Narrative:

On Tuesday, December 20, 2022, the Marion County Sheriff's Office and Marion Police Department requested the assistance of the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) with the investigation of an Officer Involved Critical Incident which occurred in LaRue, Marion County, Ohio. During the investigation, Special Agent Jason Snyder was provided with the personnel file of Marion Police Department Officer [REDACTED] ([REDACTED]). On Saturday, January 7, 2023, Special Agent Supervisor (SAS) Scott Stranahan reviewed Officer [REDACTED]'s personnel file and noted the following:

SAS Stranahan noted there were five separate files containing the employment records of Officer [REDACTED]. SAS Stranahan first reviewed a file titled "[REDACTED] Employment records." Investigation revealed this file contained the personnel file of Officer [REDACTED] to include authorization to carry specific firearms, application materials/background information, Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) information, letters of recommendation and awards.

Prior to entering the police academy, Officer [REDACTED] served in the United States Army as a Staff Sergeant in the infantry. Officer [REDACTED] served in Afghanistan and Iraq. Officer [REDACTED] received several letters of recommendation from command staff members he served with. Officer [REDACTED] attended the police academy at the Marion Law Enforcement Academy and graduated in June of 2017. In January of 2018, Officer [REDACTED] was sworn in by the Marion Police department.

Officer [REDACTED] received authorization to carry the following weapons: BCM .223/5.56 rifle, Sig Sauer M400 5.56 rifle, Glock 17 9mm semi-automatic pistol and a Glock 19 9mm semi-automatic pistol.

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Officer ██████ received the following awards: In May of 2022, he received a "Letter of Recognition" for his response to an aggravated burglary call. Also, in May of 2022, he received another "Letter of Recognition" for his response to a breaking and entering call. Again, in May of 2022, he received a "Letter of Recognition" for his role in the service of an arrest warrant. In January of 2021, he received an "Exceptional Duty Award" for his role and response to a shooting call which resulted in a standoff with local SWAT teams.

SAS Stranahan next reviewed a file titled "██████████-Employment Records (Party) (93194)." Investigation revealed this file contained a complaint filed against Officer ██████ by an individual he arrested on May 19, 2019. The individual complained about the arrest for public intoxication. The complaint was investigated and determined to be unfounded.

SAS Stranahan then reviewed a file titled "██████████ – Employment Records (Party) (793260)." Investigation revealed this file contained regarding a complaint filed against Officer ██████ and another officer in February of 2021. The complaint stemmed from the arrest of an individual for a protection order violation. The complainants were upset their child (arrestee) was walked down the street from their residence in handcuffs. While no policy violations were discovered, both officers received counseling as the result of this complaint.

SAS Stranahan next reviewed a file titled "██████████ – Employment Records (Party) (793265). Investigation revealed this file contained a complaint against Officer ██████ which was filed by Chief McDonald of the Marion Police Department in October of 2021. In summary, officers from the Marion Police Department responded to a report of a potential threat at a local high school. It was reported someone threatened to shoot students and staff. As the investigation unfolded assignments were given. Officer ██████ asked Chief McDonald if he could bring his AR-15 into the school. Chief McDonald wanted a "low profile" approach/response and denied the request. Another member of the command staff later observed Officer ██████ carrying his rifle away from the school upon conclusion of the investigation. Officer ██████ received counseling about obeying direct orders of command staff.

Finally, SAS Stranahan reviewed a file titled "██████████ Cert._Firearms." Investigation revealed the following information. SAS Stranahan observed records of Officer ██████'s firearms qualifications from 2018 through 2022. Officer ██████ qualified with the following weapons: semi-automatic pistol, shotgun, semi-automatic rifle and submachine gun.

SAS Stranahan noted Officer ██████ received the following training certificates:

SAS Stranahan noted this file also contained the following awards received by Officer [REDACTED] "Exceptional Duty Award" in April of 2018 where he located a family with a small child sleeping in a car and attempted to pay for their hotel stay until his supervisor made other payment arrangements. Officer [REDACTED] received an "Exceptional Duty Award" in August of 2018 for his response to a shooting and providing life saving efforts. In April of 2018, Officer [REDACTED] received and "Exceptional Duty Award" for his response and efforts during a shooting investigation.

