Questions and Answers

Q1:

Will minor deviations from the required specifications and services be considered?

A1:

As stated in the RFP, the AGO/OPOTA may waive minor defects and/or request clarifications in the responses that do not materially deviate from the specifications or otherwise create an unfair competitive advantage. The quote must comply in all material respects with the specifications listed in the RFQ, however the AGO will consider some alternatives that meet the intent of the RFQ. For example:

In lieu of a rack mount cabinet for all equipment, the AGO may consider other efficient storage options for the equipment.

In lieu of the scenario development software and HD camera, the AGO may consider other software that would allow the AGO to tailor the scenarios that are otherwise included with the equipment.

This list is not meant to be exhaustive.

Q2:

Will the AGO conduct site visits as part of the selection process?

A2:

The AGO may conduct site visits as part of the selection process. The AGO, at its discretion, may make arrangements at its own expense with vendors who submit quotes, in order to see vendor equipment demonstrations. The same information will be provided to all the proposed vendors as part of the site visit process. Points will not be separately awarded for demonstration presentations, rather the site visits are for informational purposes only.

Q3:

Good Morning,
I am looking for clarification on what exactly specification 1 *Multi-Room/Building firearms and use of force simulator/s involves/means?* Is this three stand-a-lone single screen simulators in a "Shoot House" type environment?

Any further information or clarification would be greatly appreciated.

A3:

The AGO would prefer that the single screens, be in different training spaces but interactive; continue with the same scenario from room to room. The student-officer would start the scenario out in room A, the suspect on the simulator takes off running, the student-officer pursues into a different training room or building, and reengages the suspect on that simulator screen.

The AGO reserves the discretion to evaluate different configurations proposed by vendors to achieve its “on the move” virtual reality simulation requirement.
