Records include, but are not limited to, notice of opportunity for hearing, letter of intent, request for hearing, hearing notifications, scheduling information, case summons, court record, continuances, investigation file sent by client, legal research, evidentiary materials, pleadings, exhibits, correspondence, attorney work product, report and recommendation from hearing officer, settlement and negotiation documents, and final adjudication order.	Possibly contains medical records, social security numbers, attorney/client privilege, attorney work product, etc. (ORC 149.43). Information may also be protected by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA).		Electronic –5 years after hearing closed. Paper –5 years after hearing closed.
