██████████ has completed her Braceville Township Police Department training knowledge checks. Due to the lower call volume of this department, some tasks were only trained to simulation or awareness levels. ██████████ also has prior experience in most categories. I have not yet had to observe ██████████ in a high stress situation, however, ██████████ displays competency in low to moderate stress conditions. Based on what I have observed, ██████████ is likely to make good decisions should she be faced with a high stress situation. ██████████ had to make an arrest on a warrant for a crime she investigated (see report ██████████). ██████████ has had prior experience making arrests from working other departments.

██████████ preforms well in the category of self-initiated activity. ██████████ conducts traffic stops safely and with appropriate use of discretion. ██████████ uses an appropriate amount of time while writing citations.

For the purposes of working here at this department, based on our typical day to day activity and nature of our usual calls, there is nothing more to be learned from field training. It would be unrealistic to hold ██████████ in training until she has faced every possible scenario. ██████████ is ready to preform to at least the minimal standard for a solo officer for this department. ██████████ has already covered some shifts as a solo officer toward the end of her training.

It is my recommendation that ██████████ now be released from field training.
