INITIATIVE PETITION



To the Attorney General of Ohio: Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code § 3519.01(A), the undersigned electors of the State of Ohio, numbering in excess of one thousand, hereby submit to you the full text of a proposed Amendment to the Ohio Constitution and a summary of the same.

TITLE

The Freedom to Marry and Religious Freedom Amendment

SUMMARY

This proposed amendment would repeal and replace Section 11 to Article XV of the Ohio Constitution to:

- 1. Allow two consenting adults not nearer of kin than second cousins, and not having a husband or wife living, the freedom to enter into a marriage regardless of gender;
- 2. Define religious house of worship as one where the primary activity is religious worship and provides that no house of worship or its clergy shall be required to perform a marriage;
- 3. Provide that all legally valid marriages shall be treated equally under the law.

FULL TEXT OF AMENDMENT

Be it Resolved by the People of the State of Ohio that Article XV, Section 11 of the Ohio Constitution is hereby amended to add the following to Section 11 as the Freedom to Marry and Religious Freedom Amendment and repeal the existing language of Section 11 shown below with strikethroughs:

Section 11 Freedom to Marry and Religious Freedom

In the State of Ohio and its political subdivisions, marriage shall be a union of two consenting adults not nearer of kin than second cousins, and not having a husband or wife living, and no religious house of worship or the religious house of worship's clergy shall be required to perform a marriage. All legally valid marriages shall be treated equally under the law. For the purposes of this Section, a religious house of worship is one where the primary activity is religious worship.

Only a union between one man and one woman may be a marriage valid in or recognized by this state and its political subdivisions. This state and its political subdivisions shall not create or recognize a legal status for relationships of unmarried individuals that intends to approximate the design, qualities, significance or effect of marriage.
