Narrative:

On June 20, 2023, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent Dave Hornyak received from the Lebanon Police Department (LPD), copies of requested records related to an Officer-Involved Critical Incident that occurred on June 17, 2023. Course BRIDGE - Bridge of Life Program

Category Diversity - Bias Training

Description The Bridge of Life program was introduced by a Proctor and Gamble executive, Hasani Gillispie. After seeing several negative interactions between the African-American community and law enforcement, Hasani wanted to develop a program that brought together members of each group to foster understanding through open communication. The Bridge of Life program's goals are to facilitate understanding, create empathy, and reduce loss of life.

The program started on 2015. Hasani recruited fellow African- American P&G employees to take part in the program. Mason Police and West Chester Police represented the law enforcement continent. Each officer is partnered with a P&G representative where they have one on one meetings over a series of 5 weeks. During these meetings topics that are covered include, negative police interaction with minorities, racial profiling, use of force protocol and media bias towards police and minorities. The conclusion of the program involves a group discussion on how perceptions and ideas, are changed.

On 10/22/22 at approximately 2028, Lebanon Police and Fire/EMS units were dispatched to Taco Bell at 715 E. Main St. regarding a male experiencing chest pain. Dispatch requested police units respond with fire units because the male caller stated that he was intoxicated.

Ptl. Stallard and Ptl. Shaver arrived on scene first and advised that the male subject had ran from Taco Bell toward the Guest Inn at 725 E. Main St. Ptl. Stallard and Ptl. Shaver later located the subject behind the Guest Inn. Ptl. Stallard advised dispatch of the new location and requested that the fire units respond to the Guest Inn. The two officers spoke with the male subject later identified as Joshua Dearborn.

I later arrived on scene and walked toward the other officers. Lebanon Fire/EMS was also already on scene. I then observed Joshua walking in front of the officers and fire employees. Officers and fire employees instructed Joshua not to go into the ambulance and to wait for us. Joshua continued running toward the ambulance. Joshua then opened the driver's door of the ambulance. Joshua's actions made it appear that he was attempting to take the ambulance. I then ran toward Joshua and escorted him to the ground. Ptl. Stallard and Ptl. Shaver then assisted by placing Joshua in handcuffs for everyone's safety.

Joshua was stood up and escorted onto the cot. Joshua sustained minor scratches to his wrist and shoulder from the incident. Joshua was transported to Atrium hospital for a mental health evaluation hold. Ptl. Shaver rode with Joshua in the medic unit to ensure a safe transport.

This incident occurred in the city of Lebanon in the county of Warren.

On 10/22/22 at 2032hrs, I was dispatched with the Lebanon Fire Department (LFD), to Taco Bell for a male complaining of chest pain. As I was en-route, Dispatch advised the male appeared to be under the influence due to his behavior on the phone. LFD, Ofc. Stallard and myself arrived on scene at the same time. Once on scene, witnesses advised officers that the male took off running toward the Guest Inn. Ofc. Stallard and myself made our way to the area where we observed a male screaming. Upon confronting the male, he ran from officers behind the second row of buildings in the complex. As he was running, I noted him saying that "charlie" was everywhere and after him. The male then laid on the ground multiple times, advising officers he needed help. From this interaction, Officers were able to identify the male as being Joshua J. Dearborn. It should be noted that this was the third time that LFD and LPD dealt with Dearborn on 10/22/22. Multiple times Ofc. Stallard and myself attempted to help the male, while he was on the ground; only to have him continue to run from us on foot. Dearborn believed that he was being attacked by "charlie" and believed he was in a war zone. At one point, Dearborn made multiple comments to Ofc. Stallard regarding his service weapon and to shoot him.

Once LFD made their way to our position, officers were able to convince Dearborn to walk to the medic. As Dearborn was walking to the medic, he continued to behave erratically and started to take his clothes off to include his pants. After being advised multiple times, Dearborn did put his pants back on. As Dearborn made his way around the building where he could observe the LFD Medic, he once again ran from officers toward the Medic. Dearborn then opened the driver's door of the Medic and attempted to get inside. During this, Sgt. [REDACTED] was able to grab Dearborn and escort him to the ground. Dearborn was then placed in a compliance hold by Sgt. [REDACTED] due to him continuing to resist and attempt to get free from officers. While Dearborn was in a hold, I placed handcuffs on him for his safety and the safety of officers and LFD personnel. I noted that during this, Dearborn sustained a minor "road rash" on his shoulder and back. Photos of the injuries were taken and attached to the report.

Dearborn was then placed in the Medic and strapped down for his safety. Due to Dearborn's behavior, it was determined that Dearborn would remain in handcuffs while being transported. It was also requested and approved that I ride with the Medic, to insure the continued safety of LFD personnel. While in transport, I noted Dearborn's behavior to continue to be erratic. Multiple times he would lash out and attempt to escape his restraints. He continued to believe he was in Vietnam and multiple times thought "charlie" was after him. Dearborn also continued to advise that he was married to Jennifer Aniston and spoke as if she was riding in the medic with him.

Dearborn was transported to Atrium Medical Center where multiple members of hospital staff and security had to assist in getting Dearborn into his room. Dearborn was signed in to Atrium Medical Center for a mandatory mental evaluation due to his erratic psychiatric behavior.

All events in this narrative occurred in the City of Lebanon, Warren County Ohio.

On 1/24/23 at approximately 1901, police units were dispatched to the area of 858 N. Broadway regarding a suspicious male subject. Dispatch advised that a caller from the residence stated the suspicious male subject was in their yard, staring at the residence.

It should be noted, police units were dispatched to a similar complaint regarding a suspicious male subject loitering in the area and yelling at another caller. That call was received approximately 20 minutes prior. Police had also responded to a similar call at approximately 0400 on the same date. In all of these instances, officers identified the suspicious male subject as Bradley Miller.

Upon my arrival to the area, I observed a male subject standing in the roadway in front of 856 N. Broadway. As I approached, I immediately recognized the subject as Bradley Miller from several prior dealings. As I was parking my vehicle, Brad began to walk out into the roadway into traffic. He attempted to cross the street in order to avoid me but, noticed Ptl. Shaver approaching the area. Brad then turned around and began walking back in front of 856 N. Broadway. Brad walked out into traffic again causing vehicles to slow and impeding traffic. Brad stopped on the sidewalk as I began walking to him.

I advised Brad to stop walking away and to stay out of the roadway. Brad began stating that we were "trying to set him up" and that we were lying to him. I advised him that we have had several calls about him recently and that this time, he had broken a law so he needed to stay and speak with me. Brad began walking toward the roadway again. I advised him that if he walked out into the roadway again he would be arrested. Brad continued to walk out into the roadway, into traffic, in total disregard for his own safety. Brad acted erratic throughout our interaction and continued stating things like "I don't know who to trust" and "please help me."

At this point I attempted to detain Brad for his disorderly conduct and for his own safety. As I attempted to do so, Brad immediately resisted. I attempted to use escort holds in order to place handcuffs on Brad but, he actively resisted by trying to pull himself from my grasp. Ptl. Shaver was on scene and immediately assisted. We attempted to escort Brad to the front of my cruiser in order to gain control of him but, he continued to resist. Brad continued to yell and continued to attempt to pull away from Ptl. Shaver and I. Brad was escorted to the ground where his resistance continued. Brad would not place his hands behind his back after being instructed to do so and attempted to grab at officers and our equipment. At some point in the altercation, Brad appeared have bitten the left hand of Ptl. Shaver. Ptl. Hounshell arrived on scene and began assisting us. Brad continued to resist after being told multiple times to put his hands behind his back. Brad continued to kick and roll to avoid detention. Throughout the incident, compliance and escort holds were utilized to attempt to gain control of Brad.

Police units were eventually able to gain control and handcuff Brad. Brad sustained minor scrapes and abrasions from the incident. Ptl. Shaver had what appeared to be a bite mark on his hand that did break his skin. Ptl. Shaver also had a laceration on one of his fingers, and abrasions to his knees from the incident. Ptl. Hounshell's eyeglasses were also damaged during the incident. Photographs were taken of the minor injuries sustained.

Brad was transported to the Warren County Jail by Ptl. Hounshell. At this time, Brad is being charged with disorderly conduct and resisting arrest.

This incident occurred in the city of Lebanon in the county of Warren.

On 01/24/2023 at 1901hrs, I was dispatched to 858 N. Broadway, in reference to an unknown male standing in the complainants front yard. Dispatch further advised the male was staring at their house. Once I arrived, I noted Sgt [REDACTED] was already on scene, attempting to speak with the male. As Sgt [REDACTED] was trying to talk to the male, he continued to walk in the roadway, away from Sgt [REDACTED] impeding traffic multiple times. I was able to identify the male as Bradley Miller from the previous interactions I have had with him, while employed at the Lebanon Police Department. Once seeing this, I ordered Miller to get out of the road and onto the sidewalk. Once on the sidewalk, Miller made his way to Sgt [REDACTED]'s position.

It should be noted that this was my third call regarding Miller on this date. The first call occurred at approximately 0400hrs for a suspicious person in the area of Saint Frances church. The second call was at approximately 1830 on this date, at the same location for Miller yelling at vehicles that were entering the parking lot to pick up their children. In both cases, Miller refused to speak to officers and walked away when they attempted to speak to him stated "I can not trust anyone".

During officers third interaction with Miller, Sgt [REDACTED] advised him to not walk away from officers and not to go into the busy roadway. Miller appeared to be under the influence of a substance, refusing Sgt [REDACTED]'s orders. Miller continued to walk into the roadway from officers and was advised to stop for his safety. Miller continued to disregard Sgt [REDACTED]'s orders and walked further in the road. Sgt [REDACTED] then advised Miller that if he continued to walk in the road, he would be placed under arrest. Miller disregarded this final order and continued to walk in the road, once again causing vehicles to stop, to avoid hitting him.

Due to this, Sgt [REDACTED] and myself deemed it necessary to take Miller into custody for his safety, safety of the public and his conduct. Once officers attempted to apprehend Miller, he attempted to run and immediately resisted officers once he was grabbed. This initial resistance was in the form of pulling his arms and body from officers. Sgt [REDACTED] and myself attempted to escort Miller to the front of a marked patrol car but was met with continued strong resistance. When in front of the patrol car, Miller used his feet to push off the front of the car to attempt to get away from officers. Due to the location and traffic, Miller was escorted to the ground for his and officer safety. While on the ground, Miller continued to resist officers and their commands.

