Narrative:

On Thursday, March 05, 2026, at 1613 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Douglas Burke (SA Burke) interviewed Henry Siekaniec (Henry), relative to the Officer-Involved Critical Incident (OICI) which took place on Tuesday, February 24, 2026. The interview took place over the phone. The purpose of the interview was to obtain all relevant information about Ricardo Yuuki Davis (Ricardo) prior to the OICI on Tuesday, February 24, 2026, in Brooklyn, OH.

This report only summarizes the information deemed by the author to be of the most relevance to the investigation and does not purport to contain all questions and answers from the audio recording. Further, this report was placed in a chronology to aid the reader's overall understanding of the information elicited during the interview and may not be reflective of the actual sequencing of questions or responses. It is suggested that the reader refer to the audio recording in its entirety.

SA Burke introduced himself to Henry and the reasoning for wanting to speak to Henry. Henry acknowledged this and said he would talk with SA Burke.

Henry said he was familiar with and had been a friend of Ricardo's. Henry acknowledged he had received a text message from Ricardo on Tuesday, February 24, 2026, saying "**goodbye**" (4:21). Upon receiving the text message, Henry then contacted the Parma Police Department (PPD) to conduct a welfare check on Ricardo for his well-being.

SA Burke asked Henry when the last time Henry would have spoken with Ricardo. Henry stated it would have been approximately the first full week in January of 2026. According to Henry, Henry would try to text Ricardo on a daily basis early in their friendship.

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Henry had assisted with getting Ricardo a job with Key Bank in Cleveland, OH as a Corporate Customer Service Representative a year or so ago and then heard Ricardo had quit the job in September of 2025. Henry had inquired as to why Ricardo quit his job in October of 2025, and Ricardo stated he simply wanted **"left alone"** (5:30). At that point, Henry tried to give Ricardo a little bit of space and did not text Ricardo as much.

The last time Henry spoke to Ricardo over the phone at the beginning of January 2026, Ricardo, **"sounded down"** (5:41). Furthermore, according to Henry, Ricardo had told Henry, **"I really just don't wanna talk to anybody"** (6:15). Henry said Ricardo had, **"tried committing suicide before"** (7:10) and Henry had called PPD to do wellness checks on Ricardo. Henry and another friend would go to Ricardo's apartment to check on him at times to make sure Ricardo had been doing ok. Henry said he had tried to help Ricardo the best Henry could.

SA Burke asked Henry what he believed would have led to this incident with Ricardo. Henry stated Ricardo felt, **"insignificant"** (8:10). Ricardo felt he was the **"runt of the family"** (8:24) was the perception Henry had of Ricardo. Henry stated that Ricardo always wanted a girlfriend and had limitedly dated but had not dated since April of 2025. Henry said Henry did not know what had completely pushed Ricardo over the edge but knew Ricardo had been talking with a psychiatrist.

SA Burke asked Henry if Ricardo had any animosity towards law enforcement. Henry stated he did not think so, adding Ricardo had tried to start rebuilding his relationship with Ricardo's father, Roosevelt Davis (Roosevelt). Roosevelt had been trying to get Ricardo a security guard job according to Henry. SA Burke asked Henry if Ricardo was an aggressive guy and Henry said Ricardo did not seem to be, adding Henry never saw Ricardo get into any fights or things of that nature. Henry said Ricardo was **"socially awkward"** (12:30) especially around women.

SA Burke asked Henry if he knew Ricardo to be a drinker or had been involved with any sort of drugs. Henry stated Ricardo may have a beer on occasion but that would be about it and did not know of Ricardo being involved with any sort of drug(s). Henry was asked if he knew of Ricardo having any weapons in his possession. Henry said he did not know of Ricardo having any weapons and PPD had asked Henry the same question when Henry had called in the wellness check. Henry did say he knew, **"Ricardo had his Carry Conceal Weapons (CCW) License but did not know if Ricardo had a gun"** (13:54).

Again, SA Burke asked Henry if Ricardo had ever mentioned Ricardo wanting to hurt law enforcement officers or if Ricardo wished he could do something to law

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enforcement officers. Henry replied, **"no, never"** (14:56), adding Ricardo **"never spoke of anything along those lines"** (14:59).

Henry said he had his own thoughts on the incident involving Ricardo. SA Burke asked Henry what Henry's thoughts were involving this incident with Ricardo. Henry told SA Burke, **"I think that he (Ricardo), couldn't do it himself, and he was going the suicide by cop. That's the way it comes off."** (15:55). Henry added that, with the suicide notes being located and being about hurting himself, added to what led up to the incident.

Henry told SA Burke, he had been second (2nd) guessing himself about calling in the wellness check for Ricardo but then thought if Ricardo had gone to the Metro Parks which is close by and had done something to himself there, how long would it have taken for someone to find Ricardo. SA Burke told Henry he should never second guess himself about calling in the wellness check on Ricardo. Ricardo told SA Burke he was just hoping to call the wellness check in early enough to prevent anything from happening to Ricardo.

Henry said he wanted it known, Henry had no prior knowledge this was going to possibly be a **"suicide by cop or trying to get the cops to do this to Ricardo."** (18:55). Ricardo had never mentioned to Henry, Ricardo wanting to go out **"suicide by cop"** (19:13). Furthermore, Henry said if he had known how this incident was going to happen, Henry would have let the cops know when Henry had called in the wellness check for Ricardo.

SA Burke asked Henry if he knew of Ricardo ever attempting suicide prior to this incident. Henry said he knew Ricardo had attempted suicide in the past by **"hanging himself"** (22:06) possibly using a belt. Henry had contacted law enforcement to do wellness checks on Ricardo during those times. Henry told SA Burke there had been another friend of Ricardo's to contact by the name of Ashley Hoyer Jr. (Ashley). Furthermore, Henry said Ashley might have a little bit more insight into Ricardo's mindset prior to the incident.

Henry had no further relevant information and the interview concluded at approximately 1640 hours.
