Norwood units checked the entire lot and could not locate vehicle or victim.

Officer's Castanias, Riffle & Harrison made contact with two female employees in the lot who advised they had seen a light colored vehicle speed away with a broken out rear window towards Montgomery Rd. While attempting to gather more info, HCCC advised that CPD was on scene of a shooting in the 5000 block of Reading Rd. with one victim. Information relayed from CPD reference vehicle description closely matched the vehicle description we had obtained.

HCCC reestablished contact with original 911 caller to find their location. HCCC advised the caller was hysterical & not providing much information, but after multiple attempts the caller stated they were south on I 71. Still not knowing if there was a shooting victim or not I asked dispatch multiple times to try and obtain if in fact we had a victim.

I then told dispatch to have the caller return to Norwood so we could determine if we had a crime. HCCC advised the caller stated he had a gun in the car. HCCC began a phase 2 ping on the phone and was tracking movement. The track showed travel on north I 71 now & it was tracking back to Norwood. HCCC kept units up to date on travel as the vehicle reentered Norwood. HCCC was also able to confirm that there was a shooting victim in the car.

With this information I advised all Norwood to try & intercept this vehicle as quickly as possible.



Officer Bomske was in the PD lot dealing with a separate situation when she advised the vehicle was north on Montgomery Rd. passing the PD.

Norwood units intercepted the vehicle on Montgomery Rd. over SR 562 bridge.

The driver of the vehicle was immediately secured by P.O. Agnew and placed in a patrol car.

P.O. Riffle & Castanias immediately attempted to render aid to the front passenger, but the rear passenger was DOA. Norwood medics arrived on scene and immediately transported the front passenger to UCMC. (this person was pronounced dead at the hospital).

The scene was locked down & all vehicle & pedestrian traffic was diverted; Montgomery Rd. was closed between Frisch's & Norwood Ave.

P.O. Riffle & Castanias recovered & secured three firearms from the vehicle.

While on scene & collecting as much information as possible it was determined that this vehicle was involved in the CPD shooting & that the shooting had occurred in the area of E. Seymore & Joyce Ln. just outside of Norwood.

CPD was advised & responded to the scene. CPD Homicide unit responded to the scene & took over the scene & investigation. Coroners office also responded to the scene.

I made notification to Chief Kramer, Lt. Sumner & Lt. Fair. Lt. Fair responded to scene along with his detectives.

Lt. Fair & Sgt. Lewis coordinated communications between both agencies allowing for a smooth scene transition.

I would like to thank Lt. Fair & his team for their assistance. Job well done!

I would also like to thank each and every patrol officer who assisted with this incident, day shift, night shift & Auxiliary Ofc. Harper . Everyone of you played a critical role in making this a very well organized and controlled crime scene. Each & everyone of you did exactly what was asked of you without question or delay. I truly thank you for that.

Everyone worked together seamlessly without hesitation. Outstanding work!!

& his crew wasted no time in stepping up & relieving officers at the scene & also set up traffic post. was called in from detail to assist with patrol duties. Thank you all for jumping right in and helping when needed. It is truly appreciated.

I would like to recognizes all off the officers & Sgt. Kilby for an outstanding job in apprehending a felon who had just committed an aggravated robbery at Pizza Hut located at 4432 Montgomery Rd. on 2/5/22 @ 1414 hours.

HCCC advised Norwood units of a robbery that had just occurred at the Pizza Hut 4432 Montgomery Rd. Description was given, M/W, 20-30 yoa, wearing a blue jacket with a gray hoodie underneath, and that a weapon was implied. Taken in the offense was \$118.00 US Currency. Suspect last seen going north towards Kroger.

Two units were advised to go to the scene all other units advised to set up a perimeter. All units advised to switch to an areawide channel.

I responded to Kroger to check video. I was able to have the manager pull up the outside camera south entrance view and observed a M/W, fitting the description enter the Kroger store.

I advised all units of a more detailed description. Just seconds later sent out a text with a picture of the subject to all units and they both matched.

Thinking the suspect was still inside Kroger I called for two units to meet me inside Kroger & we would do a sweep of the store. While waiting for the units to arrive the manager advised while watching the video he seen the suspect had already exited the store via the north entrance and was last seen walking towards the BMV office.