Miller refused to roll over and place his hands behind his back. While resisting, Miller continued to grab at officers and their equipment. Once Ofc. Hounshell arrived on scene, he assisted Sgt [REDACTED] and myself with attempting to take Miller into custody. Miller was noted to be kicking and rolling and pulling officers to avoid being taken into custody. Due to Miller's behavior toward officers, compliance holds and techniques were utilized to take Miller into gain control of Miller. After approximately seven minutes of resisting officers, Miller was detained in handcuffs and placed in the back of a marked Lebanon Police Cruiser. I noted Miller to have light scarps and abrasions on his arm and head.

After placing Miller in the cruiser, I noted a small laceration on my right middle finger that was bleeding down my right hand. I also noted what appeared to be a bite mark that broke the skin on my left hand as well as an abrasion on my right knee. None of these injuries were present prior to my interaction with Miller. Miller was Transported to the Warren County Jail in a marked Lebanon Police cruiser by Ofc. Hounshell.

All events in this narrative occurred in the City of Lebanon, Warren County Ohio.

On January 24th, 2022 at approximately 1905 hours, I responded to 858 N. Broadway to assist Officer T. Shaver and Sgt. [REDACTED] with an unknown subject that was standing in the yard of the original complainant.

It should be noted that this was my third encounter regarding Bradley on this date. The first call occurred around 0400 hours, when a passerby called into to report Bradley walking around the parking lot of St. Francis De Sales Church parking lot. The second incident occurred at approximately 1830 hours, when a complainant called to report Bradley walking in the roadway and screaming at passing vehicles.

As I approached the scene westbound on Monroe Rd, I could see both Officer T. Shaver and Sgt. [REDACTED]'s marked patrol vehicles in the center non travel lane on N. Broadway St. As I was awaiting the traffic control device to turn green, I noticed what appeared to be Officer T. Shaver and Officer [REDACTED] physically struggling with the male. I initiated my overhead lights and cleared the intersection to assist both officers. I exited my patrol vehicle and witnessed both officers in a physical altercation with the male, Bradley Miller, and were attempting to take Bradley into custody. When I approached the altercation at the front of a marked patrol vehicle, I saw Bradley use his feet to push himself off the front of the vehicle as an attempt to get away from officers. Due to the location and traffic passing by the encounter, Bradley was escorted to the ground where Officer T. Shaver and Sgt. [REDACTED] were met with further strong resistance from Bradley. Bradley continued to resist officers and their commands.

After approximately 7 minutes of active resistance, Bradley was finally taken into custody. It should be noted that Bradley refused to roll over and place his hands behind his back as well as he continuously made attempts to grab officers and their equipment. It should also be noted that Bradley made various attempts to grab, kick and bite officers on scene. Bradley was detained in handcuffs and placed into a marked police vehicle, cruiser 101.

I proceeded to ask Bradley if he was in pain anywhere to which he stated he did not know. Bradley was transported to the Warren County Jail where he was booked in. It should be noted Bradley resisted jail staff during their book in process.

After clearing the scene and responding back to the Lebanon Police Department, I noticed an abrasion on my left knee and a small laceration to my left finger. These injuries were not present on my person prior to this altercation.

On 3/25/23 at approximately 0115, police units were dispatched to King's Bar at 126 W. Mulberry St. regarding a possible fight in progress. Upon arrival, I entered the establishment and was immediately met by a female who handed me a baseball hat and eye glasses. The female, identified as Margaret Lassen, is an employee at King's and was working as the bartender at the time of this incident.

Margaret then began telling a male subject who was standing near the front entrance that she did not want him at the bar. I then asked the male subject, later identified as Jeffrey Reeder, to step outside so that I could separate the parties and speak to them individually. At this time, Ptl. Shaver, Ptl. Magee and Ptl. Lloyd were on scene. I asked the Jeffrey to step outside so he could speak to the other officers and Ptl. Lloyd was at the front door of the bar where Jeffrey was exiting.

I then began to speak with Margaret and other patrons of the bar. Margaret stated that Jeffrey was sitting at the bar and hit another patron that was sitting next to him. Margaret and other patrons stated that Jeffrey struck the other patron with no provocation. Margaret stated at that time, she asked Jeffrey to leave the bar. Margaret also stated that at some point, Jeffrey attempted to strike her. While speaking with Margaret, another patron approached me and advised that he thought Jeffrey may have his cell phone. The patron did not advise that Jeffrey had stolen the cell phone but, it appeared he may have let Jeffrey use the cell phone to attempt to call for a ride. At this time, Margaret requested that we have Jeffrey leave the bar.

I then went outside to speak with Jeffrey and the other officers. While I was walking out of the front door of the bar and approaching Jeffrey, I asked him if he had the other patron's cell phone. Jeffrey answered but, I could not hear what he said. I then said "huh" in order to get Jeffrey to repeat his answer as I walked closer to him. At that time, Jeffrey struck me with his right hand in my face/neck.

Jeffrey was then escorted to the ground. I took hold of Jeffrey around the shoulders and, using escort holds, escorted him to the ground in order to affect an arrest. The other officers were all outside with me at this point and then assisted with the arrest. While on the ground, Jeffrey continued to resist by not putting his hands behind his back as he was ordered to do so. After just a short time, Jeffrey was secured with handcuffs. After he was secured with handcuffs, I asked Jeffrey if he had any injuries from the incident or if anything hurt. Jeffrey stated that he was not injured. Upon observation, I observed what appeared to be a small abrasion on Jeffrey's forehead, however, I am not certain if that was there prior to our involvement.

Once Jeffrey was placed into a marked cruiser, I requested Lebanon Fire/EMS respond to check him for any injuries. After they spoke with Jeffrey, I spoke with them and we concluded that the best course of action would be to transport Jeffrey to the hospital for further evaluation. In order to prevent further issues, Ptl. Shaver transported Jeffrey to Bethesda Arrowsprings and Ptl. Lloyd followed to assist.

Jeffrey was defiant and uncooperative while at the hospital. (See Ptl. Lloyd's and Ptl. Shaver's statements.)

Ptl. Magee and I gathered written statements from Margaret and the patron that Jeffrey had struck prior to our arrival identified as Benjamin Tosh. At this time, Benjamin wished to pursue a charge of assault against Jeffrey. Benjamin stated that Jeffrey struck him with his hand in the neck area while they were both seated next to each other at the bar. Benjamin did not sustain any injuries from the assault, nor did I.

Jeffrey was eventually released from the care of Arrowsprings and Ptl. Shaver then transported him to the Warren County Jail.

At this time, Jeffrey is being charged with assault (F4), assault (M1), resisting arrest (M2) and disorderly conduct (M4).

This incident occurred in the city of Lebanon in the county of Warren.

On Saturday, March 25th, 2023 at approximately 0117 hours, Sergeant [REDACTED] Ptl. Shaver, Ptl. Lloyd, and I responded to Kings Bar at 126 W. Mulberry St. on the report of an active fight. The caller stated that an older male wearing blue jeans and a black shirt was attempting to start fights with other patrons in the bar.

Upon my arrival, Sergeant [REDACTED] Ptl. Lloyd, and Ptl. Shaver had located the male and were escorting him out of the bar. The male was later identified as Jeffrey Reeder. Upon exiting the bar the Jeffery tripped and fell on the ground outside and stated that he broke his ankle. The Jeffery then stood up and advised that he was leaving. When I requested his I.D. he refused and advised that he was leaving. I then requested his name and he stated, "lets go". Jeffery again was asked to provide identification which he refused.

Sergeant [REDACTED] came outside and asked Jeffery if he had another patrons phone. Jeffery then struck Sergeant [REDACTED] with a closed fist in the face. Sergeant [REDACTED] and I then escorted Jeffrey to the ground. Ptl. Lloyd and Ptl. Shaver assisted in placing Jeffery into A handcuffing position. I then placed Jeffery into handcuffs. While Jeffery was handcuffed on the ground he advised that he was not hurt. Sergeant [REDACTED] requested EMS respond for an evaluation. Ptl. Lloyd and I then escorted Jeffery into a standing position and to the rear of a marked patrol vehicle. Jeffery refused to get into the rear of the marked patrol vehicle. Ptl. Lloyd and I then escorted him into the rear of the patrol vehicle.

A short time later, Lebanon EMS arrived on scene. Jeffery refused all medical services. I collected written statements from the bar tender Margaret Lassen and Benjamin Tosh. Ptl. Lloyd and Ptl. Shaver transported Jeffery to Arrow Springs Hospital for additional medical evaluation. Jeffery was cleared medially by Arrow Springs Hospital. Ptl. Shaver transported and booked Jeffery into the Warren County Jail. These events occurred in the City Of Lebanon, Warren County, Ohio.

On March 25, 2023 at 0117 hours, I, Officer Stephen Lloyd (Crew 134) was dispatched to Kings Bar on a fight in progress. I responded with Sergeant [REDACTED] (Crew [REDACTED]), Officer Travis Shaver (Crew 123), and Officer Brandon Magee (Crew 135).

As I reached the entrance to the bar, Officer Shaver and Officer Magee were walking a white male, later identified as Jeffrey Reeder, out of the bar. Officers Shaver, Magee, and I stood on the sidewalk with Reeder and Officer Shaver began requesting Reeder's identification. At one point a male exited the bar and stated that Reeder had his cell phone and the male requested that we retrieve his phone. Sergeant [REDACTED] exited the bar with the male and he asked Reeder if he had the male's cell phone. Reeder replied but Sergeant [REDACTED] was unable to hear what he said so he moved closer to Reeder. I turned my head toward the entrance of the bar and at that moment I heard a commotion to my right and I looked over to see Sergeant [REDACTED] and Officer Magee escorting Reeder to the ground. Sergeant [REDACTED] stated that Reeder had punched him in the face. Officer Shaver and I moved to Reeder to assist in placing him under arrest. I took hold of Reeder's shirt near his right shoulder blade with my right hand. I placed my left hand with an open palm on the right side of his head in order to prevent him from being able to raise his head to bite or spit. Reeder had his left arm underneath himself and ignored several orders to give us his hands. I knelt down beside Reeder's left side and took hold of his left arm and began attempting to pull it out from underneath himself. I was finally able to pull his arm out and Officer Magee was able to handcuff Reeder.

