Responding officer casually made contact with the individual without his firearm drawn. The individual was in a vehicle and the officer was at the driver's door speaking with the individual. Other officers later pulled up and recovered two guns from the male.	This was either a lack of training or complacency issue involving the first officer at scene. 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situational awareness / unknown threat	yes	An officer, by himself, was trying to persuade a person with a mental illness to voluntarily get into the cruiser for a ride to be evaluated. The person fit the criteria of emergency hospitalization. After approximately 15 minutes of talking to the person, the officer went hands on and a fight ensued, followed by an officer in trouble alert. It took several officers to control the male.	The officer thought he would be able to persuade the person into the cruiser and did not imagine the violent change of events. other	yes	A bicycle officer was approached by a dog in an aggressive manner. Officer attempted several trained methods (e.g., shook keys, yelled) to distract the dog that did not work. 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driving	yes	An officer responded to an officer in trouble call and was almost struck by another cruiser. The first cruiser had the right of way, but would have been involved in an accident if he had not been driving defensively.	Tunnel vision, over eagerness, lack of situational awareness, adrenaline	Reinforce defensive driving habits. Make sure officers are aware of tunnel vision and issues that are caused by adrenaline. personnel	yes	Officers responded to a report of a vehicle firing shots at a bar. The incident occurred at a location that has had numerous shooting and gang violence issues. Two officers located the suspect vehicle and immediately stopped the vehicle. There were 5 occupants in the vehicle. Two firearms were recovered from the vehicle. The immediate stopping of the vehicle caused there to be 2 officers stopping a vehicle with possibly 5 armed suspects that had just committed a violent crime.	The officers got tunnel vision and were over excited. This caused them to immediately stop the vehicle, without waiting for assistance.	Reinforce calming down, and ensuring that we do things as safely as possible.
