DEAR SIR:—You have submitted for my approval a contract between the State of Ohio, acting by the Department of Highways and Public Works, and The Joseph H. Skeldon Engineering Company, of Toledo, Ohio. This contract covers the construction and completion of one Ames vertical four cylinder poppet-valve, una-flow engine, 360 R. P. M. without generator or exciter, at Ohio University, Athens, Ohio, and calls for an expenditure of \$14.504.00.

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract.