Nothing further was discovered during SAS Stranahan's review of Officer [REDACTED]'s personnel file.

On 5-19-19 Lt. Shade called and told me that Teresa Ramsey requested to make a formal complaint against Off. [REDACTED]. I told him to go to her residence and have her fill out a formal complaint.

On 5-20-19 I reviewed the complaint from Ms. Ramsey. I reviewed the video when she was arrested on 5-19-19 at 01:37 and MPD Report 19-02694. Off. [REDACTED] was on duty patrolling the downtown area on 5-19-19 at 01:30. This is a normal activity for MPD Patrol Officers. 5-19-19 was a Sunday, however the downtown bars remain open until 2:30 A.M.. Officers patrol the area for intoxicated people who many times become easy prey for various crimes (physical assaults, sex assaults, and robberies) The Marion downtown area has a double set of railroad tracks and unfortunately in the past intoxicated people have been struck and killed by trains.

On 5-19-19 at 1:37 A.M. Off. Robinson got out with Ms. Ramsey in the G&J Body Shop parking lot, the business normal operating hours are Monday through Friday during the day. The business is located between railroad tracks on Oak St. Off. [REDACTED] observed prior to getting out with her that she was unsteady on her feet. MS. Ramsey was alone. While he is speaking with her a train horn can be heard in the background. Off. [REDACTED] made contact with Ms. Ramsey at 01:37:50. He spoke with her and checked her eyes with a flashlight before deciding to arrest her at 01:41 A.M. Ms. Ramsey attempted to walk away from Off. [REDACTED] three times. Once she stated she wanted to get on level ground. Off. [REDACTED] asked if she had been at Whitey's (Bar). Ms. Ramsey said no, she goes to Gotham (Bar). Off. [REDACTED] continued to engage speaking with Ramsey, while waiting for another officer to arrive. Ms. Ramsey told Off. [REDACTED] that she was walking home. Off. [REDACTED] then informed her that she was under arrest for D.O.C. intoxication. Off. [REDACTED] took hold of Ms. Ramsey's arms. Ms. Ramsey attempted to pull away. Ramsey continued to struggle with Off. [REDACTED] put Ramsey on the ground using minimal force to do so. Ms. Ramsey was not thrown to the ground. Off. [REDACTED] straddles Ramsey's back while attempting to get her hands behind her back to be placed in handcuffs. Ramsey continued to move her flailing her arms, it takes Off. [REDACTED] almost a minute to get the handcuffs placed on Ramsey. Off. May arrived within 20 seconds after Ramsey is placed in handcuffs. I did not observe from his body camera that he placed his knee or penis on Ms. Ramsey's back. Ms. Ramsey complained of back pain. MFD Squad was called to the scene and Ramsey was medically cleared. Off. [REDACTED] then transported her to Multi-County Jail.



I obtained video from Multi-County Jail from when Ms. Ramsey was booked in on 5-19-19. Ms. Ramsey was booked into the jail and was placed in a holding cell. She remained in her clothing that she was arrested in during her eight hours stay at the jail. Had Ms. Ramsey defected in her clothing at anytime the jail staff would have ensured that she would have taken a shower and she would have been dressed out in jail clothing. Ms. Ramsey did not request any medical service from the jail staff.

On 4-13-19 Off. [REDACTED] and other officers responded to the area around the 200 block of Patten St. Dorothy Wren had called and requested police assistance. She reported that a black female with a broom had stopped in front of her vehicle and asked for a ride. When Ms. Wren refused she said that the woman then struck the car with the broom she was carrying. She said the woman walked to the West. Off. [REDACTED] located Ms. Ramsey carry a broom on Klex Ave. Near N. Main St. Ms. Ramsey was intoxicated at the time and arrested by Off. [REDACTED] She refused to walk to Off. [REDACTED]'s patrol car. Off. [REDACTED] and Off. Coburn had to carry her to the patrol car.

Ms. Ramsey complaints of being stalked or excessive force against Off. [REDACTED] is unfounded.

I will send a letter to Ms. Ramsey advising her that her complaints are unfounded.

