Investigative Request

On Sunday, October 12, 2025, Sergeant Terry McConnell of the Columbus Division of Police (CPD) requested the assistance of the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation's (BCI) Force Investigations Unit (FIU) and Crime Scene Unit (CSU) in conducting an independent investigation into the facts and circumstances surrounding an officer-involved critical incident (OICI). The incident reportedly occurred on October 12, 2025 in the area of 1444 North High Street in Columbus, OH, and resulted in the death of Tashawn Marrice Davis (Davis).

Preface:

This report serves as a synopsis of the investigation into the October 12, 2025 officer-involved critical incident (OICI) in Franklin County, Ohio. This report only summarizes the information that the investigative team determined to be the most useful in achieving an overall understanding of what occurred in this incident. Every fact and detail is not presented in this summary report. Therefore, it is recommended that each individual report from which this document is derived be read in order to obtain a complete understanding of this investigation. Further, audio and/or video recordings exist for the majority of the interviews conducted, revealing further details of statements given regarding the incident.

This investigation was conducted with the purpose of determining, to the extent possible, the facts and circumstances surrounding this incident. As unbiased collectors of fact, the investigative team has not and will not render any opinion of the legality of officers' actions. Instead, it is anticipated that this investigation will provide the basis of information for decisions to be rendered by the appropriate authorities.

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Investigative Team

BCI Special Agent Kyle Douglass (SA Douglass) was assigned as the lead FIU case agent. SA Douglass received assistance in the investigation from SA James Gore (SA Gore), SA Doug Eveslage (SA Eveslage), SA Amanda North (SA North), SA Matt Collins (SA Collins), SA Perry Roeser (SA Roeser), and SA Joshua Lish (SA Lish). BCI Special Agents Dave Hammond (SA Hammond) and SA Aja Chung (SA Chung) of the Crime Scene Unit processed the scene of the incident, documenting, preserving, and collecting possible evidence. The investigation was supervised by Special Agent Supervisor Kevin Barbeau (SAS Barbeau). Additionally, various personnel from the BCI crime laboratory performed scientific analyses on submitted items of potential physical evidence.

Summary of Process

The following is a partial list of investigative activities or methods which were employed during the course of this investigation, by the investigative team, in an effort to thoroughly and accurately locate and document all pertinent facts and circumstances regarding this incident:

- Recorded interview(s) of the CPD officer(s) who discharged their weapons
- Recorded interviews of witnesses who were involved in the incident, at the scene, or otherwise deemed to potentially have relevant information
- Neighborhood canvass of the area surrounding the scene
- Interviews of family members or associates of the decedent
- Special agent attendance to post-mortem examination (autopsy) of the deceased
- Obtained and reviewed post-mortem examination (autopsy) and toxicology reports
- Obtained and reviewed police reports of prior law enforcement contacts with the subject
- Obtained and reviewed open and closed-source biographical information on the involved subjects, to include criminal history reports, OHLEG, driving records, etc.
- Review of all available dash cameras involved in the incident
- Review of all available body cameras involved in the incident
- Review of all available surveillance video which captured any portion of the incident
- Processing of the scene for potential evidence (photographing, searching, measuring, documenting, and collecting)
- Reviewed audio communications on the radio frequencies utilized during the incident

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- Review of 911/phone communications related to the incident
- Review of dispatch/CAD records pertaining to the incident
- Review of Mobile Data Terminal (MDT) communications relative to the incident
- Reviewed phone/text records with consent from family members/associates of the decedent
- Review of the department's reports, photographs, and investigative materials pertaining to the incident, excluding any Garrity statements or information derived from any compelled statement
- Conducted forensic laboratory examinations to include:
 1. Firearm identification testing of involved firearms, casings, and bullets
 2. Firearm operability testing
- Collected and reviewed the departmental personnel files of the officers involved in the shooting, to include training and disciplinary records (if any)
- Reviewed firearm qualification and training records for involved officers
- Verified the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) certification status of the officer(s) who discharged their weapons
- Obtained the department's policies and procedures regarding use of force for prosecutorial review
- Reviewed tips, social media posts, and pertinent statements made in the media regarding the incident

Incident Summary/Overview

In the early morning hours of Sunday, October 12, 2025, CPD officers were investigating allegations of strong-arm robberies in the University District area involving a large group of juveniles and young adults. At approximately 0335 hours, CPD [REDACTED] was flagged down on East 8th Avenue by two males who reported an individual had brandished a gun at their business, a nearby hookah café. The males pointed towards High Street and identified the subject who they claimed had pointed the gun at them.