I then had all units shift the perimeter to a more northern position and directed cars to start checking the Presidential streets behind Surrey Square moving in a north easterly direction.

I started checking north of Surrey Square. I was stopped by a citizen in the parking lot of Kroger who asked if we were looking for someone, he provided a description of the suspect.

I then pulled out onto Montgomery Rd. from Surrey Square & started checking the area, as I approached Elm Ave. I seen the suspect go into the parking garage, located @ 4650 Montgomery Rd. on the Elm Ave. side I advised over the radio of my location and that the suspect had just entered the garage on the Elm Ave. I exited my vehicle and made contact with suspect and held him at gun point until other units arrived.

Suspect was taken into custody with out incident & transported to the PD for paperwork.

Suspect was also found to have active warrant out of Kentucky for a probation violation for agg-robbery & was also wanted by CPD for an agg-robbery that occurred at Walgreens in Mt. Washington.

A CPD investigator came to our PD to interview suspect, who confessed to the offense in Cincinnati.

Suspect was ultimately charge with three aggravated robberies, one with Norwood, one with Cincinnati, & one with Hamilton SO. Also his outstanding felony warrant in Kentucky & with drug paraph, drug abuse instrument with our department.

This was outstanding performance by all officers involved. Everyone worked extremely well together, communicated well & followed direction with out question. Each not hesitating to put themselves in

harms way to apprehend a possibly armed felon!

The suspect was taken into custody fifteen minutes after the incident was dispatched!!

All of these officers displayed many of the CORE Values of the department.

Drop-off/pick-up are the most common, IF NOT ONLY regular interaction many parents and community members have with the school. There have been conscious efforts to address some of these issues; but as a community, more needs to be done. As result of the disorganization and safety concerns, I believe there has been an erosion of confidence of the school and of the greater community.

On behalf of many parents and community members I would like to thank both Ms. Booth and Day after day Ms Booth has been outside at drop-off. Parents have seen a caring staff member greeting

their child by name. Giving a smile or pat on the back. Making sure coats are zipped; asking questions; giving positive reinforcement... creating bonds and BUILDING CONFIDENCE with parents. Having her there gives a "face" to the school. Ms Booth: Thank you so very much for your commitment, rain or shine; warm or cold.

It was such a pleasure talking with you on Monday. You asked a few simple questions of me: Are there goals or procedures for drop off? What time are the doors open, and closed? Is the afternoon similar? Those simple questions showed me you care enough to find out, and have a commitment to help improve the situation. Being on a state route; between the two busy business areas of Surrey Square and Rookwood; and near the I-71 entrance makes Sharpsburg VERY visible to the local community (not only parents). The lack of order and safety creates a negative perception not only within Norwood; but with those that come here from surrounding communities as well. I was so VERY happy to hear that you will be at Sharpsburg on a regular basis. I understand there will be emergencies that may take you away. However, having an officer there on a regular basis will help reinforce good habits, give opportunities for positive interactions, and improve perceptions. Thank you for not only being at the school, but for interacting and making a commitment. It is very much appreciated.

On June 10 2018, PO Dossenback observed a vehicle with an expired license plate at Worth and Section Ave's. After running the license plate, the vehicle came back with a warrant attached to it. PO Dossenback attempted to stop the vehicle to see if the wanted person was in the vehicle. The vehicle refused to stop, fleeing into Bond Hill. After a short pursuit, the vehicle stopped Andina and Phantom Ln. where both occupants, two male blacks, fled from the vehicle. One of the male suspects who fled the vehicle was located at the residence of the alleged victim. He was identified by PO Dossenback and arrested.

The vehicle was impounded and inventoried. Inside the vehicle were two loaded handguns, one of which was reported stolen in Kentucky along with body armor and two digital scales. 4.2 grams of heroin was found near where the suspects fled from the vehicle.

PO's Hoffman and Fornash assisted with the impound and evidence recovery. Sgt. Vickers and PO Dossenback brought the suspect back to be interviewed and paperwork.



The suspect was interviewed by Sgt. Vickers and PO Dossenback. The suspect admitted to possessing all the evidence found in and around the vehicle. The suspect admitted that they had the body armor because they had been shot at before while selling drugs.
