On February 12, 2022, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Chad Holcomb was assigned to assist the Monroe Police Department (MPD) with an ongoing officer involved critical incident. It was reported that multiple MPD officers were attempting to locate and talk with Dustin Booth after his friends and family reached out to law enforcement who were concerned with his mental health. MPD pulled over the vehicle Booth was in and Booth exited the car and ran on foot. It was reported that Booth then brandished a weapon at officers. Multiple officers then fired their weapons killing Booth.

SA Holcomb responded to the Monroe Police Department where the involved officers were located. The involved officers were all photographed as they were upon arrival. MPD Detective Parker then provided SA Holcomb with the officer's firearms which were locked in his office. The firearms were:

Each weapon magazine had a maximum capacity of 17 rounds.

At 0936 hours, SA Holcomb placed items #1-5 in the BCI temporary evidence locker located in London, OH.

On February 15, 2022, at 1103 hours, SA Kevin Wagner removed items #1-5 and submitted them to the BCI laboratory for examination at 1122 hours.