NATURE OF ALLEGATION AND SPECIFIC DETAILS OF INCIDENT

TERESA RAMSEY, 545 MARY ST TOLD ME THAT SHE IS "TIRED OF BEING ABUSED, HARRASSED, AND STALKED" BY PTL. [REDACTED] ON MAY 18, 2019, TERESA SAID THAT SHE WAS WALKING DOWN THE STREET ON OAK ST. AND PTL. [REDACTED] PULLED UP AND ASKED "WHERE ARE YOU GOING?" HE THEN ASKED HER IF SHE HAS BEEN DRINKING, THEN SAID HE COULD SMELL HER. HE THEN THREW HER DOWN ON THE ROADS FACE FIRST THEN SHOVED HIS KNEE AND PENIS INTO HER BACK. SHE SAID WHEN SHE GOT TO THE JAIL, HER BACK HURT SO BAD THAT SHE DEFECATED ALL OVER THE JAIL FLOOR. SHE SAID THAT PTL. [REDACTED] HAS BEEN FOLLOWING HER SINCE APRIL, AND SHE DOES NOT FEEL SAFE AROUND HIM.

On 4-13-2019, LT Musser and I responded to the area of Park St and Patten St reference a suspicious person. The caller, Dorothy Wren, advised that a black female was walking in the street and asked her for a ride. The female then blocked Dorothy's vehicle, as Dorothy was trying to leave for work, and the female then struck Dorothy's vehicle with the broom.

Upon arriving in the area, LT Musser was advised that the female was walking west on Patten St.

I located the female on Klerx Ave near N Main St at the The Chicken Shack. I observed the female walking with the broom. The female was unsteady on her feet as she walked.

I made contact with the female and she was identified as Teresa Ramsey. Teresa's eyes were glassy and bloodshot, and I could smell the odor of an alcohol beverage emitting from her breath. Teresa advised that she was walking to the Boys and Girls Club. Teresa would not tell me where she was coming from and kept trying to walk away. Teresa denied hitting any vehicles with her broom. When asked how much alcohol she had consumed she denied drinking any. Teresa was very repetitive and talking about things that were unrelated to the incident as she seemed agitated that dispatch did not have her current address. Teresa then began to walk way again and that is when she was advised that she was under arrest. Teresa attempted to pull away from OFC Coburn and I when we were securing her hands behind her back. Teresa sat on the ground and refused to stand up. I was able to secure the handcuffs on Teresa and proper fit was checked and they were double locked. I advised Teresa her Miranda Rights. Teresa refused to walk to the patrol vehicle, so OFC Coburn and I carried her to my vehicle.

I conducted a search of her person and no contraband was located on her nor in her purse. She was given a warning for conveyence.

OFC Coburn took Teresa's broom to her residence at 545 Mary St.

I transported Teresa to jail without incident.

Teresa was arrested for DOC intox due to her reportedly hitting the caller's vehicle with a broom and walking in public while intoxicated, creating a risk of physical harm to herself.

On 5-19-2019, I got out with a female at 174 Oak St that appeared to be drunk. I had observed the female stumble while walking, almost falling over.

The female was identified as Teresa Ramsey. Teresa had slurred speech, glassy/blooshot eyes, and the odor of an alcoholic beverage was emitting from her breath. Teresa stated that she was walking to Gotham (bar). Teresa kept trying to walk away from me while I was talking to her and stated that she would just walk back home to 545 Mary St. Teresa denied drinking any alcohol. Teresa walked back over to the sidewalk because she wanted to be on even ground. While Teresa was standing on the sidewalk, she lost her balance and almost fell over, losing a shoe in the process. I then had Teresa place her hands behind her back and advised she was under arrest for DOC intox.

Teresa kept pulling her arms from me. Teresa then started to fall to the ground on her own, in which I then pinned her on the ground. Teresa continued pull her hands away from me and putting them under her body. I was able to get control of both of her hands, and she was handcuffed.

I advised dispatch of a use of force, due to me pinning Teresa on the ground and having to manipulate her arms to handcuff her. Teresa claimed that I threw her on the ground, injuring her back in the process.

LT [REDACTED] arrived on scene and a squad was requested to respond to check out Teresa.