Officer Shaver and I walked Reeder to his cruiser and placed him in the back seat. Officer Shaver transported Reeder to Arrow Springs Hospital and I followed him in my cruiser.

Officer Shaver and I walked Reeder to Emergency Department room 8 and I handcuffed him to the bed. Reeder was highly intoxicated and was being belligerent. The nurses were attempting to take Reeder's vitals but he yelled obscenities at them as well as at Officer Shaver and myself. Reeder was yelling so loudly that he could easily be heard throughout the Emergency Department where there were other patients that were seeking medical treatment. The nurses were forced to administer a sedative to Reeder in order to complete his medical evaluation without interference.

Once Reeder was cleared by the hospital staff he was transported to the Warren County Jail by Officer Shaver.

On 03/25/2023 at 0116hrs, I was dispatched to Kings Bar in reference to a fight in progress. Once I arrived on scene, Ofc. Magee, Ofc. Lloyd and myself entered the bar. Inside the bar, I noted Sgt. [REDACTED] speaking to an older male who was later identified as Jefferey S. Reeder. Reeder was instructed to exit the building with officers outside. It should be noted as officers were ushering Reeder outside of the bar, he tripped and fell due to the level of his intoxication. When asked if Reeder was injured, he advised he was fine. While outside, officers requested Reeder to present identification. Reeder was hesitant with officers and continued to advised he wanted to leave. Reeder at one point was noted saying "I have a choice and I am leaving". Reeder was advised that he was being detained and could not leave and was required to present his identification per the previous request. As Reeder was getting his identification, Sgt. [REDACTED] exited the bar, asking Reeder if he had taken someone's phone from inside the bar; in which Reeder stated "who's phone" . As Sgt. [REDACTED] approached Reeder, Reeder made a fist and struck Sgt. [REDACTED] in the face. Due to the assault on an officer, Reeder was taken to the ground by Sgt. [REDACTED] and Ofc. Magee. Ofc. Lloyd and myself assisted, by holding Reeder's extremities and assisted in cuffing.

After being cuffed, Reeder was searched and placed in the back of a marked Lebanon Police cruiser. Reeder remained in my cruiser until Lebanon Fire arrived on scene to evaluate him for potential injuries. While in my car, Reeder was advised of his Miranda Rights and stated he understood but choose to "plea the fifth". When Lebanon Fire arrived on scene, they attempted to evaluate Reeder. Reeder advised he was not hurt and stated "take me where I'm going, I'm tired". Reeder advised to Lebanon Fire that he has multiple medical conditions and was able to answer all of their questions without issue. I did note that Reeder believed he was in the Mason area and not in Lebanon. Based on this information, it was determined by police units that Reeder would be transported to Arrowsprings hospital for evaluation while in police custody due to potential injuries sustained.

When Ofc. Lloyd and myself arrived at the hospital with Reeder, his movements were very lethargic and slow. Ofc. Lloyd escorted Reeder to the assigned room, while I remained with nursing staff to assist in checking Reeder in. After speaking with the nursing staff, I went to the room that Reeder was escorted to. When I came to the room, I noted Reeder not complying with Ofc. Lloyd's orders to roll over, so that the cuffs could be removed for the hospital staff to evaluate him. Ofc. Lloyd then rolled Reeder over and removed the cuff. During this time, Reeder became very irritated with officers and staff. Due to this, it was determined that Reeder would be handcuffed on both sides of the bed for the safety of the hospital staff.

The on call physician attempted to speak to Reeder but was unable to gain any information regarding his condition due to him not wanting to speak because he was under "duress". Reeder then started yelling for officers and nurses to get out of his room. Reeder the stated he wanted to speak to the sergeant but was advised the sergeant was the officer he hit in the face. Reeder stated "yea well good, he should know something". After calming down Reeder was taken by hospital staff and given a CT scan. Once the results returned, Reeder was cleared medically from the hospital with no issues noted. After being cleared, Reeder was transported to the Warren County Jail in a marked Lebanon Police cruiser; in accordance with Lebanon Police Department's policies and procedures.

For more information pertaining to charges, reference Sgt. [REDACTED]'s attached statement. All events in this narrative occurred in the City of Lebanon, Warren County Ohio.

551.2.7 Offense of Violence

- A. It is the preferred course of action in this state that the officer arrest and detain a person when there is reasonable grounds to believe that the offense of domestic violence or the offense of violating a temporary protection order or consent agreement has been committed. The Lebanon Division of Police shall have a preferred arrest policy regarding domestic violence, violating a temporary protection order, or assault.
- B. For the purpose of this section, reasonable grounds to believe that the offense of domestic violence or the offense of violating a temporary protection order or consent agreement has been committed is any of the following:
1. A person executes a written statement alleging that the person in question has committed the offense against the person who executes the statement or against a child of the person who executes the statement.
 2. No written statement of the type described in section A.1 is executed, but the officer, based upon his own knowledge and observation of the facts and circumstances of the alleged incident or based upon any other information, including, but not limited to, any reasonably trustworthy information given to him by the alleged victim or any witness of the incident, concludes that there are reasonable grounds to believe that the offense has been committed and reasonable cause to believe that the person in question is guilty of committing the offense.
 3. No written statement of the type described in section A.1 is executed, but the officer witnessed the person in question commit the offense.
- B. In accordance with Ohio Revised Code section [2935.032](#), anytime an officer responds to an *alleged* incident of domestic violence, violating a temporary order, felonious assault, or aggravated assault, an offense report will be submitted whether or not an arrest is made. The report shall document the officer's observations of the victim and the alleged offender, any visible injuries of the victim or alleged offender, any weapons at the scene, the actions of the alleged offender, any statements made by the victim, witness, or alleged offender, and any other significant facts or circumstances.
1. The report will also document if the suspect has been granted pretrial release from custody on a prior charge of the offense of domestic violence or the offense of violating a temporary protection order or consent agreement and has violated one or more conditions of that pretrial release.
 2. If the officer does not arrest the alleged offender, the officer must articulate in the report a clear statement of his reasons for not arresting and detaining the alleged offender until a warrant can be obtained. The report will be submitted to the detective section, the clerk, and the Chief of Police.

- C. In the case of felonious assault or aggravated assault, the officer must arrest the suspect if the suspect is the primary aggressor. However, if the suspect is not the primary aggressor, the officer is not required to make an arrest, although it is preferred that he does arrest the violator for the offense.
- D. In accordance with [2930.04](#) of the Ohio Revised Code, the officer will promptly give the following information (in writing) to the victim after the initial contact:
1. An explanation of the victim's rights,
 2. Information about medical, counseling, housing, emergency services, and any other assistance available to the victim,
 3. Information about victim reparations with name, address, and phone number of the agency, and
 4. Information about protection available, including protective court orders.
- E. As soon as practicable after initial contact, the officer will provide the victim with the following information in accordance with [2930.04](#):
1. Business telephone number of the investigating officer,
 2. Name, business address and telephone number of the prosecutor, and
 3. If the victim is not notified in a reasonable amount of time, how the victim may contact the agency for the status of the case.
 4. Within a reasonable amount of time after the arrest, the officer will notify the victim of the following information in accordance with [2930.05](#) of the Ohio Revised Code:
 - a. A notice of the suspect's arrest,
 - b. The eligibility of the suspect's pretrial release,
 - c. The telephone number of the police division,
 - d. The right of the victim to telephone the police division to determine if the defendant has been released, and
 - e. Notify the victim when the defendant has been released from our custody and the conditions of the release.
- F. The officer will promptly return the victim's property unless the prosecutor certifies the need to retain in lieu of photograph, court rule, or ownership in dispute in accordance with [2930.11](#) of the Ohio Revised Code.

G. In all cases of domestic violence, the officer's will:

1. Respond in timely manner.
2. The officer's will conduct an investigation and determine who the assailant is.
3. The officer should try to obtain a written or recorded statement from the victim, any witnesses, and the offender.
4. The officer will photograph any injuries.
5. The officer shall separate the victim and the offender and conduct separate interviews with the victim and the offender in separate locations, take a written statement from the victim that indicates the frequency and severity of any prior incidents of physical abuse of the victim by the offender, the number of times the victim has called the police for assistance and the disposition of those calls.
6. The officer shall not require, as a prerequisite to arresting or charging a person who has committed the offense of domestic violence or violating a temporary protection order or consent agreement, that the victim of the offense specifically consent to the filing of the charges against the person who has committed the offense or sign a complaint against the person who has committed the offense.
7. The officer will then arrest, incarcerate, and hold for bond the offender. Jail space will not be a consideration for arrest. The arresting officer will file the appropriate charge without delay.
8. The arresting officer will advise the victim of their rights under the law.
9. It is the preferred course of action in this state that the primary aggressor be arrested in all cases of domestic violence. There is no preferred course of action in this state regarding any other family or household member who committed the offense and whom the officer does not have reasonable cause to believe is the primary aggressor. However, the officer may arrest any other family or household member who has committed an act of domestic violence or any other type of assault.

H. If an officer does not arrest or detain a person whom the officer has reasonable cause to believe committed the offense of domestic violence, the offense of violating a temporary protection order or consent agreement, or an act of violence when it is the preferred course of action in this state pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code that the officer arrest that person, the officer shall articulate in his written report, a clear statement of his reasons for not arresting and detaining that person until a warrant can be obtained.

