**Narrative:**

On October 19, 2024 at approximately 1346 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agents Dave Hornyak and Richard Ward interviewed Montgomery County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) Deputy Alec Pfaff relative to the officer-involved critical incident that occurred earlier that day in Dayton, Ohio. Also present was FOP Representative Det. Ryan Dalton.

The interview was recorded on a handheld digital recording device. This report is a summary only. The entire interview can be reviewed on the recording.

Deputy Pfaff provided the following information:

While on duty earlier this morning, he responded to a "Code 99" indicating a countywide response needed by all available law enforcement agencies. While enroute to the scene, he heard an update specifying that the call was in regard to a male in a car along with a directive for stop sticks to be deployed around the scene. Deputy Pfaff proceeded to block the intersection of Princeton and Rosedale and deployed stop sticks at the location. From his position, he could see police cruisers around a tan vehicle. He could not see into the vehicle due to car having tinted windows. At some point, Deputy Pfaff heard multiple gunshots and heard over the radio that the subject was down. Deputy Pfaff verified that he did not see the shooting. After the incident he saw a Dayton officer speaking to persons claiming to be family of the subject.

The interview terminated at approximately 1353 hours.
