Narrative:

On August 8, 2023, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Nick Valente (Valente) received a collection of records from the Ashland County Sheriff's Office (ACSO) related to the death of Larry Dunham (Dunham). Included in these records were copies of the personnel files and training records of Deputy Jacob Hemenway (Deputy Hemenway), Deputy Johnie Wilcox (Deputy Wilcox), and Deputy Brittney Pennywitt (Deputy Pennywitt).

SA Valente reviewed the personnel files of the three involved deputies and noted the following:

Re Deputy Hemenway:

- Deputy Hemenway began his career with the ACSO as a part-time deputy working in the jail on January 3, 2019. Deputy Hemenway began work in the enforcement division of the ACSO on February 26, 2022.
