 Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) Certification - July 2014**

License or Certificate	General Requirements
<p>Peace Officer Training Certification</p>	<p>Completion of Ohio peace officer basic training program.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An individual who has successfully completed prior training or education other than under the auspices of the Ohio peace officer training commission and who is appointed as a peace officer in Ohio may request credit for that portion of the basic training course which is equivalent to training previously completed. Training or education which shall be accepted includes, but is not limited to, training or education certified by another state, another government agency, military service, the state highway patrol or a college, university or other educational institution. OAC 109:2-1-12(B). • Once a person is appointed as a peace officer, that person and their agency request a prior equivalency analysis from OPOTC staff. The form for that submission is found at: www.OhioAttorneyGeneral.gov/SF410bas <p>Breaks in Service</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • If a person is already a peace officer, and has a break in service of more than one year but less than four years, one must generally take certain refresher classes, and if the break is service is four years or more, the person must re-take peace officer basic training in its entirety. OAC 109:2-1-12(D). The time periods for breaks in service are extended for those serving in an active duty capacity. OAC 109:2-1-12(D)(4). Upon release from active duty, the person submits the Certificate of Release from Active Duty form (DD 214) to OPOTC staff and new training deadlines are determined. • If a person completes peace officer basic training but is not appointed to an agency, but becomes appointed from one-year to two-years after completion of training, one must generally take certain refresher classes, and if the appointment occurs more than two-years after completion of training, the person must re-take peace officer basic training in its entirety. OAC 109:2-1-07(B). The time period following completion of training is extended for those on active duty. OAC 109:2-1-07(B)(4). Upon release from active duty, the person submits the Certificate of Release from Active Duty form (DD 214) to OPOTC staff and new training deadlines are determined. <p>Continuing Professional Training (CPT)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Based upon OPOTC determination, in certain years a particular number of CPT hours are required of each peace officer and trooper. If the appointing authority of the officer or trooper asks the OPOTC Executive Director in writing, the time period for completing CPT can be extended due to emergency circumstances. Those circumstances can include prolonged military service. OAC 109:2-18-02(D).
<p>Adult Parole Officer Training Certification</p>	<p>Completion of Ohio adult parole officer basic training programs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The OPOTC will provide credit for that portion of the adult parole basic training program which is equivalent to training previously completed. Training or education which shall be accepted includes, but is not limited to, training or education certified by another state, another government agency, military service, the state highway patrol or a college, university or other educational institution. • The applicant submits a request for a prior equivalency analysis from OPOTC staff. <p>Armed Bailiff Basic Training Certification</p>	<p>Completion of Ohio armed bailiff basic training programs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The OPOTC will provide credit for that portion of the armed bailiff basic training program which is equivalent to training previously completed. Training or education which shall be accepted includes, but is not limited to, training or education certified by another state, another government agency, military service, the state highway patrol or a college, university or other educational institution. OAC 109:2-5-10. • The applicant, with approval of the applicant's chief executive officer submits a request for a prior equivalency analysis from OPOTC staff. <p>Canine Unit Training Certification</p>	<p>Completion of Ohio canine unit training programs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The OPOTC will provide credit for that portion of canine unit training program which is equivalent to training previously completed. Training or education which shall be accepted includes, but is not limited to, training or education certified by another state, another government agency, military service, the state highway patrol or a college, university or other educational institution. • The applicant, with approval of the applicant's sponsoring agency submits a request for a prior equivalency analysis from OPOTC staff. <p>Corrections Basic Training Certification for Full Service Corrections Officers</p>	<p>Completion of Ohio corrections basic training programs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The OPOTC will provide credit for that portion of the corrections basic training program which is equivalent to training previously completed. Training or education which shall be accepted includes, but is not limited to, training or education certified by another state, another government agency, military service, the state highway patrol or a college, university or other educational institution. OAC 109:2-11(C). • The applicant submits a request for a prior equivalency analysis from OPOTC staff. The form for such submission is found at: www.OhioAttorneyGeneral.gov/SF410cbt
<p>Jailer Basic Training Certification for 5-Day or 12-Hour Facilities</p>	<p>Completion of Ohio jailer basic training programs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The OPOTC will provide credit for that portion of the jailer basic training program which is equivalent to training previously completed. Training or education which shall be accepted includes, but is not limited to, training or education certified by another state, another government agency, military service, the state highway patrol or a college, university or other educational institution. • The applicant submits a request for a prior equivalency analysis from OPOTC staff. <p>Probation Officer Training Firearms Certification</p>	<p>Completion of Ohio probation basic training firearms programs.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The OPOTC will provide credit for that portion of the probation officer basic firearms training program which is equivalent to training previously completed. Training or education which shall be accepted includes, but is not limited to, training or education certified by another state, another government agency, military service, the state highway patrol or a college, university or other educational institution. • The applicant submits a request for a prior equivalency analysis from OPOTC staff.
