
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1	MR. SARAYA: How are you doing?

2	I'm a detective/sergeant with East Cleveland.	
3	MR. SARAYA: We've been put together	
4	we're working together to go through all of this.	
5	All right?	
6	A list of formal we're pretty much	
7	asking everybody the same set of questions.	
8	While there are a couple that you may feel are an	
9	eye-roller or anything else, it's just questions	
10	we need to ask because we need the answer.

11	warrants, stuff like that, drug training.	
12	Q. Okay. Military experience?	
13	A. No.	
14	Q. Okay. Fire qualif firearms	
15	qualification this year?	
16	A. Yes.	
17	Q. Which guns? Handgun, shotguns,	
18	submachine gun?	
19	A. We did both handgun and shotgun.	
20	Q. Okay. Did you have any use of force	
21	training this past year?	
22	A. Yes. We had that with our firearms	
23	training. It's like a segment, a block segment,	
24	that we do.

1	Q. Okay. Have you ever been involved in	
2	any prior shootings?	
3	A. Yes.	
4	Q. Okay. How many?	
5	A. One.	
6	Q. One?	
7	A. Where I actually shot was back in 1984.	
8	I thought that would be the end of it. I didn't	
9	want to go through this again.	
10	Q. That's understandable. Okay. All	
11	right. Let's start with this is where you get	
12	to carry on.	
13	What happened Thursday night? Start	
14	with the beginning of the shift. How did the	
15	shift go?	
16	A. Well, we at the beginning of the	
17	shift we set up a buy/pay situation where an	
18	undercover officer purchased some drugs. The	
19	guy, he was already under arrest; and my partner,	
20	Erin O'Donnell, and I took the subject down to	
21	the Justice Center. We booked him.	
22	We were returning back to the Third	
23	District, going back to our office. We came	
24	around the back way; and as we're coming in as

1	I'm pulling into the driveway, I see our sergeant	
2	running, he has his rifle bag, and Ereg	
3	Detective Ereg, running to the car.	
4	I yelled out, "What's going on?" And I	
5	don't think he heard me right away. So I pulled	
6	up on him. I said, "What's going on?" He said,	
7	"Change to Channel 2. There's a chase.	
8	Policemen have been shot at."	
9	So we changed the channel to two, and we	
10	could hear as soon as we hit Channel 2 they're	
11	broadcasting and they're saying that they're on	
12	the freeway and they're it's right around	
13	Chester. I think they I believe they were	
14	saying they were passing Chester. They were like	
15	anticipating the car to get off.	
16	And I'm trying to figure out the best	
17	route to take to get to where they're at, because	
18	being at because we were at 105 and Chester.	
19	Since they already went past Chester, I was	
20	trying to figure out and he says, "Well, I	
21	believe the next thing I heard was they were	
22	coming up on 55th," which is quite a ways from	
23	where we're at.	
24	So I start making my way down 105, and

1	they passed 55th. They weren't going to get off
2	there. They're coming down. And so we're
3	thinking the next place that they may to try to
4	get off is 72nd.
5	I hit Superior, I'm going down Superior,
6	and I end up as this is happening, they did
7	get off and they were coming south. And as as
8	they came to St. Clair, we're coming up I think
9	it was I think it might be 71st or 69th, I'm
10	not sure. We came up and we saw them coming to
11	that intersection there at St. Clair, at 72nd and
12	St. Clair; and they went by us and several cars
13	went by us. I did a flip and I turned around,
14	and we joined in on the chase.
15	They ended up going south down 71st. I
16	think we were around Decker, so (inaudible)
17	mentioned something like Decker and Addison.
18	They made their way to Wade Park. I'm trying to
19	remember the streets. Ended up making our way to
20	Wade Park. Went east on Wade Park and then to,
21	what is it, I would guess like 118th; and then he

