On December 18, 2012, while assigned to Special Investigation in cooperation with the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation and Identification (BCII) and the East Cleveland Police Department (ECPD). BCII Agent Scott Stranahan and Detective David Jacobs, Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) were assigned to interview Cleveland Police Department (CPD) Patrolman DONALD KOPCHAK in the presence of CPD Union representative Steve Kinas and Union Attorney Patrick D'Angelo. The Interview took place at 4055 Highlander parkway, Richfield, Ohio 44286. KOPCHAK thereafter provided the following information concerning the captioned incident:

DETAILS

On November 29th, 2012, KOPCHAK was at the Fifth District when he became aware of a vehicle pursuit that started out of the Second District. KOPCHAK's partner was Officer Natasha COLLINS. KOPCHAK went to his vehicle (Crown Victoria unknown vehicle number) and waited in the passenger seat for Officer COLLINS. COLLINS never came out of the Fifth District Police station. KOPCHAK went back inside and could find her. KOPCHAK went back to the Crown

Victoria and was gestured to by his Supervisor, Sergeant Dana Saffo to leave without his partner. According to KOPCHAK, Sergeant Saffo made a hand gesture with his thumb. KOPCHAK left the police station and headed east and then immediately switched lanes westbound. KOPCHAK made it to East 72nd where he went south. KOPCHAK saw police cars turn onto Ansel Road but did see other police cars continue east on St Clair Avenue toward East 105th Street. The next radio traffic KOPCHAK heard was that the chase was Superior Avenue toward Cleveland Heights and East Cleveland. KOPCHAK then heard radio traffic that the pursuit had just entered a water treatment plant (later confirmed it was a school). Prior to the water treatment radio traffic he heard "shots fired" being called on the radio. KOPCHAK was at East 125th Street and Superior Avenue when the "shots fired" call came over the radio. KOPCHAK never proceeded to the shooting scene but did hear Lieutenant Cheryl Brown call out "everybody is ok, no officers were hurt." KOPCHAK continued north on East 125th Street and headed back to the Fifth District. KOPCHAK never witnessed the suspect vehicle.

No specialized training or certifications other than prior employment at Cuyahoga County Sheriff's Officer as a Correction Officer, JOHNSON was a member of the "Jail SRT Team"

Prior shooting involvement-Yes, twice, September of 2011 and September of 2012

No prior military experience

DETAILS

JOHNSON and SCHNEIDER were near Broadway Avenue when they received a radio broadcast for "someone is shooting from a car at a Police Officer near the Justice Center."

JOHNSON switched car to Channel 2 while keeping his portable radio on Channel 3. JOHNSON and SCHNEIDER make it the bridge near Progressive Field when they hear the pursuit is heading

west. JOHNSON goes west on the Detroit Avenue Bridge and hears radio traffic for Steelyard. JOHNSON goes east on Lorain Avenue toward the Carnegie Bridge. JOHNSON hears radio traffic that the pursuit is on 90 east. JOHNSON goes toward East 55th Street and Woodland Avenue. Radio then advises the pursuit is southbound on East 71st Street. JOHNSON gets to East 79th Street and Wade Park Avenue when he sees the pursuit and the suspect vehicle is in his rear view mirror. JOHNSON stated he had to swerve out of the way of the suspect vehicle which was going at least 70 mph. JOHNSON waited for all the Police Cars to pass him and began to follow them. JOHNSON was pretty sure that the suspect vehicle was not going to make the turn at Wade Park Avenue because of his speed but was able to make it and the pursuit continued toward the City Of East Cleveland. The pursuit continued to Euclid Avenue past Superior Avenue and suddenly made a right hand turn from Euclid Avenue up a street Johnson was not familiar with. JOHNSON followed the pursuit and parked on Terrace Avenue and heard "shots fired, shots fired" over the radio. JOHNSON and SCHNEIDER exited their vehicle and took cover as they proceeded up the hill to where the shots were coming from. JOHNSON had his weapon ready and once he made it to the top of hill the shooting had stopped. JOHNSON stated he advised dispatch of his location and began to check Officers for any injuries. JOHNSON stayed on scene for approximately two hours.

DETAILS

On November 29th, 2012 BECKNER and LASKA were driving westbound on Huron Road near Ontario Avenue when they noticed a Second District zone car (possibly 244L) drive by with their overhead lights on and no headlights. BECKNER switched to Channel 2 to advise the Second District car about his lights. BECKNER became aware of the pursuit at that time. BECKNER continued to the Detroit/Superior Bridge when they heard over the radio "they are shooting at us." They continued to West 85th Street and went south and then east on Clark Avenue. They then continued to Detroit Avenue and went east to the Carnegie Avenue bridge. The radio traffic revealed that the vehicle pursuit had just exited east 72nd Street from 190.

During the pursuit BECKNER did hear a "shots fired, shots fired" call and this took place just prior to their arrival at Heritage Middle School. BECKNER stated he "never" witnessed the suspect vehicle until they arrived at Heritage Middle School. When BECKNER and LASKA arrived at Heritage Middle School the shooting had already taken place. BECKNER and LASKA stayed on scene for about five minutes and then left the area. BECKNER stated the third platoon Supervisor Lieutenant Wilson conferred with them prior to them leaving.
