Narrative:				
On May 28, 2024 at approximately 1314 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Identification and Investigation (BCI) Special Agents Craig Call (SA Call) and Ryan Scheiderer (SA Scheiderer) obtained a recorded statement (Attachment # 06) from Columbus Division of Police (CPD) Police Officer (PD) regarding the shooting incident involving several law enforcement officers from three law enforcement agencies and Hamsa Yusuf Ali (Ali) that occurred on May 12, 2024, at the intersection of Georgesville Road and Clime Road in Columbus, Ohio (Franklin County). Ali was fatally shot by officers during that incident. The contact with (Sample of States) signed a Criminal Investigation Notification (CIN) form (Attachment # 04) affirming his decision to provide a voluntary statement. Prior to meeting with agents, (Sample of States) and his attorney prepared a typed statement which (Signed in front of agents affirming that would be his official statement regarding this incident. That statement (Attachment # 03) is attached to this report and available for review. The following is a summation of the contact with (It should be noted that during the interview, Ali was referred to as "suspect" by the officer and that verbiage may be used throughout the summary when trying to quote the officer or document what an officer stated they heard or thought regarding the incident.)				
was shot in the upper chest area by Ali during the incident and transported to Grant Medical Center where he was treated and released the same day. provided SA Call with a signed Medical Records Release Form in order for the records to be added to the case file at later date.				
In reference to the incident and events immediately surrounding the shooting, wrote the following:				

radio advised that there was an active shooter from Madison County that was being followed by plain clothes officers. I believe radio stated that the suspect was eastbound on Hall Road. We were just northeast of Hall Road. I told the drivers of both vehicles to exchange information and provided them with exchange of information cards. I got into the driver's seat of the cruiser and got into the passenger seat. was relaying the information that was coming over the MDT (mobile digital terminal) from the CAD (computer aided dispatch) system. The suspect vehicle was a white Toyota Camry and I believe stated the license plate was HNH (Henry Nora Henry). I do not recall a specific suspect description, only the white Camry and that there were plain clothes/cars officers following him. I believe we were roughly ten (10) minutes from the area where the suspect vehicle was located. A minute or so before the incident, radio aired that the suspect was northbound on Georgesville Road. that if we encountered Road and quicky approaching Georgesville Road. I told the suspect, she would be calling out everything and to be ready. I turned left (south) onto Georgesville Road. Just as we reached Chrome Motors (a used car dealership) a white Toyota Camry passed us.

"Immediately before this incident.

I flipped around to get behind it but there was some confusion as the license plate information we had been provided was HNH but I believe the license plate of the Camry was JNJ. This was causing some confusion as to if this was the correct vehicle. The Camry stopped at the intersection of Clime Road and Georgesville Road. I pulled up and stopped the cruiser approximately 15–20 feet behind the Camry. Just as I was putting the cruiser in park, I saw the Camry driver's door quickly open and the suspect (a male black) got out of the car. Suddenly, I saw the suspect had a gun pointed at me as I simultaneously felt that I had been hit in my left shoulder. I immediately drew my firearm (which I already had the hood unfastened which I did as we passed the suspect vehicle) and fired my weapon as I was exiting the cruiser. I heard multiple rounds of gunfire as the suspect ran east with his gun pointed behind him, firing at us. The slide on my firearm locked back and I dropped my magazine and reloaded. The suspect went down in the grass and the gunfire ceased. Multiple officers from several jurisdictions approached and secured the suspect. I knew I had been struck in the shoulder/arm and said that I had been hit.

Officer Mauck told me to go to the hospital. and I got into cruiser and she drove me to Grant Hospital. CPD Officer Support Team Member Geno met me at the hospital. Luckily, the bullet hit my vest and either shrapnel or the bullet ricocheted and grazed my upper shoulder/arm. I was released from the hospital several hours later and returned to the Columbus Police Academy and waited for BCI Agents to arrive. There they photographed me and collected my weapon. This ended my involvement in this incident.

I believe I fired eighteen (18) rounds at the suspect. I believe I fired all of my rounds in 3-4 seconds, as I fired in rapid succession. I believe I was approximately 12-15 feet from the suspect at the time I began firing and approximately 40-50 feet from the suspect when I stopped firing, as the suspect was running east. I fired from a standing position while tracking the suspect east. Initially I was using the cruiser door/ "A" pillar as cover, then I was using the

back of the cruiser for cover. I fired with a two-handed grip and I believe used my sights. The direction of my shots was northeast to east as the suspect moved. As the suspect ran east, he had his gun pointed behind him firing at us. My backdrop was the empty parking lot of Home Buys. My target was center mass. I stopped firing because the slide of my firearm locked back and when I re-loaded the suspect was down on the ground and not moving.

