Narrative:

On January 12, 2026, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent Kyle Douglass (SA Douglass) received an audio recording of a witness interview conducted by Columbus Division of Police (CPD) Detective Art Hughes (Det. Hughes). The audio file was provided by Det. Hughes to BCI via Axon/Evidence.com case management system. This recording was provided to BCI in order to investigate an officer-involved critical incident (OICI) which occurred on October 12, 2025, at 1444 North High Street in Columbus, OH.

Please refer to the actual audio recording provided by CPD for further details and clarification. Upon reviewing audio of the interview conducted with Nevaeh Boring (Boring), SA Douglass noted the following:

The interview with Boring took place on October 16, 2025, at approximately 1234 hours. Det. Hughes initially made contact with Boring's mother, Jessica Crawford (Crawford). Crawford reported on the night of the incident she woke up and realized that Boring wasn't home, although she was supposed to be. Crawford indicated she has access to Boring's phone location, which was in the downtown Columbus area. When Crawford arrived at the location where Boring's phone was pinging, she was informed that Boring had been questioned by police and then released. After finding Boring, Crawford learned there was an incident involving multiple juveniles assaulting people and stealing jewelry.

Det. Hughes then spoke with Boring. On the night of the incident, Boring took an Uber to the Ohio State University (OSU) campus area, where her girlfriend (Harmonie Wilson) was with a group of individuals Boring did not know. Boring estimated the group was approximately four males and two or three females. Boring reported a male who she identified as "AZ" (Azhani Edwards) was "putting his hands on people." Boring recalled AZ saying, "I'm about to start taking people's chains." Boring believed AZ was heavily intoxicated.

Boring indicated AZ "snatched" a piece of jewelry from somebody and began assaulting them. Boring then stated, "Even that boy that had died, he was doing stuff too." Boring confirmed the male she was referencing, Tashawn Davis (Davis), was part of the group her girlfriend and AZ were with. Boring denied knowing Davis prior to the incident, who she identified as "Tay" and did not learn his full name until after the night of the incident. Boring said Davis and the other males in the group were "being disrespectful" and Davis claimed they were going to go into a Subway restaurant and smoke.

Boring reported that Davis had pointed a gun at her, which she stated was a pellet/airsoft gun. "He upped a BB gun on me," Boring stated, and explained she ran when Davis pointed the gun at her. Boring indicated she did not know at the time she ran from Davis that his gun was not a real firearm. Boring claimed she later found out from another girl that Davis's gun was a pellet gun.

Boring reported one of the Black males in the group, possibly AZ or Davis, struck one of the females multiple times. "He got really aggressive and then he pulled the gun out," Boring stated. Boring then ran from the area and turned several corners, fearful that she would be chased. Boring believed Davis was wearing a gray hoodie and possibly sweatpants, but she could not recall with certainty. Boring played a news video about the incident on her cell phone during the interview. The interview audio also indicates Boring showed Det. Hughes a picture on her cell phone identifying Davis.

Boring explained she was still in the area when she heard multiple gunshots. Boring estimated hearing at least six gunshots. Boring believed Davis had broken away from the group several minutes before she heard the gunshots. "I started running because I didn't wanna be part of that," Boring stated. Boring believed one or two of the other males went with Davis when he left the group. Boring later stated Davis also seemed to be intoxicated. Boring did not think anyone else in the group had a gun besides Davis.

Boring indicated when she fled the area, she was picked up by someone in a vehicle who she did not identify, along with AZ. Boring reported a Hispanic male in the car whose name she did not know told AZ if he hadn't been assaulting people and stealing jewelry then the shooting incident involving Davis would not have occurred. "And that's kind of true," Boring stated.