23 east on Euclid. And I don't know -- this area

22

went south on 118th to Euclid, and then he went

24 I'm really not that familiar with. I can't -- I

1	couldn't tell you we started he cut south
2	again, and then you're I think we made a few
3	turns in there.
4	I really couldn't tell you what the
5	streets were.
6	Q. Okay.
7	A. At one point they said I remember
8	they brought up that they thought they were
9	pulling in towards the water treatment plant, and
10	we were just like we were on the street just
11	east of that; and I think there's like a driveway
12	exit or something, driveway exits or something
13	MR. GARDNER: Does this help refresh
14	your memory? This is Terrace. You have Wymore
15	and Lee. This is the parking lot here.
16	MR. SARAYA: You're not even up to this
17	point then.
18	THE WITNESS: Well, we're they're
19	here. I mean, this is is this the incident
20	here?
21	MR. GARDNER: Yes, yes. You think you
22	hear something about them going into the water
23	treatment plant?
24	THE WITNESS: Yeah. They thought they

17 were at the water treatment. It turned out -- it 1 2 turned out to be the school. 3 MR. GARDNER: Oh, okay. 4 THE WITNESS: But they referred to it as 5 the water treatment plant. I didn't know one 6 thing from another, really. 7 MR. GARDNER: It's somewhat hard to see 8 because these trees are blocking, but the drive 9 comes to Terrace. 10 THE WITNESS: I guess what we did was -is this -- is this a walkway? 11 12 MR. GARDNER: That's a sidewalk. 13 MR. SARAYA: So there's a sidewalk here. 14 This is the driveway. The driveway comes up, 15 straight up Wymore. THE WITNESS: So I must have been on Lee 16 17 here. 18 MR. SARAYA: Okay. 19 THE WITNESS: And as I come up on Lee here, we're waiting to see, because I believe 20 21 they made reference to it being a deadened or 2.2 something; and we were thinking, well, if they came back out, we didn't know which way they were 23 24 going to go.

18 And as I'm sitting here waiting, you 1 hear, pop, pop; and I was like, "Shit." And I --2 3 I don't know if O'Donnell heard it or not. I 4 mentioned it. I don't know if she heard me. She 5 was -- you know, we were listening to the radio; 6 but I heard a distinct pop, pop. I was like, 7 "Fuck, they're shooting." 8 So I started coming across -- I cut 9 across here. I'm trying to think how -- I cut 10 across here. 11 MR. SARAYA: How about this? 12 MR. GARDNER: Now you're down here. 13 MR. SARAYA: This will zoom in a little. 14 I think we can get into this more. I have a bunch of these. 15 So here's Lee road. Here's our 16 17 driveway. 18 THE WITNESS: Where does the car --19 where did the car end up? 20 MR. SARAYA: It ends up --21 MR. GARDNER: Do you want to use this 2.2 one? 23 THE WITNESS: I need some type of 24 reference here.

19 MR. GARDNER: This is where it ends up 1 2 at. 3 THE WITNESS: So I cut across -- I came 4 across through here somehow. 5 MR. SARAYA: So you jumped the sidewalk? 6 THE WITNESS: Jumped the sidewalk. 7 MR. D'ANGELO: (Inaudible) the car? 8 THE WITNESS: I was driving the car. 9 And I came up to the top here and I pulled off 10 onto the grass; and we were still hearing, pop, 11 pop, pop, pop. I'm hearing the pop and shots 12 being fired. As we pull up onto the grass, they're --13 14 they're broadcasting it. And we're starting to 15 get out of the car, because you're hearing them broadcasting, they're saying, "Shots fired. 16 Shots fired. They're shooting at us." They're 17 18 saying -- they're indicating that these guys are 19 shooting at them. 20 I remember I'm thinking, man, these are fuck- -- bad motherfuckers, because they fucking 21 22 -- you know, usually normal -- from my experience 23 of watching videos, police shootings don't last 24 like this. You know, it's usually over with