[REDACTED] drove his cruiser towards the intersection and turned south onto High Street where he exited the vehicle. [REDACTED] confronted a male subject wearing a gray sweatshirt a dark pants, who has since been identified as Tashawn Marrice Davis (Davis). [REDACTED] gave Davis verbal commands to Davis to show his hands, and Davis fled into the courtyard of the apartment building at 1444 North High Street. [REDACTED] announced via radio that Davis was running and was in possession of a firearm. [REDACTED] pursued Davis and fired several gunshots at Davis as he was running eastbound through the courtyard. Davis fell to the ground.

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██████████ approached Davis with an officer from the Ohio State University Police Department (OSUPD), who arrived shortly after the shooting incident had occurred. ██████████ verbalized that there was a gun close to Davis's person. Davis was secured before additional responders arrive and begin rendering first aid to Davis. Davis was transported from the scene by EMS personnel and was later pronounced deceased.

Decedent

The decedent was identified as Tashawn Marrice Davis (Davis). Davis's date of birth is October 4, 2007, and was 18 years old on the date of the incident. Davis's last known address was 3821 McGrath Drive in Dublin, OH. Per a search inquiry of the Ohio Law Enforcement Gateway (OHLEG), ██████████

Autopsy Report

The autopsy report for the decedent (Davis) was obtained from the Franklin County Coroner's Office. A review of those documents revealed the following information:

The cause of death for Davis was determined to be "██████████" and the manner of death was ruled ██████████. The toxicology report indicated that Davis ██████████

Physical Evidence

The BCI Crime Scene Unit was requested to respond to the scene of the shooting in order to document and preserve any items of potential evidence. Multiple agents responded and processed the scene, to include photographing and mapping the area, as well as the search for, documentation, and collection of items of possible evidence. Detailed crime scene reports were completed with the below information only summarizing some of the more significant findings.

A search of the area located ten (10) fired cartridge casings near the front entrance to the apartment complex. One fired cartridge casing was located on the front steps leading up from the sidewalk area. Nine (9) additional cartridge casings were located south of the walkway leading to the entrance, in the grass area. All of the fired cartridge casings were identified as Speer 9mm Luger ammunition casings. A search of the area beyond the grass area into the stairway did not locate any additional fired cartridge casings.

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A black handgun was discovered in the courtyard area, which reportedly did not belong to any law enforcement personnel on scene. The weapon was identified as a model GUW017, .177 caliber BB gun, manufactured by Umarex, made to closely resemble an authentic Generation 3 Glock model 17 handgun.

Various items of potential evidence were submitted to the BCI Laboratory for analysis. The actual reports should be consulted as the following synopsis does not include many of the details from the full reports.

The BCI Firearms Section performed an analysis of the officers' firearms, as well as the firearm-related evidence collected from the scene, vehicles, and autopsies (casings and bullets). By comparing evidentiary cartridge casings/projectiles to known standards from each weapon, identifications were able to be made as to which casings/projectiles were fired from each firearm. Of the casings/projectiles recovered, the following identifications were made:

The firearm with serial # [REDACTED] was determined to be operable. FS Alexander identified one (1) fired cartridge case (Item 2) as being source identified to the firearm with serial # [REDACTED], Smith & Wesson model M&P 9 M2.0, 9mm Luger, semiautomatic pistol, which is assigned to CPD [REDACTED]. FS Alexander also identified three (3) fired jacketed bullets (Items 3,4,5) as being source identified to the same firearm with serial # [REDACTED], assigned to [REDACTED].