1. If the suspect is hospitalized, the officer may summons the offender in lieu of arrest.

2. If the offender has left the scene prior to arrival, the officer will file the charges in court as soon as possible. The offender will be arrested without unnecessary delay.
- I. In determining which family or household member is the primary physical aggressor in a situation in which family or household members have committed the offense of domestic violence or the offense of violating a protection order or consent agreement against each other, the officer, in addition to any other relevant circumstances, should consider all of the following:
 1. Any history of domestic violence or any other violent acts by either person involved in the alleged offense that the officer reasonable can ascertain;
 2. Whether the alleged violence was caused by a person acting in self defense;
 3. Each person's fear of physical harm, if any, resulting from the other person's threatened use of force against any person or resulting from the other person's use or history of the use of force against any person, and the reasonableness of that fear.
 4. The comparative severity of any injuries suffered by the persons involved in the offense.
 - J. Upon the filing of a complaint that alleges a violation of section [2919.25](#) of the revised code, the complainant may file, or if in an emergency the complainant is unable to file, a person who made the arrest for the alleged violation under section [2935.03](#) of the revised code may file on behalf of the complainant, a motion that requests the issuance of a temporary protection order as a pretrial condition of release of the alleged offender, in addition to any bail set under Criminal Rule 46.
 - K. Officers of the Lebanon Division of Police shall arrest, incarcerate and hold for bond any person found violating a temporary protection order or consent agreement in accordance with revised code section [2919.27](#).
 - L. The Lebanon Division of Police shall enforce a temporary protection order, issued by any court in this state, in accordance with the provisions of the order, including removing the defendant from the premises, regardless of whether the order is registered in the county in which the officer's agency has jurisdiction.
 - M. If an officer responds to a report of an alleged incident of the offense of domestic violence or violating a temporary protection order or consent agreement, and if the incident involved the use of or threatened use of a deadly weapon or any person involved in the incident brandished a deadly weapon during or in relation to the incident, the weapon constitutes contraband and the officer shall seize the deadly weapon as contraband and file the appropriate charge against the suspect. The weapon shall be forfeited in accordance with [2981.02](#) of the Ohio Revised Code.

- N. If the officer determines that there are reasonable grounds to believe that the offender caused or attempted to cause physical harm to another by means of a deadly weapon or dangerous ordnance, the officer shall arrest the offender for felonious or aggravated assault.
- O. Any officer that fails to follow the above procedures is subject to criminal and administrative action.
- P. Unborn children are protected and covered under Domestic Violence, O.R.C. [2919.25](#), Felonious Assault, O.R.C. [2903.11](#), and Aggravated Assault, O.R.C. [2903.12](#) as victims.

462.3.1 Emergency Response

- A. Response activities are any actions taken immediately before, during or after an emergency to save lives, minimize damage to property and increase the effectiveness of recovery efforts.

- B. Due to work schedules, the police division is the first responder in all emergencies. As a result, the police division is responsible for the activation of the emergency plan and will be in command until properly relieved.

I. POLICY

All agency employees are expected to respond to and stabilize situations that involve persons who are known to be or appear to be suffering from or experiencing a mental illness/disabilities related event. Officer safety and preserving the peace are the objectives but access to care and treatment are critical considerations when handling these types of calls for service.

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this directive is to outline the procedures when encountering persons known to be or appear to be suffering from mental illness/disabilities or persons in mental or emotional distress.

III. OBJECTIVES

- A. To provide guidelines for the recognition of persons suffering from mental illness
- B. To provide procedures for accessing available community mental health resources
- C. To provide guidelines for sworn officers when encountering persons they believe may be in emotional or mental distress
- D. To ensure that entry level training is conducted and documented for all agency personnel
- E. To ensure that refresher training is conducted and documented every three years.

IV. DEFINITIONS

- A. Crisis Intervention Team – Officers who have received specialized training to handle the complex issues relating to mental illness. In addition to performing their regular duties, CIT officers are called upon to respond to calls involving persons known to be or appear to be experiencing a mental health related event.
- B. Mental Illness – Substantial disorder of thought, mood, perception, orientation, or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behavior, capacity to recognize reality, or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life (**ORC 5122.01A**).
- C. Mentally Ill Person – A person subject to emergency hospitalization who, because of the person's illness (**ORC 5122.01B**):
 1. Represents a substantial risk of physical harm to themselves as manifested by evidence of threats of, or attempts at, suicide or serious self-inflicted bodily harm.
 2. Represents a substantial risk of physical harm to others as manifested by evidence of recent homicidal or other violent behavior and serious physical harm, or other evidence of present dangerousness.
 3. Represents a substantial and immediate risk of serious physical impairment or injury to themselves as manifested by evidence that the person is unable to provide for and is not providing for their basic physical needs because of his/her mental illness and that appropriate provision for such needs cannot be made immediately available in the community; or
 4. Would benefit from treatment in a hospital for his/her mental illness and needs such treatment as manifested by evidence of behavior that creates a grave and imminent risk to substantial rights of others or themselves.

V. PROCEDURE**A. Recognition (CALEA 41.2.7.a)**

1. Agency personnel may identify those subjects suffering from mental illnesses in the following ways:
 - a. Personal knowledge of the subject;
 - b. In-house reports indicating a history of mental illness;
 - c. Unusual or out of place behavior or speech;
 - d. Hallucinations;
 - e. Signs of panic, discomfort, confusion or anger.
2. During routine questioning of involved parties, an officer may inquire as to familiarization with mental health services provided by the Mental Health Recovery Board or other psychological services and/or psychotropic medications. Family and friends are also a source for information on mental illness. These may help to direct an officer as to the possibility of a mental illness or referral options when other indicators are not readily apparent.

B. Emergency Mental Illness

1. Communications Center
 - a. Obtain as much information as possible in relation to the call (i.e. suicidal, violent, injuries, weapons, suspect's behavior, medications, etc.)
 - b. CIT trained dispatchers may be used to attempt de-escalation prior to officer's arrival.
 - c. Any calls for service (CFS) involving or is suspected to involve someone with a mental illness, the on-scene call type will be updated to "EDP" to reflect and identify a mental illness call.
 - d. Two officers will be dispatched to EDP calls for service.
 - e. If a reported call involves a possible medical emergency, Lebanon Fire/EMS units should be dispatched to a staging area nearby to the scene, until that scene can be rendered or determined to be secure by the responding officers.

2. Responding Officers (**CALEA 41.2.7.c**)
 - a. It is the policy of the Lebanon Police Department to treat all citizens with respect. Responding officers must ensure that the safety of themselves and others, including the mentally ill, always remain their paramount concern.
 - b. Upon encountering a possible mental illness event the officer will investigate the circumstances to determine what further action is required.
 - c. If an officer believes an emergency mental illness exists (and they are not trained CIT), he/she should call for a CIT officer to respond to the scene, if available.
 - d. If the officer determines that the subject may not need hospitalization and the subject voluntarily complies, the officer may take the subject to the nearest hospital for a mental health prescreening. Whenever possible, officers should encourage the subject to voluntarily agree to a mental health screening.
 - e. If no criminal act has occurred and the officer has probable cause to believe the subject meets one or more of the criteria set forth in **ORC 5122.01B**, the officer may take the subject into involuntary custody under **ORC 5122.10**.
 - f. Anytime a subject, that meets at least one of the criteria set forth in **ORC 5122.01B** and is taken into involuntary custody under **ORC 5122.10**, the officer must complete the **Ohio Department of Mental Health Application for Emergency Admission form DMH-0025**. The original form must be turned over to the receiving facility staff. A copy will be submitted with the officer's incident report.
 - g. Use of arrest or other filing of criminal charges should only be used as a last resort. If the subject is arrested, they will be transported by the police department. The escorting officer must inform the receiving facility of the subject's mental illness to include risk of harm to self or others.
 - h. If the subject is suffering from an emergency medical condition, in addition to any mental health problems, they should be transported to the hospital by Lebanon Fire/EMS. Any further mental health screening or hospitalization will be handled at the hospital. It will remain the responsibility of the investigating officer to complete the **Ohio Department of Mental Health Application for Emergency Admission form DMH-0025**.
 - i. If the subject is intoxicated, it may be difficult/impossible to conduct a valid mental health screening. Therefore, intoxicated persons, whom the officer believes may be a threat to themselves or others, as **ORC 5122.01B** indicates, and has not committed a criminal offense, they may be transported to the Emergency Room at Bethesda Arrow Springs or Atrium Hospital, pursuant to **ORC 5122.10**. Upon arrival at the hospital, the subject should be secured in a room designated by the Hospital until they are able to be evaluated. At the discretion of the Shift Commander, an officer may remain at the hospital to assist hospital staff and security. Otherwise, the subject will be left in the care of the hospital security staff.
 - j. If the subject has been arrested and will be subjected to further hospitalization (beyond mental health screening) the officer should release the subject on bond or an unsecured appearance bond prior to the further hospitalization, whenever practical. If this is not possible, the subject should be transported to the hospital, and a holder should be faxed to that appropriate hospital.
 - k. The mere response by an officer to a situation involving a mentally disturbed person does not necessarily mean that further screening is needed. The officer should make the determination for further screening based on their assessment of the situation. If the subject is not a threat to themselves or others and is not willing to seek immediate follow-up treatment, the officer should advise the subject of the various services available to them, depending on their situation. Some of the resources include but are not limited to: (**CALEA 41.2.7.b**)
 - i. Crisis Hotline: (877) 695-6333

 - iii. Mobile Response & Stabilization Services: (877) 695-6333
 - iv. Veterans Crisis Line: (800) 273-8255, press 1
 - v. Suicide Prevention Coalition of WC: (513) 695-1695

3. Guidelines when interacting with suspected mentally ill person(s) in crisis:

- a. Immediate action must be taken to stabilize the situation. The responding officers should begin by attempting to reduce anxiety and prevent further disorientation so the person in crisis does not harm themselves or others
 - b. The officer should assume control, in order to provide the person in crisis with an orderly and structured environment, until he can regain control. The officer should project an image of stability and support. The officer should de-escalate the situation by reacting to the crisis in a calm manner.
 - c. Give clear directions, ask open-ended questions, and never make promises that you know cannot or might not be fulfilled. Do not reinforce psychosis by agreeing with delusional statements. Genuineness is an important part of gaining compliance and resolving the situation.
 - d. The officer should evaluate the situation totally to provide the officer and mental health professionals with information needed to make correct decisions. Any relevant questions regarding the crisis, including medications, doctor's names, and diagnosis are appropriate in determining the best course of action.
 - e. Once the crisis has been stabilized and the level of response determined by the officer, then appropriate referrals should be made for follow-up, depending on the situation.
4. Transports
- a. Mentally ill persons not undergoing a medical emergency are permitted to be transported by the police department to facilities inside and outside of city limits at the discretion of the Shift Commander.
 - b. If the subject is suffering from an emergency medical condition, in addition to any mental health problems, they may be transported to the hospital by Lebanon Fire/EMS if transport is warranted. Any further mental health screening or hospitalization will be handled from the hospital.
 - c. Any patient that has been administered any medication that alters level of consciousness or has a potential adverse reaction will not be transported by the Lebanon Police Department. These individuals will need observation from trained medical professionals and may be transported by Lebanon Fire/EMS if transport is warranted.
 - d. An officer may be requested by Lebanon Fire/EMS personnel to ride along or escort the transport in case of a potentially violent patient.
5. Documentation
- a. At the conclusion of a call involving a mentally disturbed, suicidal, or person in crisis, the encounter will be documented on an incident report, under a "Mental Health Evaluation Hold" in the Record Management System (RMS). If the situation involves more than one possible event type, the officer should select the most appropriate options.
 - b. Completed reports involving U.S. Armed Forces Veterans displaying indicators of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder or PTSD will be processed as follows:
 - i. The records division will forward a redacted copy of the approved report to the Warren County Veterans Service Office.
 - ii. Officers are encouraged to provide individuals displaying indicators of PTSD with a referral to the Veterans Crisis Line at (800) 273-8255, press 1 or Confidential Chat at VeteransCrisisLine.net
6. Training
- a. All sworn officers will receive generalized training on dealing with the Mentally Disturbed as part of their initial certification through the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy **(CALEA 41.2.7.d)**
 - b. All sworn officers will receive additional training, outlining procedures and resources specific to the City of Lebanon and Warren County as part of their initial Field Training Program **(CALEA 41.2.7.d)**.
 - c. Officers may also receive additional training to become a Crisis Intervention Team Member, based on either their voluntary willingness to do so or based on their individual attributes, as selected by this Department.
 - d. All employees will receive annual refresher training. **(CALEA 41.2.7.e)**
 - e. Non-sworn personnel will receive training as part of their initial training program. **(CALEA 41.2.7.d)**