MCFD Paramedics arrived on scene and Teresa was medically cleared.

While LT [REDACTED] was re-handcuffing Teresa, she continued to resist putting her hands behind her back. Once she was handcuffed, Teresa refused to sit in the back of my patrol vehicle.

LT [REDACTED] told her multiple times to get into the vehicle, or we would put her in. Teresa continued to refuse, so I then pulled her into the backseat by her arm.

I transported Teresa to jail. Jail staff met me in the sally port to assist, due to Teresa being uncooperative and combative.

Teresa was arrested for DOC intox and resisting arrest.

A use of force form was completed.

Body camera footage has been downloaded and marked as evidence.



On 03-10-2021, I was assigned to investigate a complaint which was filed on 03-06-2021 by Shawn and Lona Jackson of 741 Mt. Vernon Ave. The Jackson's filed a formal written complaint on 03-06-2021 at MPD. The complaint was filed after the arrest of their 28-year-old son, Alex Bailey.

The complaint filed had issue with the officers walking Alex Bailey down the street to the awaiting patrol cars and issues with extra charges being filed after the arrest. Both issues were investigated.

On 03-10-2021, I reviewed the body worn cameras of Officers Ice and [REDACTED] which were the officers in the complaint. The complaint was officers failed to follow policy when walking the Jackson's son, Alex Bailey down the street after an arrest. The entire incident was caught on the body camera of Officers Ice and [REDACTED] which was later placed onto a DVD and filed with this IA.

I reviewed the body camera to look for a violation of the current Marion City Police Department policy. In this case, Mr. Bailey was arrested for a TPO violation after a complaint was filed by the protected person in the court order. Officers arrested Mr. Bailey without incident and allowed Mrs. Jackson to get Mr. Bailey shoes and officers even asked Mr. Bailey if he wanted a coat before being taken to jail. Mr. Bailey did not wish to take a coat with him, and Mr. and Mrs. Jackson were advised of his bond. Mr. Bailey was very compliant and gave the officers no issues.

As, Officer [REDACTED] was leading a handcuffed Mr. Bailey away from the house to the patrol car. Mr. Jackson asked that his son not be walked down the street to the awaiting patrol cars. The officers in this case parked away from the house about one block. Officers informed Mr. Jackson they did this because sometime people will not answer the door if they see a patrol car. This is a common practice by police. Mr. Jackson confirmed that he understood this was the case but asked since his son was in custody that he not be walked a block down the street in handcuffs like he did something serious. He asked that one of the officers pull their car up to the house. Officer [REDACTED] told Mr. Jackson that Mr. Bailey would be okay and proceeded to walk him down the street to the awaiting patrol car. It should be noted Officer Ice was on scene and was trying to leave when Mr. Jackson further made statements about the officer's conduct. Officer Ice was very cordial with Mr. Jackson and answered Mr. Jackson's questions. Mr. Jackson further advised he was not happy with the officers and Officer Ice gave Mr. Jackson his name and badge number as he left the scene. I noticed when Officer Ice was walking back to his car, the sidewalks were covered with water from the melting snow. The street was the best option. Again, the body camera was reviewed by myself as well as a review of the Marion City Policy Manual and I located no violations of policy by the officers.

The second complaint filed by the Jackson's was an issue of "up charging" and retaliation by the officers. Mr. Bailey was arrested for TPO violation but later was charged with Menacing by Stalking. This issue prior to me being assigned the investigation was investigated by Chief McDonald and his narrative is attached. Chief McDonald spoke to Assistant Law Director Michael Swartz and he advised he told the officers to file the charge due to a pattern of conduct. This was also found to be within policy, and they were directed by Mr. Swartz to do so.

On 03-16-2021, I spoke to Mr. and Mrs. Jackson by phone. I told them a formal letter would be coming in the mail, but I wanted to let them know the outcome of the investigation. I informed them the officers conduct was within the policy of the Marion City Police Department and the officers did not violate any policy. Mr. and Mrs. Jackson were understanding of my call but still were not satisfied with the results of the investigation.

