Narrative:

During the course of this investigation Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Jason Snyder (SA Snyder) received documents from Celina Police Department and the Mercer County Sheriff's Office. The records which were requested included any reports pertaining to the August 25, 2023, Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI), except for any statements made by the involved officers. Special Agent Supervisor (SAS) Scott Stranahan reviewed the documents and noted the following:

The first document reviewed by SAS Stranahan was a Celina Police Department report. The incident number is listed as 23-011428. The report was dated August 25, 2023. The location of the incident was listed as 500 Grand Lake, Celina, Ohio. The offense was listed as Felonious Assault. There was a brief narrative that stated a Felonious Assault report was taken on the listed date and time. No other pertinent information was contained with this incident report. A copy of the incident report has been placed in this case file and attached to this investigative report.

SAS Stranahan next reviewed a Mercer County Sheriff's Office Report. The incident report number was listed as 23MS02239. The report was dated August 25, 2023. The location of the incident was listed as "Eastview by the Pond Celina, Ohio 45822." This report contained a brief time line of dispatch notes regarding the OICI. This report also contained brief summaries from the following individuals concerning their on-scene activities: Sergeant (Sgt.) Darrell Etgen, Deputy Patrick Cupp and Detective Chad Fortkamp. A copy of the incident report has been placed in this case file and attached to this investigative report. Please refer to both of the attached documents for further details.

Notes from Sgt. Darrell Etgen

On August 25th, 2023 while on routine patrol I heard Celina PD radio traffic. I heard a Celina PD officer say their taking off. I then heard shots fired and struck. I radioed dispatch and advised them that I would be responding to the shots fired call in emergency operation of my patrol vehicle. I advised dispatch that I would be en route from S. R. 117 and Shindeldecker Rd.

Dispatch then advised that Celina PD units were out at East View Park. Dispatch then advised that Celina PD was wanting shields. I then advised dispatch to contact Captain Baker and let her know what we were going to.

I then arrived on the scene and was informed by a St. Marys Sergeant that the incident was contained. I could see the ems was loading a male in the back of the squad. We were then told to move our patrol cars so the squad could get out. I then moved by patrol car and contacted Capt. Baker to let her know the situation was contained. Celina PD then informed me that they had an active domestic and asked if we could handle it. I then told Dep. Cupp to take a Coldwater PD unit with him and handle the domestic. I was securing the rear of the scene to make sure nobody entered the park.

Celina Police Chief Wale asked me to secure and observe the scene along with Ptl. Poppe as a neutral party. I then was asked by Celina Assistant Chief Harting if I could get a Detective from our office to come to the scene and pick up the female and her baby. Chief Harting said that he wanted to keep the witnesses separated and asked if we could transport the female and baby to our office. I then contacted Capt. Baker and she said that she would send a Detective to the scene. Sgt. Fortkamp arrived on scene a little later and drove the female and baby to the Sheriff's Office to wait on BCI to talk to her.

Chief Wale then asked me if I had any cones in my cruiser. Chief Wale advised that he found spent shell cases on the black top. I then placed my five cones over the spent shell cases to keep them safe until BCI could arrive on scene. I did see two duty magazines and two handcuff keys on the ground. Chief Wale placed cones around them to protect them until BCI could arrive. I then stood by and secured the scene until BCI could arrive on scene.

I then was asked to speak to a BCI agent and give my statement of what I saw and did on seen. I then was interviewed by Special Agent Supervisor Stranahan. I was then told I could clear

the scene by Chief Wale. I then cleared the scene and typed this report.

My body and cruiser cameras were activated during this incident. (See Attached Video)

Notes from Deputy Patrick Cupp

INVESTIGATOR NOTES

On August 25, 2023, I overheard Sgt. Etgen advised that he was en route to Celina 27(emergency response) in reference to shots fired. I then continued to the area of East View Park in emergency response. While en route I overheard a Celina PD unit request that a deputy bring their shield with them when they came up to the vehicle.

When I arrived on scene I saw that there were multiple law enforcement officers from Celina, Coldwater, and St. Mary's surrounding a male on the ground near the vehicle. I then asked Ptl. Rice if they still needed the shield, and he advised that he did not. I then started to head to where the other law enforcement officers were when Ptl. Powell advised me to grab a med kit. I then returned to my cruiser, and grabbed a med kit. As I got up to the male on the ground Celina's squad arrived on scene. As Celina's squad was backing up to the male I assisted with getting out medical supplies that the other officers needed. While up with the male I noticed that the male was bleeding from his back, and from one of his legs.