pretty quick. And I'm thinking in my mind, well, 1 these guys are forced -- I'm thinking that 2 3 they're probably vested or something. 4 My thought was, a while back I don't 5 know if you recall the LA shooting, the bank 6 robbers. Those guys are taking round after 7 round. They were never going down. 8 And I came up, we get out of the car; 9 and I'm thinking this has got to be -- these 10 guys, these are bad people. They've got to be stopped. And I came down and I came -- is this 11 -- there's no other cars here? 12 13 MR. SARAYA: That's where everything 14 ended up at. THE WITNESS: Because I wasn't sure if 15 the other car was here. So I would have been --16 17 this part of the car, this is -- I don't know 18 which way this is facing. 19 MR. GARDNER: It's facing this way. 20 MR. D'ANGELO: Yes. 21 THE WITNESS: (Inaudible) the zone car. 2.2 MR. SARAYA: These two zone cars are 23 facing in. This is our suspect car facing out. 24 THE WITNESS: Okay.

1	MR. SARAYA: Okay?	
2	THE WITNESS: So I was at the rear of	
3	the zone car.	
4	MR. SARAYA: Okay.	
5	THE WITNESS: Is that 238?	
6	MR. SARAYA: Yeah.	
7	THE WITNESS: I was at the rear of 238.	
8	I came around and I see that there's one or two	
9	officers on the driver's side that are firing	
10	into the driver's side of the car. And I can see	
11	that and I notice that the windshield's blown	
12	out. Not blown out. The windshields attached.	
13	It's got holes in it. It's shattered, and	
14	there's glass coming off it. I didn't have the	
15	time to determine if shots were coming out or	
16	going in.	
17	So I thought, you know what, their focus	
18	appears to be at the drivers, so I put four	
19	rounds in right at the driver's side through the	
20	windshield. And then this had to stop, these	
21	guys were taking fire; and I didn't want to end	
22	up getting hurt or getting killed, getting shot.	
23	They had to be stopped, that was the ultimate	
24	thing. The situation had to be neutralized here.	

		22
1	MR. GARDNER: So at this point are you	
2	still behind the suspect car?	
3	THE WITNESS: I don't think I was I	
4	wasn't right right on the back of it. I was	
5	like away from it. I don't think	
6	MR. SARAYA: Feel free to draw on that	
7	all you want.	
8	THE WITNESS: I mean, I don't recall	
9	exactly how close I was to the car itself. I	
10	wasn't up against the car, I know that, because I	
11	came around because as I was coming up, there	
12	was an officer here already; and he was like	
13	scrambling. And that's why I thought he was	
14	taking the firing was coming this way too.	
15	And he was scrambling around. He was coming from	
16	this direction going around this way.	
17	MR. SARAYA: Okay.	
18	THE WITNESS: And he was like ducked	
19	down, already gotten as low as the trunk was	
20	going around the car. And, you know, I'm like,	
21	"Shit." I had the same impression he was taking	
22	fire too, but he was like trying to get away from	
23	it.	
24	So I came around. When I came around,	

		23
1	it was the battle was on. There were these	
2	guys were shooting it out. And it's got to come	
3	to an end. That's all I can say.	
4	MR. GARDNER: How do you know that you	
5	fired four rounds there?	
6	THE WITNESS: Well, I first I'll tell	
7	you what, I thought it was like two or three; and	
8	then at the end they counted they counted, and	
9	they told me it was four rounds.	
10	MR. GARDNER: Who who did that	
11	counting?	
12	THE WITNESS: Who did it? Our	
13	inspection I guess homicide.	
14	MR. GARDNER: Do you remember I mean,	
15	someone do you remember who took it from you?	
16	THE WITNESS: Yeah. No, I don't	
17	remember who specifically took it. They took our	
18	clips they took my clip and they counted our	
19	rounds; and they said how many were missing from	
20	my clip.	
21	MR. GARDNER: Okay.	
22	BY MR. SARAYA:	
23	Q. All right. Whereabouts did your car end	
24	up here again? Go ahead and draw that	