However, I did tell Mr. and Mrs. Jackson that officers were given additional training by Chief McDonald about service to the community and I would personally speak with the officers about perception. And how we as officers could do better.

Narrative – Chief Jay McDonald

On March 1, 2020, I received an email from Dustin Evans asking me to call Pastor Shawn Jackson about a personal matter. This email was sent at 0956 hours and the email has been printed and is attached. I do not know exactly what time I called Pastor Jackson back but it was before lunch time.

Pastor Jackson wanted to tell me about a situation that was troubling him concerning the police being “insensitive” during an incident involving his son. Pastor Jackson explained to me his son was arrested for a violation of a protection order over the weekend and officers came his home and arrested him. Pastor Jackson said that his family was cooperative with the police and his son surrendered without incident. Pastor Jackson stated that he and his wife gathered up shoes and socks for his son and in no way interfered or obstructed or caused a problem for the police.

After the arrest, Pastor Jackson asked the officers if they would pull their cruisers up in front of the house. Pastor Jackson said his reasoning was so that his son (and he and his wife) could have some privacy in that situation. He said he asked and the officer said “He will be OK” which Pastor Jackson said was insensitive and embarrassing. Pastor Jackson said the officers walked his son “down the middle of the street for all to see” and he said his neighbors could easily have seen this and it did not have to be that way.

I explained to Pastor Jackson that I would ask Major Jeff Clewell to look into it and that I had no direct knowledge of the incident but I as Chief of Police wanted our members to treat everyone with respect. I informed Pastor Jackson that the incident would have been captured on body camera video and we would review it, read the report and figure out if there was something we could have done better and we agreed to speak again on the issue.

I attempted to read the report and it was not in the system at that time. I then spoke to Major Clewell about my conversation with Pastor Jackson.

On March 2, I spoke with Major Clewell, Major Shaffer, Major Adkins and Lt. Gruber during our weekly Command Staff meeting about this issue. Major Clewell briefed us on what he learned during his cursory look into the issue. It was decided at that time that I would address the department during our annual training sessions on 3/9 and 3/11 about this issue. We discussed that there has been no policy infractions, that the officer was not verbally rude and did not use excessive force in this incident. We also discussed that Pastor Jackson and his family were not combative, nor disrespectful nor posed an elevated safety threat. We discussed that fulfilling the request of Pastor Jackson would not have been difficult.

On March 2, 2021, I called Pastor Jackson from my car as I was travelling to Wilmington, Ohio for the calling hours of the ODNR Officer who was killed in the line of duty. Pastor Jackson was upset because he believed that the charges against his son were enhanced due to the complaint he made to me. He advised me that the charges were increased to Menacing by Stalking. I explained that I could 100% guarantee that this was not the case, that cops do not determine charges, the prosecutor or law director does and that menacing by stalking was a crime that requires a pattern of conduct that the officer may not have been aware of at the time of the incident but his supervisor or the law director may have been aware of after the fact. Pastor Jackson was not convinced.

I also informed Pastor Jackson of what we found when Major Clewell had looked into the issue. I advised Pastor Jackson of my intention to address the entire department on the aspect of mutual respect and treating people respectfully, which is more than not being abusive. I told him that we could do always do better when we learn from our past actions, but our officer did not appear to have violated our policy at all.

This call took place at 1424 hours. I told Pastor Jackson that the number I was calling him from was my personal cell phone and that he could call me at any time to discuss this or any other issue.

On March 3, I came into work. I learned that Major Clewell had a very similar conversation with Pastor Jackson on March 2. I also had a voicemail from Pastor Jackson that he left on my office phone around 1415 hours on March 2, after I left to head to Wilmington.

I read the police report, CFS 2021-00773. In the narrative, the report says Officer [REDACTED] spoke with Assistant Marion City Law Director Mike Schwartz on March 1 about the menacing by stalking complaint. I called Mr. Schwartz and asked him when that conversation took place. He advised "mid-morning." Mr. Schwartz advised he encouraged the filing of the additional charge by the officer due to the pattern of conduct. He was not told about any complaint by Pastor Jackson by Officer [REDACTED]

I spoke to Major Clewell about the timing of his conversations with officers about this issue on March 1. He advised it was after lunch time and also told me that Lt. Harris was aware of prior incidents involving Pastor Jackson's son and Lt. Harris also suggested the menacing by stalking charge to Officer [REDACTED], prior to any mention of a complaint.

