Narrative:

On Wednesday, October 23, 2024, at 1000 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Joseph Goudy (Goudy) and SA Jon Lieber (Lieber) interviewed Medina County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) who was accompanied by his union representative, Detective Jason Seiberling, from the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (OPBA). The interview took place at the Medina County Sheriff's Office. The interview was video recorded.

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

At that point, **Sector** was asked to describe the incident from when he first received information regarding this matter. **Sector** said that he received a phone call from his supervisor, Sergeant David King (King), in which he told **Sector** about a male that was threatening suicide by cop. Sergeant King also told **Sector** was told to head to be headed toward the Wadsworth High School. **Sector** was told to head to the area and stage at an elementary school across the street from the high school. **Sector** said that he eventually staged over at School Street and Sterling near the school. **Sector** said that during that time, they were receiving phone pings from the subject indicating his location. **Sector** said that the description of the vehicle he received was a 2014, gray in color, Ford F-150. **Sector** was at its residence.

As **a second basis** made his way towards the residence, he observed the truck at the intersection of Broad and Hartman. After **a second basis** observed the vehicle, he proceeded after the vehicle. When **a second basis** eventually caught up to the subject's vehicle, he confirmed the registration and asked for another unit to assist. When **a second basis** was joined by **a second basis** he began to initiate the traffic stop. **a second basis** said that when he activated his overhead emergency lights for the

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vehicle to stop, the vehicle did not stop. The vehicle continued until he eventually came to a stop.

After the vehicle came to a stop, **and the subject**'s vehicle. **Solution** said that he and **solution** conducted a high risk stop on the subject's vehicle. **Solution** said that he positioned his car directly behind the subject's vehicle, while **solution** positioned his vehicle to his immediate left, in the northbound lane of Silvercreek road. At that point, **solution** said that when he and **solution** exited their vehicles, they both had their guns out pointed at the subject. **Solution** said, "I started giving him verbal commands to come out with his hands up or to stick his hands out of the vehicle." (19:12 mark)

At this time, **and the subject** opened the door and had his foot outside the door. **The subject** was not listening to his commands. **Subject** was not sure if the subject was trying to grab something from inside the truck. At this point, **subject** was aid:

...he stepped out with the rifle, he was facing away from me initially, gave him numerous commands to drop it, as he spun around, he was in a low ready position, he picked up the firearm and that's when I began firing (19:37 mark).

When was asked about the manner in which the subject exited the vehicle, he said, "in the moment, everything was slow motion for me, um, it felt like it was slow, watching the camera back it happened pretty quick..." (20:58 mark). continued by describing the motion made by the subject, "as he rotates towards the both of us, I mean technically, he faced **states** first" (21:40 mark). was asked to elaborate more about the subject's handling of the firearm, he stated, "As he's spinning, he's picking the firearm up, aiming at the both of us." (21:55 mark)

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When was asked if he heard anything that was occurring, such as the subject racking his firearm, was asked if the anything, I barely heard my rounds go off" (22:00 mark). Was asked if the subject fired his weapon, he replied, "I'm, I'm pretty confident he did not" (22:15 mark).