At the time I fired my weapon, I was in fear for my life as well as the lives of the other officers in the area. Prior to firing at the suspect, he had attempted to shoot a co-worker at Amazon and immediately before I fired, the suspect had just shot me and was continuing to fire at me and other officers on scene. I do not believe I had any other reasonable alternative to protect my life and the lives of the other officers from the suspect's deadly actions at the time I fired my weapon.

This entire incident happened in a matter of seconds. From the time the suspect's vehicle stopped at the intersection to the time to the time I was shot and the suspect went down was less than ten (10) seconds. I did not have time to give any verbal commands or de-escalate the situation as the suspect immediately exited his car and shot me.

At the time of this incident, I did have a taser on my duty belt. However, I did not use my taser as the use of a taser requires time, distance, barrier, lethal force backup and reasonableness. As the suspect was armed and had just shot me, it would not have been reasonable to use a taser as it is not reasonable to use less lethal force when a suspect is utilizing lethal force. I believe that my actions during this incident were consistent with my training as a police officer."



Exhibit A was used for reference only and exhibit B was for to identify approximate locations based on the questions asked. "I do not believe I had any other reasonable alternative to protect my life and the lives of the other officers from the suspect's deadly actions at the time I fired my weapon." confirmed the above statements were true and accurate.



STATEMENT OF OFFICER

This statement is regarding my involvement in an incident that occurred on Monday, May 12, 2024, between approximately 6:10 p.m. and 6:20 p.m. in the area of Clime and Georgesville Road Columbus, Ohio. I am voluntarily providing this statement as part of the investigation being conducted by the Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) into this matter.

My date of hire with the Columbus Division of Police (CPD or the Division) is

I was working my regular assignment at the time of this incident. I do not have any prior law enforcement experience but I was a member of the Explorers in Parma, Ohio. I do not have any military experience. I have a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Criminology from The Ohio State University. I do not currently have any uses of force that have been found outside of policy.

I was wearing the CPD patrol uniform consisting of navy pants and short sleeved shirt that displayed my badge and has CPD patches on both shoulders. I was also wearing an external ballistic vest. I had my body worn camera (BWC) mounted on the outside of my vest and it was activated during this incident. I was carrying my Division-issued Smith & Wesson 2.0 9mm service weapon which was loaded with division-issued ammunition. I am current in my range qualifications with this weapon. I was not carrying a backup firearm. I was working with a We were marked in as cruiser but physically driving cruiser Cruiser is equipped with a Cruiser Video System (CVS) and it was activated and working during this incident.

I do not wear glasses or contacts and my uncorrected vision is good. I do not wear hearing aids and my hearing is good. I do not suffer from any disabilities. I was not taking any

medication, prescription or over the counter, which could affect the performance of my duties. I had not consumed any alcohol in the 24 hours before this incident. I did not work any overtime or special duty in the twenty-four (24) hours prior to my shift and I arrived at the start of my shift well-rested.

Immediately before this incident, and I were in the area of Eakin Road and Forrest Creek Drive on a non-injury vehicle crash when the radio tone went out and radio advised that there was an active shooter from Madison County that was being followed by plain clothes officers. I believe radio stated that the suspect was eastbound on Hall Road. We were just northeast of Hall Road. I told the drivers of both vehicles to exchange information and provided them with exchange of information cards.

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I flipped around to get behind it but there was some confusion as the license plate information we had been provided was HNH but I believe the license plate of the Camry was JNJ. This was causing some confusion as to if this was the correct vehicle. The Camry stopped at the intersection of Clime Road and Georgesville Road. I pulled up and stopped the cruiser approximately 15-20 feet behind the Camry. 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At the time of this incident, I did have a taser on my duty belt. However, I did not use my taser as the use of a taser requires time, distance, barrier, lethal force backup and reasonableness. As the suspect was armed and had just shot me, it would not have been reasonable to use a taser as it is not reasonable to use less lethal force when a suspect is utilizing lethal force. I believe that my actions during this incident were consistent with my training as a police officer.

I have also now had an opportunity to review the body worn camera and cruiser camera footage of this incident. After reviewing it, I realized that I did not unholster and fire my weapon until I was at the back of my cruiser. My recall was that I had unholstered and fired my weapon as I was exiting the cruiser and that I had shattered the driver's side door window at that time. I also did not remember firing from the back of the cruiser as I moved around from the back to the front of the cruiser, tracking the suspect, and that is when I fired through the driver's side door window. I thought I had fired from a stationary position at the driver's side of the cruiser. It also appears that the suspect's gun may have malfunctioned after he shot me as he appears to rack the slide of his weapon. I cannot tell if he is then successful in firing additional rounds but during the incident I believed he was continuing to fire at us.

I now know that the name of the suspect is Ali Hamsa Yusuf. However, I did not recognize him and do not believe I have ever had any prior encounters, personal or professional, with him.

This concludes my statement, and I will now answer any additional questions you may have at this time.