1.2.5 Arrest Procedures (CALEA 1.2.5)

- A. *There are two types of arrest that an officer can make:*
1. *An arrest with a warrant.*
 2. *An arrest without a warrant.*
- B. *A law enforcement officer may arrest any individual with a warrant. The officer should insure that the person named in the warrant is the same individual to be arrested. This can usually be accomplished by comparing the social security number and/or date of birth that is on the warrant with the individual.*
- C. *The Ohio Revised Code states that any law enforcement officer may arrest without a warrant under the following conditions:*
1. *The officer witnesses the offense whether it is a misdemeanor or a felony.*
 2. *The offense is not witnessed, but is an act of violence, a felony, an offense of criminal enticement, public indecency, domestic violence, aggravated trespass, a theft offense or a felony drug offense.*
- D. *If an arrest is made without a warrant, the suspect must be informed of the officer's authority to make the arrest and the cause of the arrest. This does not apply if the person is engaged in the commission of a criminal offense.*
1. *The officer will, without unnecessary delay, take the suspect before a court or magistrate having jurisdiction of the offense, and shall file or cause to be filed an affidavit describing the offense for which the person was arrested.*
 2. *If the suspect is incarcerated, the affidavit must be filed and served upon the suspect within forty-eight hours of the arrest. (Riverside Co. V. McLaughlin)*
- E. *The arresting officer shall complete the following on all arrests before the end of their shift.*
1. *Arrest Report will be completed on arrests whether incarcerated or not. This includes minor misdemeanor citations.*
 2. *Photographs will be taken of individuals physically arrested. Juveniles will only be photographed in accordance with **O.R.C. 2151.313**. The photograph will consist of at least a head on picture from the bottom of the neck up. The individual will not be wearing any type of headgear (hats, scarves, etc.), will be looking forward with their hands down to their sides.*
 3. *Fingerprints will be obtained from all individuals physically arrested. Juveniles will only be fingerprinted in accordance with **O.R.C. 2151.313**.*

GENERAL ORDER

Policy Number: GO-11.3-2022

Subject: Authority and Responsibility

Keywords: Supervisory Control, Command Notification, Serious Injury or Death, Officer Involved Shooting Incident

CALEA Standards: 11.3.1-4

I. **Supervisory Control (11.3.1-2)**

- A. Each position in the Lebanon Division of Police is accompanied by commensurate authority for the effective execution of their responsibility.
- B. Each employee will be held accountable for the use of his or her delegated authority.
- C. In order to achieve effective direction, coordination and control, all supervisory personnel shall be held accountable for the performance of each employee under their immediate supervision. This order shall apply to each level of supervision within the police division.

II. **Command Notification (11.3.3)**

- A. Whenever there is an incident where there may be a question as to the police division's liability or may result in a heightened community interest the Shift Commander when available, will notify the Operations Bureau Captain and/or Chief of Police of the incident. The Chief of Police or designee will be responsible for notifying city administration.
- B. An incident of police liability or heightened community interest may include but shall not be limited to:
 - 1. Death or serious injury of a police employee.
 - 2. Death or serious injury of an individual as a result of police action or non-action.
 - 3. Any homicide.
 - 4. Deployment of the Warren County Tactical Response Unit in the City of Lebanon.
 - 5. Aggravated or serious felony offense.
 - 6. Tier 2 complaint involving alleged criminal misconduct or a violation of a criminal offense by anyone employed by the police agency (**General Order 52**).
 - 7. Where there has been a media inquiry or presence.
- C. At the earliest possible time, but before the end of the shift, the Shift Commander will forward an incident report to Operations Bureau Captain and the Chief of Police.

III. Serious Physical Injury/Death and Officer Involved Shooting Incidents (11.3.4)

- A. It is the policy of the Lebanon Police Department that when police action results in serious injury or death, or an officer discharges a firearm at another person, a thorough and transparent investigation will be completed in the interest of seeking justice and maintaining public trust. Involved officers and civilians alike will be treated with dignity and respect throughout the process.
- B. It is the purpose of this policy to establish operational and administrative protocols that will be initiated in the event of an officer-involved shooting or other police action that results in serious injury or death.

C. Definitions:

- 1. **Serious Physical Injury:** Any physical harm that; carries a substantial risk of death, involves some permanent incapacity whether partial or total, involves some temporary or substantial incapacity, involves some permanent disfigurement, involves some temporary serious disfigurement, involves acute pain of such duration as to result in substantial suffering, or involves any degree of prolonged or intractable pain. As defined in section **2901.01 "General Provisions Definitions" of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC).**
- 2. **Officer-Involved Shooting (OIS)** – The intentional discharge of a firearm by a police officer directed at another person, regardless of whether or not injury occurs.

D. Initial Response:

- 1. Personnel responding to a serious injury/death or OIS incident should immediately undertake the following actions:
 - a. Preserve and protect the lives of all involved parties; and
 - b. Seek to apprehend outstanding suspects involved in the incident; and
 - c. Locate and separate witnesses to ensure independent statements; and
 - d. Preserve the scene through appropriate measures and document items that may change or degrade prior to the arrival of trained evidence technician.
- 2. Responding officers should understand that these serious incidents will be highly examined by the judicial system as well as the public. As such, officers are reminded to remain professional at all times and limit on scene conversation to

that which is necessary to accomplish the tasks at hand. The inadvertent recording of opinions, conjecture or other unnecessary discussion could potentially jeopardize or negatively impact the outcome of any investigation or prosecution arising from the incident.

3. Officers directly involved in a serious injury/death or OIS incident may be asked a series of questions by the responding supervisor(s) in order to establish the level of danger that may still exist, aid in the effort to locate suspects and focus the initial stage of the investigation. Due to the need for officer and citizen safety, these "Public Safety Statements" may be immediately compelled by a supervisor without waiting for the involved officer's attorney. Questions and related public safety statements may include:
 - a. Type of force used by the officer
 - b. Threat presented by suspect(s) or other parties
 - c. Direction and number of shots fired by the officer or suspect(s)
 - d. Location of any weapons
 - e. Location of any injured persons
 - f. Suspect description and mode/direction of travel, time elapsed since they fled, and weapons that were available to them
 - g. Description and location of any known witnesses or victims
 - h. Any other information that will ensure public safety and assist in apprehension of the suspect(s)
4. Prior to ending their tour of duty, the supervisor initiating questioning under this directive will document the responses of the officer as part of the administrative investigation.
5. An officer may not refuse to answer public safety questions under this policy. Any officer refusing to answer questions under this policy will be subject to discipline up to and including termination.

E. Investigations

1. At the direction of the Chief of Police or designee, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation or the Warren County Sheriff's Office will be requested to investigate any serious injury/death or officer involved shooting incident involving a Lebanon Police Department employee as it relates to criminal allegations. **(11.3.4a)**

- a. Upon the completion of the investigation, the associated reports and investigative details will be submitted to the Warren County Prosecutor's Office for review; and
- b. The Warren County Prosecutor's Office will determine whether the officer's actions were lawful or unlawful, and whether to initiate criminal action against officer(s) whose actions are deemed unlawful.
(11.3.4c)

2. An internal investigation will be conducted by the Operations Bureau Captain as designated by the chief of police. This investigation will be conducted in accordance with **General Order 52 (Administrative Investigation of Complaints)**. At no time will the internal investigation undertake actions that have the potential to interfere with an ongoing criminal investigation into the incident.
(11.3.4b)

F. Public Information Plan **(11.3.4d)**

1. The chief of police assisted by the public information officer (PIO) will collaborate with the appropriate officials from the agency conducting the criminal investigation and the Warren County Prosecutor's Office in order to provide important information to the public as appropriate.
 - a. The names of officers and citizens involved will generally be made public within a timely manner of an incident barring a necessary delay due to family notifications, safety concerns, investigative processes, or other articulable cause.
 - b. Photographic and/or video evidence, to include body camera and in-car camera footage, will be released to the public on a case-by-case basis with the understanding that investigative and prosecutorial integrity will always outweigh the strong desire to be transparent to the public. Once all investigative and prosecutorial authorities conclude that public release of evidence will not jeopardize ongoing investigations, the evidence will be released at the discretion of the chief of police in accordance with the law.
 - c. At the conclusion of a criminal investigation into an incident involving serious injury or death, the chief of police in conjunction with the prosecutor's office will make a public statement detailing the findings and any actions to be taken.