The firearm recovered during the incident which reportedly did not belong to any law enforcement officers on scene, Umarex model GUW017, .177 caliber 'BB' gun, was also collected by BCI CSU. This firearm (Item 16) was determined to be a replica (pellet/BB) handgun and was not submitted to the firearms lab for examination. This replica firearm was reportedly in Davis's possession during the shooting incident and was observed in the vicinity of Davis immediately after the shooting incident in body-worn camera (BWC) video evidence received from CPD.

No projectiles were recovered from the autopsy of the deceased subject involved in the incident, Tashawn Davis (Davis).

Witnesses

Civilian witnesses provided statements to CPD officers and BCI agents regarding their knowledge of the incident. Numerous additional witnesses were interviewed following the incident; their statements were audio recorded and documented by BCI. The following information is believed to be the most pertinent information obtained from witnesses regarding the incident. Please refer to correlating interview reports for complete details obtained from additional witnesses to the incident.

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Adam Saleem/Ehab Nasr

Adam Saleem (Saleem) was identified as the owner of Pharaoh's Hookah Café. Saleem observed his cousin, Ehab Nasr (Nasr), arguing with a male subject near the entrance of the café. The male subject was later identified as Davis. Saleem stated Davis brandished a firearm, pointing it at Saleem and Nasr and stating, "I gotta kill you guys." Saleem was asked if he believed his life was being threatened, to which he responded, "Of course." Saleem recalled Davis left the area with another male. Saleem flagged down a CPD cruiser and informed [REDACTED] that Davis had pointed a firearm at him. Saleem observed Davis again, who appeared to be walking towards the café. Saleem said he saw Davis running with the gun shortly before [REDACTED] arrived.

Nasr described observing Davis and another male on High Street outside of the café. Nasr went to the front door as Davis tried to enter the café, then physically prevented Davis from entering the café and told him to leave. Nasr recalled the other male trying to persuade Davis to leave the area. Nasr said Davis then produced a firearm, which he pointed at Nasr's face and chest. Nasr stated he'd never had a gun pulled on him before and was afraid Davis was going to shoot him. Nasr believed his life was in danger. Nasr observed Davis and the other male walk southbound on High Street towards the library. Nasr observed Saleem speaking to [REDACTED], and told [REDACTED], "Watch out, he has a gun. He pulled a gun on us." Nasr observed Davis walking across High Street alone. Nasr saw [REDACTED] exit his cruiser, pull his duty weapon out and give verbal commands to Davis to stop. Nasr recalled that Davis ran and [REDACTED] pursued him. Nasr observed [REDACTED] firing his weapon but could not see Davis at the time the shooting incident occurred.

Jayden Willis/Jesse Jones

At approximately 1045 hours on the morning of the incident, two male subjects approached SA Gore and SA Douglass on the eastern end of Lantern Square Apartments where the shooting incident had occurred. The males arrived at the scene to search for Davis. They said that the last known location of Davis's phone was at the apartment complex. One of the males identified himself as "Jesse," and he declined to provide his last name but was later identified as Jesse Jones (Jones). Jones explained that he was with Davis in the Campus area earlier the previous evening until around 0130 hours. The other male refused to provide his name, and he claimed that he did not know Davis. Instead, he claimed that he only gave Jones a ride to the campus area to help him search for Davis. The male accompanying Jones was later identified as Jayden Willis (Willis), who was determined to be the stepbrother of Davis. Jones was reportedly a close friend of Davis, and Davis frequently stayed at Jones's house in

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Dublin. After verifying the identities of Jones and Willis, BCI agents' attempts to obtain statements or conduct interviews with Jones and Willis were unsuccessful.

Officer Interviews

The following paragraphs are extremely abbreviated versions of the involved officer's account of his or her actions pertaining to this incident and/or discharging their weapon. More detailed accounts can be found by reading the separate reports written by the interviewers and by reviewing the recordings of each interview.