I watched the body camera video of the incident as well for Officers [REDACTED] and Ice. I did not see any violations of policy in the video. It was specifically explained to Pastor Jackson that the officers would walk down the street due to the sidewalks being flooded. Officer Ice attempted to explain why officers park away from the house and Pastor Jackson was trying to explain that he was talking about after the arrest, they could have picked him up at the residence to avoid embarrassing his son and the family.

Pastor Jackson mentions to the officers that he is good friends with the Mayor and also just conducted a diversity workshop with me and the Sheriff within the last couple of days and he will be calling because our actions showed a lack of sensitivity.

On March 3, I also was told that Pastor Jackson came to MPD to fill out official complaints on this issue. I wanted to write these events down to ensure that I did not forget any details.

It should be noted that there is no evidence that the additional charge of menacing by stalking came as a result of the conversation between myself and Pastor Jackson, in fact there is evidence to show that the timing rules that out.

While I agree with Pastor Jackson that it would not have caused any additional danger or work to pick up the arrestee at the residence, it is not a violation of our policy the way the officers acted in this instance.

On 2-28-2021, I responded to 233 W Church St, Marion First Nazarene Church, reference a CPO violation. The caller, Nadalee Smith, stated that Alexander Bailey was at the church this morning and that there is a protection order between the two, she is the protected party. Dispatch confirmed the protection order and that Alexander was not to be within 500 feet of Nadalee.

Upon arrival at the PD lobby, I spoke with Nadalee. She stated that around 1130 this morning, she was at church and her ex-fiance, Alexander, came into the church service. Nadalee stated that Alexander walked right past her and then sat a couple rows behind her. Nadalee then gathered her belongings and left. Nadalee stated that Alexander was wearing a black coat, light button up shirt, and dark pants. Nadalee stated that she has been going to The Naz for years and that Alexander goes to a different church that his father is a Pastor at. Nadalee stated that Alexander is fully aware that she goes to The Naz for church.

Nadalee's Uncle, Joseph Maniaci, was also at the service in the balcony seating. He stated that he observed Alexander sit directly behind Nadalee about two rows back. Joseph stated that he was 100% confident that it was Alexander and he also gave me the same clothing description that Nadalee gave me.

Joseph arrived at the PD lobby to speak with me. Joseph stated that he had a picture that his wife, Karianne Maniaci, had taken of Alexander at the service sitting behind Nadalee. This picture was shown to me by Nadalee's grandmother, Suzanne Harris. Suzanne was not at the church but was at the PD with Nadalee for support. Suzanne emailed me the photo of Alexander and it was forwarded to the property clerk to be used as evidence.

Both Joseph and Nadalee completed written statements, and Nadalee signed a misdemeanor complaint against Alexander for CPO violation.

When I advised Nadalee and Suzanne that Alexander would be arrested once found, Suzanne got emotional and stated that her granddaughter (Nadalee) would then be safe.

I went to the Marion First Nazarene Church, "The Naz", to see if I could get video footage. I made contact with Brandon Estep who escorted me to the security room.

Brandon showed me the video footage and in the camera that shows the south parking lot, you can see a white, four door car park in the lot at 11:27. A male is seen walking, matching the description of Alexander. The male is seen walking into the south entrance of the church at around 11:28. Brandon was unable to get me a copy of the footage, but stated that he would be there tomorrow. I have completed a follow-up request to have IT go the The Naz to get a copy of the video footage.

I spoke with Joseph on the phone and he was able to speak with Nadalee, who stated that Alexander drives a white, four door Dodge Charger.

According to call history at 741 Mt Vernon Ave, Alexander was served the CPO on 1-26-2021 by MCSO.

I then went to 741 Mt. Vernon Ave to locate Alexander. In the driveway of the residence was a white 4 door Dodge Charger, that matched the vehicle in which I saw in the camera footage. Alexander came outside and I then advised him of his Miranda Rights, in which he stated he understood. I asked Alexander if he went to church today and if so what church. Alexander stated that he went to church at The Naz. Alexander admitted knowing that Nadalee goes to

the Naz and that he is aware he is not to be within 500 feet of Nadalee. Alexander stated that he did not know Nadalee was there and only saw her when she got up to leave.