Once the squad got the cot out of the squad I assisted with getting the cot ready for the male to be transported. I then assisted with moving the male from the ground up onto the cot, and into the squad. Once the male was in the squad I assisted Ptl. Little of the St. Mary's Police Department with getting the tape set up around the scene.

As I was assisting Ptl. Little dispatch advised of a different call that was happening in the City of Celina. Sgt. Wynk and I then responded to the area of the other call.

After Sgt. Wynk and I cleared from the other call I was advised by Sgt. Etgen that I needed to respond back to the scene in reference to a BCI Investigator wanted to speak with me.

I then cleared the scene, and returned to patrol.

Initial

On August 25, 2023 at 0318 hrs I was contacted by Captain Baker. She advised me that there has been an officer involved shooting in Celina. She further advised that it involved the Police Department guys. She then advised that she needed someone to go to scene and pick up the female passenger and a baby. I was advised to bring them out to the Sheriff's Office so that

they can be inside with air. I advised that I would be on my way as soon as I got ready.

Once on the scene at Eastview, I pulled back to where some of the officers were at. I advised I was there to pick up the female and child. They then walked them to my vehicle. I had them sit in the back seat. I then asked the patrolman who would be coming to speak to them. I was advised that BCI is going to be handling the investigation so most likely someone from there. I then cleared from the scene and brought the female Hannah Pawelski and her 6 month old daughters to our office. I had them go into the interview room across from the civil office. I was able to get a couple of blankets for them. I asked when her daughter would be due to eat. She indicated that it is about time now. I advised that we do not have any and I will work on finding some.

There were several calls made but I ended up speaking to Jason Cupp from JFS about this. He was going to go to his office and see what they had there. He eventually advised all he was able to get was the diapers. He advised that they do not have any formula. I thanked him for his help.

I was then contacted by Sgt. Bartlett. He advised that BCI would like for me to get a signed consent to search for the vehicle since it is registered to Hannah. This would be for the diaper bag and the formula. Once this was signed I let them know that this was done.

Later on I was advised that a BCI agent was bringing the formula and diaper bag to our office and then they were also going to speak to Hannah about the incident. When they arrived I walked them to the interview room and introduced them to Hannah. They also provided her with the diaper bag and formula. I then went back to my office at this time.

Later the BCI agent came to my office and advised that a Police Department person was coming to the office to do the death notification. Once out at the office I met with Chief Wale. I explained to him that Pam Stapleton was in the lobby and Hannah was in the interview room. I then got Pam and we brought her back into the interview room where Hannah was at. I went in and introduced Chief Wale to Hannah and Pam. Chief Wale then took over and explained to them a little about what was going on. He advised that Hannah would be better to tell about it but that the male had passed away from the injuries he sustained. I was asked to remain in there while they were notified. I then assisted with getting them and their things out to the car. Once this was done they cleared from the Sheriff's Office.

I was contacted later by Assistant Chief Hartings. he inquired if I would be able to fly the drone for BCI. I advised them that I could. I advised that I would be on my way shortly. At this time Deputy Cupp and I went to the scene with the crime scene truck to fly the drone. Once on the scene I spoke to BCI Agent Scott. He told me that I would need to speak to Dave Hammond about what type of photos he was wanting to take. We walked over to where Dave was at. At this time Dave asked me if we had an accident reconstructionist working. I then advised that I was one. He then asked if once we were done with the drone would we be able to assist with trying to come up with some speeds. He then showed me some of the marks on the paved parking lot and advised that there were a lot of skids to go off of. I then looked at what appeared to be some marks made by a vehicle doing a "donut". I advised Dave that we could try.

Once I was done with the drone I downloaded the photos to an external hard drive for Dave Hammond. I then placed this back in his vehicle for him.

At this time Detective Baucher arrived on the scene. I went over the marks that were brought to my attention in the parking lot. We went over the marks as far as what we felt we may be able to try and get speeds from. It was also discussed about the software that Agent Hammon uses verses what we have. We then decided to get out our total station and forensically map the skid marks that we located at the scene. Once this was done we took some measurements. The marks in the middle of the parking lot were not matching up from anything that we could see us the actions of the suspect vehicle. These were photographed but they were not measured by the total station. We are confident that these marks are not part of the movements of the suspect vehicle. Once this was all done we cleared from the scene.
