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MR. GARDNER: We sort of have a canned speech we're giving everybody. My name is Scott Gardner. I'm a detective with the City of East Cleveland. I'm attached to the Major Crimes Unit over there.

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Most important thing is that you understand this is not -- we are not conducting an internal investigation. We're conducting the criminal investigation. Nothing is to you at all. We're investigating the incident.

Nobody here is judging you. Nobody's going to be looking any differently at you. We're just trying to figure out what happened.

THE WITNESS: Okay.

MR. GARDNER: Obviously other people have come in. I can only stress, try to be as honest as you can.

If you don't know something, just say,
"I don't know." It's better for you to say, "I
don't know" than us to run into inconsistencies
later. Okay?

THE WITNESS: Okay.

MR. SARAYA: I'm John Saraya. I'm with BCI. I've been doing this for awhile. I've been

doing officer-involved shootings for about 15 years. Okay?

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We are technically assigned as the lead agency. Our policy is, this is criminal. You're going to be given your Miranda warnings. It doesn't mean that you've done anything wrong. It just means that you have all rights and protections just the same as everybody else.

THE WITNESS: Okay.

MR. SARAYA: If at any time you have a question, ask us.

If you have a moment that you think you want to talk to these guys first, it's not a problem to step outside, confer and come back.

All right?

THE WITNESS: (Affirmative nodding of head.)

MR. SARAYA: We're not going to sit here and point our fingers in your face and yell and scream and throw tantrums or anything like that.

When we get into these, please don't take the questions personally. Some of the questions we're going to ask are to elicit more detail and have you articulate things a little

4 bit farther. 1 There are a couple of questions that we 3 admit are eye-rollers. You know, it's like, 4 "You're really asking me this?" 5 And, yeah, we are, because we just need 6 the answers from you. 7 THE WITNESS: Okay. 8 MR. SARAYA: Okay? It's not because we 9 think you're dumb or incompetent. It's just 10 we're going to ask you because we need to ask you this. We're asking everybody. 11 12 THE WITNESS: Okay. 13 MR. SARAYA: Okay? 14 THE WITNESS: (Affirmative nodding of 15 head.) MR. GARDNER: Having said that, I'm 16 17 going to advise you of your rights. 18 THE WITNESS: Okay. 19 MR. GARDNER: You have the right to 20 remain silent. Anything you say can and will be 21

used against you in court. You have the right to consult with an attorney, have an attorney present during questioning. If you cannot afford an attorney, one can be provided to you before

You were at the house, the station 11 house? 12 A. Yes. I was in the roll-call room. My partner was downstairs working out. 13 14 Q. Okay. Then how did you become aware that something was going on? 15 A. We were listening to the first couple 16 minutes of the chase --17 18 Q. You guys --19 A. -- over the radio. 20 On your portable? You guys have Q. speakers in the stationhouse? 21 2.2 A. Portable. 2.3 Q. So tell us what you did. 24 A. First couple minutes I sat there. My

FTO came up from the basement where the gym is and said, "Do you want to get involved?"

And I said, "By the time we get there, it's probably going to be over."

And he said, "Do you want to get involved?"

And I said, "Yeah, let's go," and we ran out to the car and got in the car.

- Q. Okay. Then, approximately, when you get in your car, do you remember where they were as far as where they were in the pursuit or --
- A. I believe they were at that roundabout by Steelyard.
- Q. Okay. So you guys hop in your car. They're at the roundabout, somewhere in there.
 - A. Uh-huh.

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- Q. What did you do?
- A. We went right to the highway. Got on -by the time we had gotten in the car and
 everything, I think they had -- they were going
 down 14th, I think it was, at Abbey and we're
 beginning to jump on the highway, so we jumped on
 the highway.
 - Q. 90?

- A. Jumped on 71.
- Q. 71, okay.

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- A. To go to 90.
- Q. Okay. All right. What happened then?
- A. We he pretty much drove as fast as he could to try and catch up. We were at Deadman's Curve, I believe, when they were at 72nd. We enter up to 72nd, got off.

When we got off, we were following a

Third District car, because we figured they knew
where they were going. We really don't know
where we were.

- Q. Was there any other cars in front of the Third District car, or you're just following a lone car trying --
- A. We were trying to follow a lone car to catch up.
 - Q. So what happens next?
- A. Then we went down a few streets. Again, I don't really remember what they were. I'm not too familiar with the area.

But we pulled onto Wymore, I think it was, and turned into the driveway to the school.

And as soon as we turned into the driveway, we

were right there.