Alexander was arrested (proper fit checked and double locked) on the CPO violation. I transported him to jail without incident.

Once at the jail, I completed a victim notification form.

I called Nadalee and made her aware of Alexander's arrest.

I called Karianne Maniaci, who had taken the photo of Alexander. Karianne stated that she was 110% sure that it was Alexander and that she observed Alexander walk right past Nadalee going to his seat, which was directly behind her, two rows back.

It is important to note that Alexander has a pending menacing by stalking case with Marion Municipal Court. Nadalee is also the listed victim in this case. The case was originally submitted by the Marion County Sheriff's Office on 01/07/2021 and has been filed under Marion Municipal Court Case number CRB2100040B.

I have completed a DV form.

Body camera footage has been marked as evidence.

On 3-1-2021, I went to the Law Director's Office and spoke with Michael Swartz in regards to the pending menacing by stalking against Alexander. The charge of Menacing by Stalking will be added to this case and forwarded to the Marion County Law Directors Office. Alexander has engaged in a pattern of activity and when doing so violated the terms of the protection order against him. The criminal complaint will be forwarded to the Law Directors office and be served upon Alexander when he appears for court in this case.

I called Nadalee and advised her that were forwarding the menacing by stalking charge to the law directors office. I asked Nadalee how she felt when she saw Alexander in church yesterday and she stated that she was nervous and scared because Alexander has been violent with her in the past. He had walked into her parent's house back in January and into her bedroom while she was asleep uninvited/unwelcomed. Nadalee stated that she felt that she had no choice but to leave the church service as she feared what Alexander might do or say to her and/or other people in the church as she stated Alexander has caused scenes in public while she was with him before.

At this time I am waiting for the video from the Nazarene church to be obtained. This case is being forwarded for the charges mentioned above.



On 10-25-2021, Chief McDonald notified me to conduct an internal investigation in the actions of Officer [REDACTED]. On 10-25-2021, Marion City Police was investigating a threat to Harding High School. The threat was someone was going to shoot students and staff. Marion City Police increased security at building for the morning hours. Officer [REDACTED] was assigned to the security detail at the school along with his Officer Davis. Officer Davis is in training and Officer [REDACTED] his is FTO.

Officer [REDACTED] asked Chief McDonald about carrying/possession his AR-15 for a tactical advantage while working the security detail. Chief McDonald told him no that it was not allowed. Chief McDonald later told Lt. Harris the same information when he was asked by Officer [REDACTED]. At the end of the detail, Chief McDonald saw Officer [REDACTED] leaving the inside of the school with his rifle in his possession.

Interview with Officer Montel Smith U-62

On 10-25-2021, I went to Marion Harding High School and spoke to Officer Smith U-62. I asked Smith about opening the concession stand to store a rifle. Officer Smith advised Lt. Radcliff asked him about opening it up so Officer [REDACTED] can place a rifle inside. He did not see the rifle placed in the concession stand and thought Officer [REDACTED] had Officer Davis U-81 go and get it. He never saw a rifle come in or leave the school. Officer Smith never spoke to Officer [REDACTED] about opening the concession stand area.

As I was leave, I forgot to ask Officer Smith if he heard anyone tell Officer [REDACTED] not to bring it in. He advised he was in a group before school started in the hallway. In the group was Chief McDonald, Lt. Harris, Officer [REDACTED], Officer Davis, Officer Smith, and maybe Officer Beveridge U-80. Chief McDonald spoke about keeping in low key inside the building and he took that as not bringing in the rifle. When I asked why he opened the concession stand door, Officer Smith advised because Lt. Radcliff asked him to do so.

