## APPROVAL—LEASE OF LANDS IN DECATUR AND FAIR-FIELD TOWNSHIPS, WASHINGTON COUNTY, OHIO, FOR THE PURPOSE OF GAME AND BIRD REFUGE— GILMAN IRVINE.

## COLUMBUS, OHIO, March 30, 1937.

HON. L. WOODDELL, Conservation Commissioner, Columbus, Ohio.

DEAR SIR: You have submitted for my examination and approval certain leases executed to the State of Ohio by one Gilman Irvine of Little Hocking, Ohio, leasing and demising to the State for the purpose therein stated tracts of land in Decatur and Fairfield Townships, Washington County, Ohio.

The leases here in question, deisgnated with respect to the number of the lease and the acreage of land covered by the respective lases, are as follows:

Each and all of these leases are for a term of five (5) years and in each instance the property described is leased to the state for the sole purpose of a state game refuge. And, in this connection, it is noted that as to each of these leases the Conservation Council, acting through you as Conservation Commissioner, has made an order setting aside the lands described in the lease for the purpose of a state game and bird refuge, as provided for in Section 1430-1, General Code.

Upon examination of these leases, I find that the same have been executed and acknowledged by the lessor in the manner provided by law. I also find upon examination of the provisions of these leases and of the conditions and restrictions therein contained, that the same are in conformity with statutory provisions relating to the execution of leases of this kind.

I am accordingly approving these leases as to legality and form, as is evidenced by my approval endorsed upon the several leases and upon the duplicate copies thereof, all of which are herewith returned.
