On May 13, 2023, you responded to the area of West Riverview Avenue and Monument Avenue on a call of a person floating in the river and on arrival found it to be a small child. You assisted fire in the recovery effort and handled the situation with true professionalism. While on scene dealing with this extremely difficult situation, the family of the child arrived on scene. They were understandably distraught and ran under the crime scene tape in an attempt to run to the child. You assisted in detaining them, but also took the time to understand and address their deep sense of loss. Your kindness and support to a grieving family helped to calm them enough to secure the scene. Where you could have taken enforcement action, you instead chose to show compassion and offered what little comfort could be had to a hurting family. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] your actions exemplified the highest ideals of the Dayton Police Department. You demonstrated that police officers are more than just enforcers of the law. Your compassion towards a grieving family went beyond professionalism or a sense of duty. You showed kindness and empathy and in doing so demonstrated a deep understanding that police work is far more than just arresting criminals. Your compassion and understanding in performing your duties have brought great credit upon yourself, the Dayton Police Department, and the City of Dayton.

2-9-2021 WRITTEN COMMENDATION

You are a member of The Dayton Police Department Canine Unit. Throughout 2021 you and other members of the canine unit worked very hard combatting dangerous weapon and drug traffickers. Without you and your K-9 partner Rio's efforts, large amounts of illegal narcotics, guns and currency would continue to circulate through the City of Dayton. You assisted in arresting numerous dangerous suspects which undoubtedly makes the streets of our city safer. You helped with multiple Gun Reduction Initiatives with EPOD and WPOD CPRT, the Violent Offenders Unit and multi-jurisdictional enforcement agencies. You also have assisted local, state and federal agencies. Throughout 2021 our Canine Unit made numerous arrests which include robbery, aggravated robbery, drug trafficking and numerous weapons violations. Members from our Canine Unit have combined to deploy their canine 718 times. In 2021, the unit seized 42 firearms, over 43 pounds of marijuana, 67 pounds of methamphetamine, 55 pounds of heroin and fentanyl, 1 ½ pounds of crack and cocaine, 27 pounds of edibles, numerous pills, seized \$676,368.00 in illegal drug currency, conducted numerous public demonstrations, narcotic and explosive sweeps. You also assisted Sergeant Theodore Trupp and members of the unit with training 5 different canine teams locally and within our region in 2021. You have become a very knowledgeable canine handler and a great asset to the unit. Your hard work does not go unnoticed, and I am very appreciative of everything you do for the canine unit.

3-12-2021 WRITTEN COMMENDATION

On March 12th, 2021 at approximately 0213 hours, you, along with several other Dayton Police Officers, responded to 2275 Sherer Avenue in Harrison Township to assist the Montgomery County Sheriff Office with a barricaded suspect, who was armed with a knife. You took a position on the outer perimeter while a Sheriff Deputy gave the suspect verbal commands to

exit the home unarmed, so he could be taken into custody for a felonious assault that had occurred the night before. At one point the suspect exited the house at which time, several Officers and Deputies attempted to keep him from retreating into the residence but were unsuccessful. Approximately twenty minutes later, the suspect exited the home, armed with a knife, and charged at Deputies who were in the inner perimeter while making an active stabbing motion. It was at this time that you took action to stop the suspect from harming those Deputies. You most certainly preserved the life of your fellow law enforcement officers. If not for your tactics and your actions, there is no doubt that the suspect would have caused serious harm to several people. For your diligence and tenacity in performing your duties; your efforts have brought great credit upon yourself, the Dayton Police Department, and the City of Dayton.

WRITTEN COMMENDATION

Sergeant Thomas Cope commended you for your diligence and tenacity in your performance on July 7th, 2021. During roll call you were made aware of an active arrest broadcast for a Homicide suspect. Having personal knowledge of the suspect's neighborhood and using your investigative skills and resources, you determined that the suspect had recently been seen coming and going from the address listed in the broadcast. At approximately 2035 hours, you were contacted by a source who told you a truck matching the description of the suspect's vehicle had just pulled into the address. You requested that RDC send two Montgomery County Sheriff Deputies to assist you because the location was in their jurisdiction. You met with the suspect. Once you formulated the plan, you moved in to take tactical positions around the perimeter of the house. Upon seeing the cruisers, the suspect's girlfriend exited the house to speak with you. You determined that the suspect was in the house. You moved the girlfriend to safety and instructed Officer Jonah Hall to give to take him into custody without incident.