In his written statement to BCI, [REDACTED] wrote:

"I was nearing High Street when I noticed a male on the sidewalk, waiving his hand in the air, trying to get my attention, and walking towards my cruiser. I stopped my cruiser, and he stated he has a business right there and that two guys had just pulled a gun on him. He stated that the one in a gray hoodie had the gun and threatened to come back do something to his business. At this time, another male walked up and stated that they (the suspects) went behind the library and have a gun. I aired the information over the radio and drove towards High Street. As I did this, the two males walked towards High Street and one of them pointed and yelled that it was one of the suspects. I saw an individual in a gray hoodie walking east across High Street. I aired that I had one of them in front of the Village Idiot (a bar), as I turned south onto High Street."

[REDACTED] described his encounter with the involved subject, who has since been identified as Ta'Shawn Davis (Davis), and explained, *"I pulled my cruiser onto High Street and stopped. The suspect was still walking east and was now in the middle of the street. As I exited my cruiser, I drew my weapon from its holster. I yelled at the suspect to get his hands up while I used the light on my gun to illuminate the suspect. He looked at me and his eyes got large, like I had startled him. He paused for half a second but then ignored me and continued across High Street. Once he reached the grass in front of the Lantern Square Apartments, he started running. I saw him bend his arm at a 45-degree angle, with his elbow out and his hand near his waistband/appendix area and pull out a large object. A second later I realized that it was gun. I aired his description and that he had a 33 (10- code for a gun). I yelled at him to show me his hands or I would shoot him. He ignored me and kept running. He ran towards the steps that lead down to the common area which has several round tables with umbrellas and separates the two apartment buildings. I ran after him. He ran down the steps and tripped at the bottom of them and dropped the gun. He picked it back up."*

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██████████ wrote the following information regarding his involvement in the shooting incident, *"He ran straight (east) through the common area. He went slightly to his left (north). The gun was still in his right hand, and his left shoulder started to turn back towards me, and I thought he was turning to shoot me. I discharged my weapon. The suspect went to the ground and I believe I heard the gun hit the cement. I saw the gun on the ground just a couple inches above his head. I aired 10-3 (the code for officer in trouble) and "shots fired" and for a 24 (which is the code for a medic). The suspect moved slightly to the right and lifted his head up. He was also moving his right hand. I yelled at him to stay away from the gun and not to move. About a minute later, an OSU officer arrived. We approached the suspect. The OSU Officer kicked the gun away from above the suspect. I started to secure the suspect's arms while the OSU officer held cover. As I did this, multiple other officers arrived on scene. CPD Officer Eisenhut secured the suspect in handcuffs. Officers began rendering aid to the suspect. As there were numerous officers on scene, I let them provide aid and secure the scene. I walked back to High St."*

██████████ explained his decision to fire his duty pistol, *"At the time I fired my weapon, I was in fear for my life. I gave the suspect multiple verbal commands which he ignored and refused to surrender. I do not recall him making any statements during this incident. Several seconds before I discharged my weapon, the suspect tripped/stumbled and dropped his gun. Instead of leaving it, he picked the gun up and ran straight ahead. Immediately before I fired, the suspect had cut to his left (north) and then started to turn to his left (towards me). I believed he did this to turn and fire at me because there was no reason for him to go to his left or start to turn with the gun in his hand because the only exit from this area was on the east and west ends. On the north side there were only doors/windows that open directly into the apartments and a brick wall. Since he turned towards the north, I thought he was doing it to get a tactical advantage and fire at me because there was nowhere for him to escape to the north. I believe he expected me to follow him down the steps. If I had followed him down the steps, I would have been caught in what is referred to as the fatal funnel (a choke point) and at a tactical disadvantage. Since he had just dropped and picked up the gun and was turning in a direction that clearly did not offer an escape route, I believed he was turning to shoot and seriously injure or kill me. I do not believe I had any other reasonable alternative to protect my life from the suspect's deadly threat at the time I fired my weapon."*