		24
1	A. I'm trying to remember. Guesstimate.	
2	Q. That's not going to print out, that ink,	
3	so use the marker. It's a little bit easier.	
4	A. (Complies with request.)	
5	Q. Did you angle it so headlights were	
6	aimed at them?	
7	A. No, no, because I didn't know I	
8	didn't know I didn't know where the suspect	
9	car was going to be. I had no idea where that	
10	suspect car was going to be.	
11	Q. Okay.	
12	A. And I just we went towards the area	
13	towards the shots.	
14	My partner got out first, she got out	
15	and she took off; and I wasn't quite sure where	
16	she went, you know. And I ran. Because I came	
17	around and I ran down as I came up around the	
18	back of the car then. So I'm guessing it was	
19	right about in here.	
20	Q. Okay. And you ended up can you mark	
21	down there about where you think you were?	
22	A. (Complies with request.)	
23	Q. I mean yeah, this is kind of small,	
24	so it's okay. We're just looking for a relative	

25 position. 1 A. To the best of my recollection, here. 2 Ι 3 mean, I'm trying to -- because I know I wasn't 4 right next to it. 5 Q. Okay. 6 A. Especially since that cop had ran in front of me like that. You know what I'm saying? 7 8 MR. GARDNER: So this cop is sort of 9 coming from this direction, he's ducking --10 THE WITNESS: He was at the car. I 11 mean, he was -- I mean, when I came up, I came 12 up, he was at the -- he was at --13 MR. D'ANGELO: At what car? 14 THE WITNESS: The zone car. 15 MR. GARDNER: The 238? 16 THE WITNESS: Yeah. He was already -he was there. He was coming around. He was just 17 18 scooting around. He came around this way here, 19 you know. 20 MR. GARDNER: Did you see him go down at 21 any point? 2.2 THE WITNESS: I just -- you know what, 23 if he did go down, it was afterwards; but I 24 didn't see that.

1	MR. GARDNER: Okay.	
2	THE WITNESS: I can't say he didn't go	
3	down.	
4	MR. GARDNER: Okay. What happened then?	
5	You fire off your four rounds.	
6	THE WITNESS: I fire off the four	
7	rounds. There was another volley of of shots	
8	fired. And it all came to an end. It stopped.	
9	BY MR. SARAYA:	
10	Q. Did you hear anybody yelling verbal	
11	directions or anything at the driver or the	
12	passenger?	
13	A. No, I didn't hear that. I did not hear	
14	that. I don't even I mean, I don't know	
15	(inaudible); but when I got up there, there	
16	wasn't time for any of that because these guys	
17	were engaged. And it was my understanding from	
18	the broadcast that that was the gun battle going	
19	on.	
20	Q. Okay.	
21	A. It had to be done. He had to be	
22	stopped.	
23	MR. GARDNER: Did you hear anybody yell	
24	"Cease fire" or anything?	

27 THE WITNESS: Really, no. No, I didn't 1 2 hear it. 3 MR. GARDNER: Okay. All right. Well, 4 what do you see happening next? 5 THE WITNESS: Well, I end up -- the next 6 thing I can clearly recall is I walked back up 7 towards our car and our supervisor came up there. 8 Officer Ereg and O'Donnell were there. And I 9 didn't even know until then that Ereq had been 10 involved, because we got out of the car. If they 11 were still with -- I knew they were involved with 12 the chase, but I didn't know where they were at 13 this time when we got out there. 14 It wasn't until it was over with that I 15 saw Ereg at the -- up at the top of the hill. MR. GARDNER: Did you -- where was 16 17 O'Donnell when you were over here? 18 THE WITNESS: When I was over here, at 19 that time I didn't know; but I later learned that 20 she was towards the front of the car, the police 21 car. She was positioned where -- she's on the 22 side, positioned towards the front of the car. 23 MR. GARDNER: Okay. 24 BY MR. SARAYA:

Q. Now, were you guys broadcasting anything	
during the pursuit? Were you calling anything	
out?	
A. There was a point I remember when at	
Addison and Decker there there was some confusion	
about where they were; and I believe she	
broadcasted what street she thought they were or