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- Q. Okay. So when you're -- you're on, probably, Euclid. Is there just still that lone Third District car or do you --
- A. No. By that time I knew there were a bunch of cars that had been pulling down Wymore.
 - Q. Do you know approximately how many or --
- A. No. Because I think that that road is kind of a dirt road or they're doing construction or something, and they had kicked up a bunch of dirt and we couldn't really -- couldn't see too far ahead.
- Q. Did you see any other agencies as far as cruisers?
 - A. No. All I saw was Cleveland.
- Q. Okay. All right. I'm going to flip to
 -- let me show you a couple maps here.
- MR. SARAYA: (Inaudible) there, if need be.
 - Q. All right. So you turn off to Wymore. So Euclid is down here. You turn off to Wymore.
- What you really can't see is there's -the access road is right here.

A. Okay.

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- Q. This is what you were describing, I'm assuming, as the dirt coming up?
- A. Uh-huh.
 - Q. Okay? So you come up with the drive.

 I'm going to show you a closer picture. This is essentially right here this lays on.

You're still behind cars, right?

THE WITNESS: Not at that point. I really don't remember. MR. SARAYA: Okay. What happens next?

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THE WITNESS: After I ducked, I saw my

partner open his door, got out of the car.

And I remembered one of the things they always told us in the academy is, "Get out of the car because it's a coffin," so I thought, "okay, I've got to get out of the car."

And when I opened the door, where I thought we were being shot at was directly -- where I would have got out was directly in the line -- what I thought at the time was the line of fire.

MR. SARAYA: Okay.

THE WITNESS: So after I got out of the car, I turned and fired two rounds into the windshield and then as I was running backwards to try and get behind our car for cover.

BY MR. GARDNER:

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- Q. The questions were asked -- I mean, we'll ask you specifically if you know information now. Just try to give us the answers right now of what you knew then.
 - A. Okay.
 - Q. Okay? Or what you thought then.
- 23 | A. Uh-huh.
 - Q. So you fired how many shots, I'm sorry?

- A. Two -- two shots.
- Q. Into the windshield?
- A. Yes.

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- Q. Do you know -- I mean, were you shooting for anything in particular or --
 - A. I was shooting for the driver.
 - Q. And then you retreated back?
 - A. Retreated behind the car.
 - Q. Which side?
- A. I came around this way and then came around to this side of the car.

- THE WITNESS: Yes, my partner was next
- 16 to me.
- 17 MR. SARAYA: All right. Now, I just
- 18 | want to clarify.
- 19 You're opening the door and you know
- 20 rounds are coming down your side of the car. You
- 21 come out. You take two shots and you
- 22 | backpedaled?
- 23 THE WITNESS: I was shooting as I was
- 24 going backwards like this.

1 MR. SARAYA: Okay. All right.

At that time did you know how many rounds you fired?

THE WITNESS: No.

MR. SARAYA: Okay. How did you know it was two rounds, then?

THE WITNESS: After -- I'm sorry. After everything was done, I knew that I had shot twice. I guess I didn't know at the time that it was two rounds.

BY MR. GARDNER:

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- Q. That's fine. How did you find out?
- A. After when they did the -- they did a check of our weapon.
 - Q. Do you know who checked your weapon?
- 16 A. It was Lieutenant Timm.
 - Q. Did they take your weapon at that point?
 - A. No, not at that point. We had to go downtown and turn it in.
 - Q. I mean, they didn't remove it to inventory?
 - A. They -- they removed it. They checked it, checked the rounds and everything. Then gave it back to us. Then we had to go downtown and

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1 turn them in.
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MR. SARAYA: All right. We kind of

 - Q. So primarily the way you recall is, a guy jumps on top, he shoots inside, and then everything stops?
 - A. That's really the last thing I remember at that point.
- MR. SARAYA: Anybody still yelling out verbal commands, "hold fire," "cease fire"?
- 21 THE WITNESS: I couldn't tell you.
- MR. SARAYA: Okay.
- 23 BY MR. GARDNER:
 - Q. During any part of the pursuit did you

or your partner -- I guess it probably would be you. Did you guys use the radio at all?

A. No.

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MR. SARAYA: What were you hearing on the radio?

THE WITNESS: We heard that the suspect was pointing a gun out the window. We heard the person that was calling out the chase said -- I remember him saying, "Be careful, he's pointing a qun."

MR. SARAYA: Okay. What else did you hear?

THE WITNESS: Just the streets that we were passing -- they were passing in the Second District. And then once we got in the car and were actually in pursuit, we heard them calling out the streets.
