Narrative:

On July 11, 2023 at approximately 2300 hours Ohio Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation (BCI) Special Agents Ryan Scheiderer and Brady Curry (SA Scheiderer and SA Curry) conducted a neighborhood canvass in the area of 114 N. 9th Street, Byesville, Ohio (Guernsey County) in reference to a shooting incident between Jerimiah Wise (Wise) and law enforcement. Wise was fatally shot by during the incident. The following is a summation of the contacts SA Curry had with neighbors in the area.

- 113 N. 9th St.
 - SA Curry received negative contact. SA Scheiderer conducted an interview with the resident at a later time.
- 115 N 9th St.
 - SA Curry spoke with resident Richard Hyde (Richard) [REDACTED] who advised he was not home at the time of the shooting. Richard stated his wife, Lisa Hyde (Lisa) was not home either. Richard stated he has video surveillance cameras on the exterior of the house. Richard showed SA Curry the cameras. None of the cameras had a field of view of where the shooting took place. The cameras did show the street where law enforcement were moving around vehicles before and after the shooting. Richard advised he would provide the video to SA Curry. SA Curry provided Richard with a USB Drive.
- 114 N 10th St.
 - SA Curry spoke with resident Kimberly Doss (Doss) [REDACTED] Doss was an eye witness to the shooting. *Please see IR-6 2023-07-11 Kimberly Doss Interview for additional details.*