Interview with Lt. Josh Harris U-19

Lt. Harris and I tried to download his body camera from that day to see what exactly was said to Officer [REDACTED]. Lt. Harris to be fare advised he did tell Officer [REDACTED] to keep his rifle in his car and ready to go. Where the clarity issues starts is after this statement. Officer [REDACTED] and Lt. Harris went and checked out the SRO office as a place to store the rifle. Lt. Harris thought this could have left the clarity of his order to be opened ended after going to the SRO Office. He wanted to review the body camera footage to make sure he made a direct order that could not leave room for options. The body camera was not able to download as IT was having issues. There is no footage of this conversation.

Interview with Lt. Mike Radcliff U-7

On 10-25-2021, I spoke to Lt. Radcliff inside the PD. Lt. Radcliff was assigned to the upper deck area of the school. Prior to going to his assigned area, the officers were in the hallway. Lt. Harris and Officer [REDACTED] were talking about a rifle being inside the school. He remembers someone says it was not needed, and the Chief might have backed up that answer. After going to his assigned area, Officer [REDACTED] Davis, and Diem walked by Lt. Radcliff. Officer [REDACTED] asked what Lt. Radcliff thought about keeping a rifle in the concession stand area and Lt. Radcliff advised he did not see any issues with it and reached out to Officer Smith.

Lt. Radcliff advised he was not aware of any prior communication with the Chief about not bringing the rifle inside other than what was discussed in the hallway. He was aware Lt. Harris told it was not a good idea.

He thought it was going to be in a case.

Interview with Officer Ryan Beveridge U-80

I spoke to Officer Beveridge on 10-25-2021 at 1151 hours at MPD. He confirmed he worked the security detail at Harding High School. I asked if he heard a conversation from anyone about bringing a rifle inside the school. He said Officer [REDACTED] did and he asked Lt. Harris. Lt. Harris told Officer [REDACTED] to secure it inside his vehicle and have it staged and ready to go. He then saw them walk away as they were talking about an additional area (SRO OFFICE) inside the school to secure it. He never heard anything else about the rifle being inside the school and he did not see any officer with a rifle inside.

I asked Officer Beveridge if he heard Chief McDonald say anything about not bringing a rifle inside the school. Officer Beveridge said he was standing there with Lt. Radcliff and the Chief. After they walked away, the Chief did say there was no need for the rifle.

Interview with Officer Bobby Davis U-81

Resigned prior to being able to interview him at work.

Interview with [REDACTED]

Before closing out this IA, I wanted to speak with Officer [REDACTED] in person. I did so out back and told him that I conducted an IA in the issue with the rifle. He said he heard that I had been asking around about him, but he wished someone just came to him. He was never ordered to not take his rifle inside and that while inside the school, supervisor and he were looking for places to store their rifles. He would never disobey a direct order.

I advised him this case unfounded and would be closed out.







I am writing this to inform you of my interest in applying for one of the open spots on the Special Response Team.

I believe that my time as an Infantryman, along with 35 months of combat experience to Iraq and Afghanistan, has given me the framework in becoming a great SRT member with the ability to contribute to the team immediately. During my time in the Army, I conducted countless MOUT (Military Operations in Urban Terrain) training exercises and combat operations that has developed the discipline, mental strength, and courage to operate in the 360 degree field of an urban environment. I was very grateful to have been assigned to great units that its leaders believed in tough and realistic training. I had the fortune to go through a training exercise with Special Forces Soldiers (Green Berets) while stationed at Ft. Carson. In this training, we learned movement techniques that would provide greater security and improve lethality while dynamically clearing buildings/rooms. I was able to teach my Soldiers these same skills once I became a Team Leader and Squad Leader.

SRT team members not only need to be physically/mentally fit and disciplined, but they also need to have the willingness to go into the worst situations with a fearless mindset. I have been proven in combat as a Soldier/leader and I have excelled in high stress situations while under fire. An example of a high stress situation would be while positioned in a support by fire position in Afghanistan, my squad was engaging the enemy and one of my machine guns malfunctioned. I used a multi-tool to get the weapon back in the fight, while at the same time I directed my 60mm mortar team's rounds on target, effectively destroying the enemy.

I am aware that I do not have much time with the department and that I am not off of probation yet, but when speaking with LT. Marsh, he supported my wishes to complete a letter of intent as the 2 new members will not be sent to SWAT school sometime after I am off of probation. I hope that you will consider me to move forward in this process.
