## Narrative:

On July 25, 2022, at 0318 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent James Poole (SA Poole) interviewed Guernsey County Deputy Ben Coblentz (Deputy Coblentz). The interview took place at the scene located at 135 Old National Rd., Lore City, Ohio. Deputy Coblentz was identified as being a police officer who responded to a vehicle barricade situation which involved the now deceased, Joy Graham (Graham). The purpose of the interview was to obtain all relevant information of the incident known or observed by this officer.

This interview was audio recorded, and a copy of the recording was saved electronically within the case file. Please refer to the recording for specific quotes. The following is a summation of the interview.

Prior to the interview SA Poole advised Deputy Coblentz that BCI was conducting a criminal investigation separate from any internal investigation and that this interview was voluntary. Deputy Coblentz verbally confirmed he understood and acknowledged he would like to continue with the interview.

Deputy Coblentz stated he was signing on to start his shift when he heard there was a pursuit in the county. Deputy Coblentz stated he marked in service and requested to assist in the situation.

Deputy Coblentz explained when he arrived he positioned himself behind the driver side door of a Barnesville police cruiser. The cruiser was positioned to the rear of Graham's vehicle. Deputy Coblentz said he had is department issued rifle out and could see Graham through her side mirror.

Deputy Coblentz explained when the SRT approached the vehicle his focus was on Graham's door in case she was to jump out and start shooting. Deputy Coblentz explained when the flash grenade went off he was too focused on Graham's door and did not see who fired first or who

shot. He just knew that there was some firing from the left side of the vehicle from the SRT. Deputy Coblentz stated he could not identify who exactly shot.

SA Poole asked if Deputy Coblentz ever discharged his weapon. Deputy Coblentz said, "No."

SA Poole asked if Deputy Coblentz saw who shot. Deputy Coblentz explained he was too focused on Graham's door and did not see who fired first or who shot. He stated he could not identify who exactly shot.

SA Poole asked if Deputy Coblentz remembered how many shots were fired. Deputy Coblentz said, "No."

SA Poole asked if Deputy Coblentz's actions and the actions of the officers around him were in line with policy and procedures. Deputy Coblentz said, "Yes, and yes."


The interview concluded at 0336 hours.
