APPROVAL—TWO LEASES, STATE OF OHIO, THROUGH DIVISION OF CONSERVATION, WITH B. C. BRUNDIGE AND J. C. BRUNDIGE, PROPERTY IN MARLBOROUGH TOWNSHIP, DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO, USE, STATE PUBLIC ARCHERY HUNTING GROUND.

COLUMBUS, OHIO, January 20, 1939.

Division of Conservation, Department of Agriculture, State Office Building, Columbus, Ohio.

Gentlemen: You have submitted for my examination and approval certain leases executed to the State of Ohio by two property owners in Marlborough Township, Delaware County, Ohio, leasing and demising to the State for the purpose therein stated tracts of land in said township and county.

The leases here in question, designated with respect to the number of the lease, the owner of the property, the length of the term of the lease and the acreage of land covered by the respective leases, are as follows:

In each instance the property described is leased to the state for the sole purpose of a state public archery hunting ground. And, in this connection, it is noted that as to these leases the Conservation Council, acting through the Conservation Commissioner, has made an order setting aside the lands described in the leases for the purpose of state public archery hunting grounds, as provided for in Section 1435-1, General Code.

Upon examination of these leases, I find that the same have been executed and acknowledged by the lessors in the manner provided by law. I also find upon examination of the provisions of these leases and of the

conditions and restrictions therein contained, that the same are in conformity with statutory provisions relating to the execution of leases of this kind.

I am accordingly approving these leases as to legality and form, as is evidenced by my approval endorsed upon the same and upon the duplicate copies thereof, all of which are herewith returned.