G. Administrative Assignment/Counseling

1. Department personnel directly involved in an OIS or other action taken in an official capacity which results in death or serious injury will be placed on administrative assignment for a period of time designated by the chief of police pending an administrative review (**General Order 52**). This assignment will not result in loss of pay or benefits pending the results of an investigation and will not be in a position or role that will expose the employee to contact with the public. The assignment will not be interpreted to imply or indicate that the department member acted improperly. Police powers may be suspended during this administrative assignment at the discretion of the chief of police.
2. An officer on administrative assignment under this policy may not be returned to active police duties until a criminal investigation has been completed and the prosecutor's office has determined that the officer's actions were lawful and not subject to prosecution. This information will be detailed in a formal declination letter which will be supplied to the officer involved and maintained in the administrative investigation file.
3. Department personnel (sworn or non-sworn) directly involved in an OIS or other action taken in an official capacity which results in serious injury/death must be evaluated by the department's designated psychologist as soon as practical after the incident and at no cost to the employee. The employee will then meet again with the department psychologist prior to returning to normally assigned duties (**General Order 52**). Additional counseling will be provided free of charge at the discretion of the officer and department psychologist. All meetings with the department psychologist prescribed above are mandatory and intended to ensure the health and well-being of the employee.
4. Counseling provided by the Lebanon Police Department, **General Order 22.2.6 (Employee Assistance Program)** will be available to all department personnel (sworn or non-sworn) indirectly or directly involved in an OIS or serious injury/death incident.

H. OIS Weapon Replacement

1. OIS incidents require that the firearm(s) used in the incident be seized for investigative purposes. The firearm(s) are considered evidence and can be held by investigators or courts for lengthy periods of time.
2. In the case of an agency owned firearm being seized during an OIS investigation, the following protocols will occur:

- a. At the discretion of the chief of police or designee, the quartermaster will issue a replacement firearm to the involved officer(s).
 - b. If the departmental weapon involved is a patrol rifle, shotgun, or firearm other than the standard issued handgun, the weapon will be replaced as needed.
3. Nothing in this policy prevents an officer continuing to carry a personally owned and departmentally approved "off-duty" firearm so long as their qualification with the weapon is current and their police powers or departmental authorization to carry are not suspended.

I. Training **(11.3.4f)**

1. Both sworn and non-sworn personnel will receive awareness training as to the departmental process of handling an OIS or other incident that results in serious bodily injury or death. As needed, training will be provided for agency personnel who are responsible for managing such incidents.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this general order is to establish guidelines and policies to govern the authorization of weapons along with the safety and training required to use them.

POLICY

Only those lethal and less weapons issued and owned by the Lebanon Police Division shall be carried on duty. The Chief of Police shall authorize all weapons for use by the Lebanon Police Division.

The legal authority for Lebanon Police Officers to carry weapons and the training requirements is found within [ORC 109.801](#). **(1.2.2, 4.3.1)**.

A. Authorization: Lethal Weapons (1.2.2, 4.3.1a-b) – The following are the only lethal weapons authorized for use on duty by the Lebanon Police Division.

1. Glock Model 17 or 19 (9mm) Handgun:
 - a. The model 17 or 19 is the primary weapon issued to each individual officer.
 - b. The handgun will be loaded with jacketed hollow-point ammunition
 - c. Officers will ensure that their weapon is fully loaded with one round in the chamber.

2. Glock Model 43 (9mm) Handgun:
 - a. The model 43 is the back-up weapon issued to each individual officer.
 - b. The model 43 will be carried fully loaded with jacketed hollow-point ammunition.
 - c. Any officer wishing to carry in a backup capacity must show proficiency annually with the weapon and holster (i.e. ankle holster, vest holster) that will be carried on duty.

- d. Any holster used in a backup capacity must be approved by the Chief of Police or his designee.

3. Lethal Shotgun:

- a. The duty shotgun for the Lebanon Police Division is the Remington 870 Police Magnum 12ga pump shotgun.
- b. The purpose of the shotgun is as a secondary weapon for the patrol officer in situations where more stopping power may be necessary.
- c. Each patrol cruiser will be equipped with the lethal shotgun carried in a secure gun rack.
- d. For duty use, the shotgun will be loaded with 6 rounds of OO buck shot ammunition, the chamber will be empty, the trigger will be pulled, and the safety will be on.
- e. 6 additional rounds of OO buck shot ammunition will be stored in each patrol vehicle.
- f. The training / range round for the shotgun will be the duty OO buck shot or may be substituted with birdshot.

4. Patrol Rifle:

- a. The patrol rifle for the Lebanon Police Division will be the Rock River AR-15 (semiautomatic rifle) and the Rock River M4 (select fire) rifle for tactical team members and specialized qualified officers.
- b. The primary purpose of the patrol rifle is to be used in situations requiring more accurate and controlled shot placement such as on perimeters, in support the tactical response team, hostage/barricaded situations, active shooters, or at the request of the shift commander.
- c. Each patrol cruiser will be equipped with a rifle carried in a secure gun rack. The rifle will have a magazine loaded with 28 rounds inserted in the magazine well. The chamber will be empty, and the weapon will be on safe.
- d. For duty use, the weapon will be loaded with 5.56mm 55gr ballistic tip ammunition.
- e. Each patrol cruiser will have two additional magazines loaded with 28 rounds of 5.56mm 55gr ballistic tip ammunition each. These extra magazines will be stored in each patrol vehicle.
- f. The training ammunition for the rifle will be 5.56mm 55gr full metal jacketed round.

B. Authorization: Less Lethal Weapons – The following are the only less lethal weapons authorized for use on duty by the Lebanon Police Division. **(1.2.2, 4.3.1a-b, GO-4.1-21)**

1. **Oleoresin Capsicum (OC):**

- a. The 10% oleoresin capsicum (OC) agent is authorized for use when a person is actively resisting arrest, attempting to evade arrest by flight, or otherwise assaultive/combatative actions. Officers must use care to ensure they do not direct the stream of spray directly into a person's eye at close range due to the intense pressure of the stream. In addition, the use of OC in crowded or enclosed areas is discouraged due to the effects to persons in close proximity to the exposure.
 - b. The OC spray will only be used by trained employees in a manner consistent with current training protocols.
2. **Expandable Baton:**
- a. The expandable baton is authorized for use primarily as a defensive weapon. Striking a suspect with a baton is presumed reasonable when an officer is protecting himself/herself or others from an assault or attempted assault. The authorized expandable baton is an ASP baton.
 - b. The ASP will only be used by a trained employee in a manner consistent with current training protocols.
3. **Conducted Energy Weapon (CEW):**
- a. The CEW is authorized for use in probe or "drive stun" mode by those officers trained and certified in its use. The CEW is used to control or otherwise subdue a person who is actively resisting arrest (including threatening violence or potentially violent behavior), attempting to evade arrest/flight, assaultive/combatative, or engaging in self-destructive behavior. The authorized CEW is a TASER X2.
 - b. The employee should attempt to avoid hitting the subject in sensitive tissue areas such as the head, face, neck, groin, or female breast areas.
 - c. Probes penetrating these areas will only be removed by medical personnel.
 - d. Trained employees may remove probes that are embedded in other parts of the subject's skin in accordance with current training protocols.
 - e. The EMD shall not be used:
 - 1) When the officer knows a subject has come in contact with flammable liquids or is in a flammable atmosphere.
 - 2) Punitively for purposes of coercion, or in an unjustified manner.
 - 3) To escort or jab an individual.
 - 4) To awaken unconscious or intoxicated individuals.
 - f. The EMD shall not be used in the following circumstances (unless there are compelling reasons to do so which can be clearly articulated.)
 - 1) When a person is handcuffed.
 - 2) When the subject is holding a firearm.
 - 3) When the subject is on an elevated surface.
 - 4) In swimming pools or bodies of water.

- 5) When the subject is at the extremes of age (younger than 10 and older than 70).
- 6) When the subject is physically disabled.
- 7) When a subject is visibly pregnant.
- 8) In any situation where deadly force is clearly justifiable, unless another officer is present and capable of providing deadly force to the officers or civilians as necessary.

g. Maintenance:

- 1) At the beginning of each shift, the officer will conduct a spark check and check the battery display on the weapon to verify the operability of the EMD.
- 2) The spark test should be completed outside the public view in accordance with training protocols.
- 3) Any discrepancies in the spark check, the weapon's function or if the weapon displays less than 20% battery level, the EMD shall be turned into a certified Taser instructor for service.
- 4) The EMD will never be stored more than 48 hours without the battery pack attached.
- 5) When off-duty, the EMD must be stored and secured in a climate-controlled area, not in a vehicle.

h. Evidence collection:

- 1) Photographs should be taken of the where the probes penetrated as well as any other injuries that may occurred as a result of the use of force.
- 2) The EMD is submitted to a Taser Instructor so that the data can be downloaded from the weapon. The downloaded data will be included with the use of force report.

4. **Less Lethal Shotgun:**

- a. The less lethal shotgun is authorized for use as a less lethal alternative to apprehending a violent/or resistant suspect while maintaining officer safety. Utilizing the less lethal shotgun is reasonable when an officer is protecting himself/herself or others from an assault or attempted assault. The authorized less lethal shotgun is a Remington shotgun with an orange stock and kinetic "beanbag" rounds.
- b. The less lethal kinetic round has an optimal effective range of 20 to 50 feet with a maximum effective range of 75 feet.
- c. The less lethal shotgun will only be used by trained employees in a manner consistent with current training protocols. Officers must demonstrate proficiency in order to be authorized to use this weapon.
- d. The projectile round should be delivered to the following areas: Arms, legs, buttocks.

- e. Kinetic round will not be aimed at the head, neck, groin, or abdomen unless deadly force is justified.
- f. When utilizing the less lethal shotgun, the officers should inform all officers that less lethal option is being utilized.
- g. The officer should have another officer cover them with a lethal weapon should the officer possessing the less lethal shotgun encounter lethal resistance.
- h. No more than (2) beanbag rounds may be deployed simultaneously on an individual.
- i. If four (4) rounds prove to be ineffective, the officer should consider other options.
- j. The subject will be immediately transported to the nearest hospital for a medical evaluation.
- k. Evidence collection:
 - 1) The officer accompanying the subject will photograph the impact area.

5. Less lethal procedures:

- a. Less lethal weapons are not a substitute for deadly force.
- b. Employees shall not simultaneously hold a less-lethal weapon and firearm.
- c. Less lethal weapons shall not be used to gain compliance over subjects who are not presenting an immediate, credible threat to the safety of the officer or the public.
- d. Verbal commands shall be given before, when practical, and after the use of less lethal weapons to warn the subject to cease their actions and to instruct the individual on what they should do to comply. (Deorle vs. Rutherford)

C. Off Duty Weapons Authorization (1.2.2, 4.3.1)

- 1. Officers are permitted to carry firearms off duty.
- 2. Any handgun issued by the Lebanon Police Division is authorized for off duty carry.
 - a. The weapon will be carried fully loaded.
 - b. The weapon will be loaded with department issued jacketed hollow-point ammunition.
- 3. Any officer wishing to carry a different semi-automatic handgun off duty must have the weapon approved by the Chief of Police or his designee.
 - a. The officer will submit a written request to the Chief of Police that will include the Make / Model / Serial number of the weapon along with the ammunition that will be carried in the weapon.

