## Narrative:

On Monday, November 25, 2024, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Eric Lehnhart (SA Lehnhart) received Michael Oswalt's (Oswalt) emergency medical services (EMS) response records from BCI Special Agent Andrew Harasimchuk.

SA Lehnhart reviewed the EMS records and noted the following:

Oswalt's EMS records consisted of four (4) pages. Mansfield Fire Department's Tactical Medics (TEMS) #1 and #3 responded to 200 Cline Avenue, Mansfield, Ohio 44907 with the Allied Special Operation Response Team (ASORT) for a suicidal male who was holding his family hostage in their home. While on scene, the male, identified as Michael Oswalt charged at officers with a knife. Oswalt refused commands from officers to stop and drop his weapon. Multiple rifle cartridges were fired towards Oswalt, striking him and causing him to fall to the ground.

Immediate care was provided to Oswalt who presented unresponsive with a During advance life During advance life support measures, Oswalt's condition went from As Oswalt's injuries Oswalt deceased on scene at 05:05 hours.
