Session 1: Prevention Education in Schools and Communities Moderator: Ohio Attorney General Mike DeWine Sanctuary

This session will review the recommendations of the Ohio Joint Study Committee on Drug Use Prevention Education. The group's report offers a plan to incorporate drug education in all grade levels. To showcase the importance of drug education, school officials and law enforcement officers will share how they are working to change the culture of drug misuse in their communities.