- b. Any officer wishing to carry a revolver off duty must have the weapon approved and must qualify annually with the weapon.
4. Sections 1, 2 and 3 only apply to officers carrying a firearm under the Law Enforcement Safety Act.

D. Tactical Weapons Authorization (1.2.2, 4.3.1)

1. All division personnel assigned to the Warren County Tactical Response Unit are authorized, with appropriate training and supervision, to use weapons provided by entities other than our agency in the course of their training and operational necessities.
2. The Warren County Tactical Response Unit Policy Board authorizes weapons, ammunitions, equipment, and necessary training proficiencies.

E. Weapon Maintenance (4.1.4, 4.3.1)

1. Officers will keep all authorized weapons clean and in good working condition by regularly inspecting the weapon and performing routine care and maintenance. Weapons will be taken out of service immediately if malfunctioning, unsafe, or deficient. Assigned Supervisor will be notified immediately by the officer about the deficiency.
2. Department issued lethal and non-lethal weapons will be inspected by a qualified weapons instructor or armorer prior to issuance to an officer. (4.3.1c)
3. All rifles and shotguns, to include less lethal shotguns, will be inspected at least annually by a weapons instructor or armorer. (4.3.1c)
4. Any on-duty or off-duty lethal and non-lethal weapon declared unsafe or defective during inspections will be removed from service immediately until restored to proper operating condition. (4.3.1d)
5. Agency lethal and less-lethal weapons instructors will maintain a record, or each weapon approved by the department for official use. (4.3.1e)
6. Each officer is issued a trigger safety lock for each weapon they are issued and a locker. It is the responsibility of the officer to secure their weapon when not in use. (4.3.1f)
7. Any weapon not issued will be secured in Armory.

F. Demonstrating Proficiency with Weapons (4.3.2)

1. It shall be the policy of the Lebanon Police Division that only those employees demonstrating proficiency in the use of the agency approved weapons be approved to carry such weapons. This intent of this policy is to cover both on and off duty and lethal and less than lethal weapons.
 - a. Demonstrating proficiency includes achieving minimum qualifying scores on a prescribed course. The employee will also be required to demonstrate a knowledge of the laws concerning the use of authorized weapons and knowledge of agency policy and procedures on the use of force, escalating force, and deadly force. This will be accomplished through annual training.

G. Weapons Training (4.3.3)

1. It shall be the policy of the Lebanon Police Division that employees authorized to carry weapons will receive annual in-service training in which they must demonstrate proficiency.
 - a. Demonstrating proficiency includes achieving minimum qualifying scores on a prescribed course. The employee will also be required to demonstrate a knowledge of the laws concerning the use of authorized weapons and knowledge of agency policy and procedures on the use of force, escalating force, and deadly force.
 - b. Each sworn officer will qualify at least once a year with the shotgun using lethal ammunition.
 - c. Each sworn officer will qualify at least once a year with the shotgun using less-lethal (Kinetic) ammunition.
 - d. Each sworn officer will qualify once a year with the rifle.
 - e. Each sworn officer will qualify once a year with their handgun.
 - f. Tactical response team members will qualify in compliance with Warren County Tactical Response Unit policy.
 - g. Any time that an officer changes duty weapons, they will qualify with that weapon prior to be authorized to carry it.
 - h. Additional training courses of fire will occur throughout the year on firearms as deemed necessary by the Range Officer and Training Officer.
 - i. Each officer will also be required to receive annual training on the baton, chemical agent and EMD by a certified instructor.
 - j. The EMD qualification shall consist of firing a minimum of one (1) cartridge.
 - k. Each employee will be required to receive annual training in unarmed defensive tactics.
2. The Range Officer in charge of the firearms qualifications will score the qualifying targets and forward such scores to the Training Officer for inclusion in the officer's training record.
 - a. Only targets approved by the Ohio Peace Officer's Training Council will be used for firearms qualifications.
 - b. The scoring of targets will be in compliance with the Ohio Peace Officer's Training Council.

3. At least annually, each employee shall receive in-service training on the police division's Use of Force policy.
4. All proficiency training and qualifications must be monitored by a certified weapons/tactics instructor and be documented in the employee's training file. **(4.3.3b)**
5. Any employee not passing weapons qualification/proficiency shall be required to attend a training session with the range officer/weapon instructor prior to requalifying. Any employee that fails to qualify or pass training will not be permitted to carry the weapon(s) until they have qualified. **(4.3.3c)**

H. Uses of Force Policy Distribution (4.3.4)

1. It shall be the policy of the Lebanon Division of Police that all sworn personnel receive instruction in, the policies and procedures described in section **GO-4.1-2021** before being authorized to carry any weapon. The instruction and issuance shall be documented in the **Recruit Training Checklist**.
 - a. All police policies and procedures are available through Power DMS.

I. Firearms Range Authorization (4.3.5)

1. This policy is to provide guidelines for all authorized firearm ranges utilized by the Lebanon Police Department. The authorized ranges include Spring Valley Shooting Range, Franklin Police Department, Warren County Sheriff's Office, and the Butler Tech Campus. The policy is designed to specify procedures for the safe and productive use of the range and applies to all sworn members of the Lebanon Police Department
2. The use of these firearm ranges is a privilege afforded to our agency/officers to facilitate practice, training, and qualification in an effort to provide them with the highest firearms proficiency possible. Officers are required to maintain the highest levels and standards of safety. **(4.3.5.a)**
3. Authority, Chain of Command and Responsibilities - The Support Services Captain will select a Range Master for the firearm range. This will be an agency member who is an Ohio Police Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) approved Firearms Instructor. The Range Master will act as the range supervisor during all times when the range is in use. **(4.3.5.c)**
4. Any appointed Range Master, and any appointed Firearms Instructor will be required to successfully obtain certification as a firearms instructor, as required by the OPOTC, to include emergency medical response training emphasizing

field treatment for the type of injuries that may potentially occur during firearms training. (4.3.5.f)

5. The Support Services Captain will be responsible for the following:
 - a. Supervision of the training section, Range Master, and Firearms Instructors.
 - b. Ensure all instructors are certified to perform their individual assignments.
 - c. Ensure Range Master and all firearms instructors have a trauma kit readily assessable and are prepared for an emergency medical response reference field treatment for types of injuries which may potentially occur during firearms training.
 - d. Oversight of range operations.

6. The Range Master will be responsible for the following (4.3.5.c):
 - a. Organizing practice, training, and qualification sessions for the range.
 - b. Developing courses of fire and scoring systems.
 - c. Confirm records are maintained for all firearms authorized to be carried by agency personnel and their qualification dates. Pass/fail scores will be recorded by a firearms instructor for each firearm.
 - d. Ensure remedial training is provided for officers who fail to achieve a passing score during mandatory training with firearms or for employees identified by his/her supervisor as needing remedial training.
 - e. Ensuring all safety standards for the use of the gun range are met.
 - f. Ensuring all supplies are available for use (e.g., targets, target devices, protective wear, first aid equipment,) and any other items to ensure the safe and productive operation of the training facility.
 - g. Preparing reports concerning firearms training and range use, as required; and
 - h. Other duties as designated by the Support Services Captain.

7. Firearms Instructors will be responsible for the following:
 - a. Assisting the Range Master with gun range use and firearms as requested.
 - b. Ensure all safety standards during the use of the gun range are met.
 - c. Ensure his/her instructor certification is maintained during such service.
 - d. Ensure emergency medical response training is completed annually, which should emphasize field treatment for the types of injuries which may potentially occur during firearms training.
 - e. Provide remedial training for officers who fail to achieve a passing score during mandatory training with firearms or for employees identified by his/her supervisor as needing remedial training.
 - f. Confirm records are maintained for all firearms authorized to be carried by agency personnel and their qualification dates. Pass/fail scores will be recorded by a firearms instructor for each firearm.

- g. Maintaining a working knowledge of changes and improvements in weapons, ammunition, and other equipment.
 - h. Stay informed of statutory and case law as it relates to firearms training.
 - i. Advise the Range Master of any problems, special circumstances, and unusual situations which occur at the range; and
 - j. Other duties as designated by the Range Master or Support Services Captain.
8. Agency personnel utilizing an approved range/training facility will be responsible for the following:
- a. Will be required to following all range/training facility rules and regulations.
 - b. Disposing of any trip hazards, spent shell casings, used targets and trash.
 - c. Return of training aides, equipment, targets, protective gear, and any other items utilized to their original condition and placement.
 - d. Reporting any damage or hazardous conditions to instructors; and
 - e. Reporting any injury sustained while utilizing the range.
 - f. Department members are required to wear protective safety gear to include body armor and eye/hearing protection (informally known as eyes and ears).
(4.3.5.e)
9. Authorized and Prohibited Weapons and Ammunition **(4.3.5.d)**
- a. Weapons and ammunition authorized to be utilized at the firearms range, are generally limited to:
 - 1) Handguns, rifles, and shotguns issued by this agency.
 - 2) Handguns, rifles, and shotguns approved by the agency, and used for the purposes of off-duty defense or secondary weapons.
 - 3) Handguns, rifles, and shotguns of similar caliber and gauge to those approved by the agency.
 - 4) Other approved less-lethal weapons with authorization from the tactical team commander and/or the team leader.
 - b. Weapons Prohibited:
 - 1) Any weapon or device designed to shoot or throw any explosive devices, projectiles, or ordnance; and
 - 2) Any weapon or device which would cause avoidable damage to any portion of the gun range, or risk avoidable injury by its use.
 - c. Ammunition Prohibited:
 - 1) Any rifle ammunition greater than .556/.223 caliber.
 - 2) Ammunition designed, or has any potential to penetrate armor, concrete, or steel.

