Narrative:

On Friday, November 29, 2024, at approximately 1500 hours, Summit County Medical Examiner's Office (SCMEO) Forensic Investigator Jason Grom (Grom) contacted Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Allison Fletcher (Fletcher) via telephone to provide information on the identification of the involved subject.

SA Fletcher learned the following information:

The involved subject's name was Jazmir Tucker (Tucker). He was a 15-year-old, black male from the "Maple Heights", Ohio area. Identification was made in person at the SCMEO by Akron Police Department (APD) Detective Tony Sutton (Sutton). Sutton was a family friend and had known Tucker since birth.

The identity of Tucker was confirmed via medical records by the SCMEO. Medical records indicated at age 12, Tucker cut his ankle after "kicking a door" and slicing his ankle on glass. This was the cause of the scar on the left ankle previously observed by SCMEO Forensic Investigator Michael McGill.

Detective Sutton told Forensic Investigator Grom that Tucker had recently been "pushed out of his home" in Maple Heights, Ohio. Tucker was one of a set of twins and was likely in the Akron because he had family who lived in the area.

Forensic Investigator Grom stated that APD was making notification to Tucker's mother at her residence. The name provided for Tucker's mother was Ashley Green and the phone number of was also given.