██████████ articulated that a taser would not have been a reasonable response due to several factors including time, distance, and his observation of Davis to be armed with a handgun. ██████████ confirmed he perceived Davis as an immediate threat due to

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his observation of Davis in possession of a firearm. [REDACTED] also indicated he believed Davis posed a threat to the owners of the nearby hookah café, whom Davis had allegedly pointed a firearm at, or potentially a threat to anyone else from the public he may have encountered had he fled the area where [REDACTED] confronted him. [REDACTED] expressed concerns about how densely populated the area around the shooting incident occurred, being in the Ohio State University (OSU) campus area and the time of night being shortly after the bars in the area had closed.

[REDACTED] confirmed that since the date of the shooting incident, he had been informed that Davis's gun was a "pellet" or "BB" gun. [REDACTED] explained that during the incident he did not have enough time or information to deduce whether Davis's gun was a real firearm. "There was nothing about it, in its shape or how he acted that made me think that it was not a firearm."

Dispatch-Related Information

The computer-aided dispatch (CAD) report from CPD for this incident was titled as 'Columbus Police CAD Report # [REDACTED] - 33 - Person with a Gun' and a documented incident location of North High Street and East 9th Avenue.

The following information was documented in the CAD narrative notes:

Dispatch recordings of radio traffic related to this incident were provided to BCI in electronic audio file format. *(Note: audio file received from CPD did not denote date or time of radio traffic events)* Please refer to the actual audio file for specific details.

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Upon review of CPD's dispatch audio recording, the following was noted:

- **00:14:02:** Unit [REDACTED] announces he was flagged down on a "33" (person with gun) near High Street and 9th Avenue and states, "Two male Blacks, one southbound in a white shirt and one in a gray hoodie."
- **00:14:34:** [REDACTED] announces, [REDACTED], got one running, eastbound Black male with a gray shirt, he's got a 33 (gun)."
- **00:14:39:** Dispatch announces, "Copy, 10-3 (officer in trouble)."
- **00:14:44:** [REDACTED] announces, "Shots fired, need a 24 (emergency squad or ambulance)."
- **00:14:54:** [REDACTED] reports his location at 1444 North High Street.
- **00:16:27:** [REDACTED] confirms the shots fired were police-involved.
- **00:17:19:** [REDACTED] announces another suspect is still at large, a Black male with long hair and a white shirt, who went westbound behind the Village Idiot (bar).
- **00:17:57:** Unknown unit requests, "Officer support please."

Several 911 emergency calls were received related to this incident. Upon review of these audio recordings, the following was noted:

- **2025-10-12_03.37.16_Ch91118698.wav:** Caller reported her address to be 1436 ½ High Street and hearing "a bunch of gunshots and screaming." Caller estimated hearing five to six gunshots but did not see who fired the shots. Caller reported hearing police sirens while speaking to the 911 dispatcher and stated she did not need to speak to a police officer.
- **2025-10-12_07.40.57_Ch91119610.wav:** Caller identified herself as Rebecca Suttles (Suttles) and said she believed her grandson, Tashawn Davis (Davis), had been "shot downtown." Suttles indicated someone had seen Davis's vehicle in a news video clip and that there was "an interaction with the police." Suttles provided her phone number as [REDACTED]. Suttles also stated, "They said that there was just an interaction and maybe [Davis] had been shot and he's dead." Suttles identified herself as Davis's grandmother.
- **2025-10-12_11.49.57_Ch91121523.wav:** Female caller told the 911 dispatcher she wanted to report a missing person and identified herself as the stepmother of Davis. Caller stated she had not seen Davis since the previous day. Caller provided a physical description of Davis. Caller reported Davis and her son went to "OSU" together the previous night. Caller said someone had told her son that Davis had been shot and that Davis's phone was pinging in the downtown Columbus area. Caller also reported Davis's car had been found in the area with

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the windows down and that the car was filled with "beer bottles and alcohol." Caller reported her son said Davis's phone was pinging at the "crime scene." Caller indicated she had been told at approximately 0400 hours that morning that Davis had been shot. Caller reported Davis is known to drink alcohol and "smokes weed." Dispatcher asked if Davis was known to carry weapons, to which caller replied with the following statement:

"Well this is the story that my son is saying; his story is...my stepson (Davis) was at the bar last night and he was acting crazy. Said that he had a fake 'BB' gun, like a fake sort of gun, at the bar last night and that he was pulling it out talking about he was gonna shoot the place up...my son just said that he was just like not himself, and that he was trying to fight a female."

