off the roadway with trees surround much of the area.
We arrived at the intersection of Bull Run Road and State Route 160 where we parked and secured our patrol cars. We elected to walk in on foot to maintain a tactical and safe advantage. It was approximatley 175 to 200 yards from our patrol cars to the residence of Mr. Meade. We made our approach to the residence coming from the south on State Route 160. We entered the driveway and approached the camper. There were several vehicles in the driveway one we recognized as Mr. Meade's pickup truck.
We made it to the camper where I stood at the front corner on the south end, Deputy was standing behind me initially looking at the front and rear of the camper. Deputy then approached the door and began knocking on it. Deputy knocked approximatley 9 times in a respectful manner. However, we never got a response from inside the camper. It was then I noticed the window just above my head had no covering on it.
Deputy then came over to where I was standing and was able to see through the window. He then advised me that he had a visual on Rodger Meade and a female laying in the bed. Deputy then announced "Rodger, it's with the Sheriff's Office. Get your ass out here and talk to me." At that point it sounded as though someone got up and began moving inside. Deputy then moved back to the door which was on the North End of the camper.
We could hear noise at the door which sounded like someone shaking the door knob. About that time a gunshot rang out. I then drew my firearm and looked towards Deputy The door of the camper then opened, however from my point of view I could not see directly into the camper. By that point Deputy had drawn his firearm as well and was pointing towards the camper door. Deputy then discharged his firearm three times.
I immediately ran to Deputy and and we approached the door of the camper. I was able to pull the door on open and could see inside the camper. Deputy then reached down and grabbed a firearm which was some type of long gun with a short stalk on it. Deputy then grabbed the firearm and threw it out of the camper. We began yelling verbal commands for the occupants to show us their hands. The female that was inside then came to the doorway and exited the camper. Deputy took her and began securing her.