Caller indicated that her son left Davis due to his behavior. Caller reported Davis had told her son that he was in possession of a "fake gun" and stated, "He kept showing it as if it was real." Caller said Davis's father was on the line and identified him as Shawn Lynn. Caller did not identify herself by name.

Video Recordings

BCI received body-worn camera (BWC) video evidence related to the incident from GPD, which was subsequently reviewed. Please review the actual videos and the correlating investigative report documenting BCI's review of these videos for specific details.

BWC video shows [REDACTED] in his cruiser being approached by Saleem on East 8th Avenue east of High Street. Saleem states, "There's two guys right here...one pulled a gun on me," while Saleem is seen pointing to the direction where he believes they went. Saleem provided physical descriptions to [REDACTED] of the two males and stated the male subject in the gray hoodie (Davis) was in possession of a gun.

[REDACTED] turns south onto High Street and can be seen exiting his cruiser, immediately giving verbal commands, "Get your hands up," to Davis, who is wearing a gray/white sweatshirt. [REDACTED] draws his firearm from his holster and aims the firearm in the direction of Davis. [REDACTED] attempts to make radio announcements; [REDACTED] gives additional verbal commands, "Get your hands up or I'll shoot you."

[REDACTED] announces via radio he has "one running" eastbound with a 33 (gun); [REDACTED] voice is elevated while making announcements, his left hand obstructs the camera view while he attempts to use his radio. [REDACTED] lets go of his radio and grips his firearm with both hands; Davis appears to fall to his hands and knees. [REDACTED] gives verbal commands, "Show me your hands or I'll shoot you." Davis stands up and continues to run when [REDACTED] fires multiple rounds in Davis's direction.

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█ gets on the radio and advises "10-3 (officer in trouble), shots fired, need a 24 (medic)." █ gives more verbal commands, "Stay away from that gun. I'll shoot you again. Do not move." █ announces his location as 1444 North High Street and requests emergency medics to stage. █ continues to tell Davis not to move. An Ohio State University Police Department (OSUPD) officer arrives, █ and the OSUPD officer approach Davis. █ tells the OSUPD officer the gun is near Davis's hands above his head. As they approach Davis, a black handgun is visible on the ground near Davis's head. █ and the OSUPD officer secure Davis, other officers arrive at the scene and begin rendering medical aid to Davis. █ exits the shooting incident area.

In his cruiser dash cam video, █ turns his cruiser onto North High Street. Davis is visible in the middle of the street, walking eastbound. █ can be seen exiting the cruiser and has Davis at gunpoint giving verbal commands, "Get your hands up." Davis runs towards the apartment building at 1444 North High Street. Davis runs up a small grass embankment, into the apartment building's courtyard area and out of sight. █ pursues Davis, stopping at the landing above the courtyard. █ can be observed firing multiple rounds from his duty pistol, with audible gunshots being heard in the video recording.

Conclusion

All persons known to have relevant information regarding this investigation have been interviewed (or attempted), and all known pertinent records and evidence have been obtained and reviewed. BCI will continue to offer investigative assistance into any newly identified witnesses or information related to this criminal investigation. BCI's investigation into this officer-involved critical incident (OICI) is concluded unless such new information/witnesses is/are identified through grand jury or other means.

Agents remain available for consultation and/or to perform any additional investigation, analysis, processing and/or other assistance/involvement which might be deemed to be necessary to the investigation.