- 3) Explosive devices, projectiles, or ordnance;
 - 4) Any ammunition or projectile which would cause avoidable damage to any portion of the gun range, or risk avoidable injury by its use.
10. Only authorized weapons, ammunition, equipment, and targets will be permitted for use on the range. The Range Master, in conjunction with the Support Services Captain, will determine what equipment will be authorized. **(4.3.5.d)**
11. The Range Master will transport and distribute ammunition for use at the firearms range. Agency personnel will transport weapons to the range in his/her vehicle for use at the range.
12. Regulations Regarding Storage of Ammunition and Weapons Ammunition will be stored in the ammunition armory located at the Lebanon Police Department. The Support Services Captain or designee will approve all ammunition being used at the firearms range. **(4.3.5.g)**
13. Operation and Maintenance of the Range:
 - a. The firearms range may be used only by those persons expressly authorized by the Support Services Captain or the Range Master.
 - b. At no time will anyone be allowed to use the facility without the presence of an agency Range Master and/or a Firearms Instructor or designee on the property.
 - c. The agency is responsible for providing an instructor/student ratio adequate for safe and effective training.
 - d. Ammunition will be available for shooters.
 - e. All users will strictly adhere to the range safety rules.
14. Range Attire:
 - a. Range safety and authentic training requires the use of agency provided duty equipment and uniform, or equipment and clothing similar to or resembling that of actual duty equipment and uniform.
 - b. The Range Master will provide equipment and clothing instructions for each scheduled firing range training. The Range Master will have final approval on equipment and clothing requirements for each firing range training event.
15. Range Safety Procedures and Firing Line Rules - All safety procedures and range rules will be reviewed and documented on the attendance log, prior to every training event held at the range. It is the responsibility of the Range Master and each firearms instructor to ensure agency personnel follow the rules. Department members must follow Lebanon Police Procedures and Range Rules. **(4.3.5.b)**

Range Safety Procedures:

- a. All firearms training must be properly and adequately supervised by approved range masters.
- b. Strict discipline must be maintained. Carelessness will not be tolerated.
- c. Never point a firearm at anyone unless compatible with deadly force guidelines.
- d. Treat all firearms as if they are loaded.
- e. Never leave a loaded weapon unattended.
- f. Immediately upon picking up a firearm, check to see if it's loaded.
- g. Never give a firearm to or take a firearm from anyone unless the cylinder or action is open, and the weapon is unloaded.
- h. Never draw the weapon from or return it to the holster with the finger on the trigger.
- i. Eye and ear protection is mandatory and will be worn at all times when on the range.
- j. Body armor will be worn while the firearms range is in use.
- k. Weapons will be kept in holsters or gun boxes unless the shooter is on the firing line, or unless the cylinder is out or the action open and the weapon unloaded.
- l. All injuries will be reported to the firearms instructor or supervisor on duty.
- m. Shooters will only use ammunition and targets authorized by policy and the training section.

Firing Line Procedures:

- a. Carelessness and horseplay is prohibited.
- b. No talking on the firing line, except by or to the instructors.
- c. Keep all firearms pointed down range at all times.
- d. Never put your finger on the trigger until ready to fire the weapon.
- e. Load and unload as instructed on the firing line.
- f. Do not anticipate commands.
- g. Never go in front of the firing line until the line has been declared safe and the command has been given.
- h. No person shall advance forward of the firing line until the line has been declared clear and safe by a range officer.
- i. The firing line will be considered safe by the range officer when all weapons are unloaded or holstered.
- j. Cease fire should be called by ANYONE who observes an unsafe condition
- k. Shooters will only shoot from designated areas.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this general order is to establish guidelines governing the use of force by the officers of the Lebanon Division of Police, to delineate the Department's policy regarding the use of deadly force, and to establish policies under which the use of deadly force by officers is permissible.

DEFINITIONS

1. **Force:** The physical response by an officer or officers to the resistance and/or aggression of one or more subjects in order to gain control of the subject(s) for detention or arrest. Any use of force must be objectively reasonable based on the totality of the circumstances known to the officer(s) at the time of the incident.
2. **Objectively Reasonable:** In determining the appropriate response to the subject(s) resistance/aggression, officers shall evaluate each situation in light of the circumstances known at the time of the incident, including but not limited to: the severity of the crime at issue, whether the subject poses an immediate threat to the safety of officers or others, and whether the subject is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight.
3. **Deadly Force:** Any force that carries a substantial risk that it will proximately result in the death of any person. As defined in section 2901.01 "General Provisions Definitions" of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC).
4. **Less Lethal Force:** Any use of force other than that which is considered Lethal Force.
5. **Serious Physical Injury:** Any physical harm that; carries a substantial risk of death, involves some permanent incapacity whether partial or total, involves some temporary or substantial incapacity, involves some permanent disfigurement, involves some temporary serious disfigurement, involves acute pain of such duration as to result in substantial suffering, or involves any

degree of prolonged or intractable pain. As defined in section 2901.01 "General Provisions Definitions" of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC).

POLICY (4.1.1, 1-7)

A. Use of Force Policy (4.1.1)

1. Lebanon Officers may only use the amount of force that is objectively reasonable to effectively accomplish lawful objectives, including the following: affecting a lawful arrest or overcoming resistance to a lawful arrest, preventing the escape of a suspect or arrestee, or to protect or defend others or themselves from physical harm.
 - a. The decision to use force "requires careful attention to the facts and circumstances of each particular case, including the severity of the crime at issue, whether the suspects poses an immediate threat to the safety of the officer or others, and whether he is actively resisting arrest or attempting to evade arrest by flight." *Graham v. Connor, U.S. 386 (1989)*.
2. The level of response is determined by the officer who assesses the action by the subject, including the level of threat posed to the officer in order to determine the appropriate response based on the guidelines from case law, such as *Graham v. Connor* and *Tennessee v. Garner*, and this policy.
3. In the event an officer uses an improvised technique, tactic, and/or weapon in a use of force situation, this type of use of force must be objectively reasonable for the situation based on the totality of the circumstances known to the officer(s) at the time of the incident.
4. Only officers specifically trained and certified by this agency and authorized by law to effect an arrest are authorized to use lethal or less lethal weapons.

B. Use of Deadly Force (4.1.2) – Officers are authorized to use deadly force when it is objectively reasonable under the totality of the circumstances. Use of deadly force is justified when one or both of the following apply:

1. To protect the officer or others from what is reasonably believed to be an immediate threat of death or serious bodily injury
2. To prevent the escape of a fleeing subject when the officer has probable cause to believe the person has committed, or intends to commit a felony involving serious bodily injury or death to the officer or another if the subject is not

immediately apprehended.

- a. Where feasible, officers shall identify themselves as a law enforcement officer and warn of their intent to use deadly force.

C. Other Considerations of Uses of Force – Officers must stop the application of physical force when the subject no longer resists or when the incident is otherwise under control. In addition, the following considerations apply:

1. **Restrained Persons** – Physical force shall not be used against individuals in restraints, except as objectively reasonable to prevent their escape or prevent imminent bodily harm to the individual, the officers, or another person. In these situations, only the minimal amount of force necessary to control the situation shall be used.
2. **Seizure at Gunpoint** – Pointing a loaded firearm at a subject is considered a use of force as it implies the potential for imminent use of deadly force. The reason for pointing the weapon at a subject in a given situation must be evaluated based on the reasonableness standards of *Graham v. Connor*. In order to justify pointing a gun at someone, an officer must have an articulable belief that the person posed an imminent threat of serious injury or death to the officer or others.
3. **K-9 Seizures** – Canine deployment for the purpose of suspect apprehension is a use of force which requires an analysis consistent with this policy as well as the factors set forth by *Graham v Connor*. The canine handler shall give verbal warning to the suspect advising that the canine will be deployed if the suspect does not immediately comply with the handler's or other officer's order to stop or surrender (unless exigent circumstances exist such that giving a warning would endanger the handler and/or other officers).
4. **Deadly Force Restrictions** – Deadly force shall not be used against persons whose actions are a threat only to themselves or property.
5. **Vascular Neck Restraints (VNR)** – VNR or any means that slows/stops the blood flow to the brain is not authorized or trained by LPD. **(4.1.6)**
6. **Choke holds** – Officers are prohibited from using choke holds or any tactic which may prevent or hinder breathing or reduce the intake of air; unless deadly force would be justified. **(4.1.7)**

D. De-escalation – De-escalation is taking action or communicating verbally or non-verbally during a potential force encounter in an attempt to stabilize the situation and reduce the immediacy of the threat so that more time, options, and resources may be called upon to resolve the situation without the use of force or with a reduction in the force necessary.

1. An officer shall use de-escalation techniques and/or other alternatives to physical force consistent with agency training.
2. Whenever possible and appropriate de-escalation will be attempted to reduce the need for physical force.
3. Whenever possible and when such delay will not compromise the safety of the officer or another or result in the destruction of evidence, escape of a suspect, or commission of a crime, an officer shall allow an individual time and opportunity to submit to verbal commands before physical force is used.

E. Duty to Intervene (1.2.10) – Lebanon officers have a duty to intervene to prevent or stop the use of excessive force by another law enforcement officer when it is safe and reasonable to do so.

1. If an officer observes or has reason to know that excessive force is being used in his/her presence by another officer, and he/she has the opportunity and the means to prevent the excessive force from occurring, the officer must intervene to prevent the harm.
2. Lebanon officers who must intervene to prevent or stop the use of excessive force by other law enforcement officers, including Lebanon officers or officers from other agencies, will immediately report the incident to their immediate supervisor.

F. Restrictions on the Use of Firearms

1. **Warning** – About to invoke deadly force, officers will, when possible or practicable, issue a verbal warning to the suspect. In this warning, officers will identify themselves as police officers and instruct the suspect to cease or stop whatever action the suspect is doing that has caused the officer to consider the use of deadly force.
2. **Shoot to stop** – Officers will fire their weapon to stop the actions of the suspect for which the use of deadly force was determined.
3. **At or from moving vehicles** – Officers will not discharge a firearm at or from

a moving vehicle except; when it is necessary for the defense of the officer's life or the life of another person, or the officer has reasonable cause to believe that the suspect poses a significant threat of death or serious physical harm to the officer or others.

4. **Risk to innocent bystanders** – Officers must be aware of their field of fire and will not unnecessarily create a substantial risk of harm to innocent persons.
5. **Warning shots** – Officers may not discharge their firearm for the purpose of a warning shot. **(4.1.3)**
6. **While under the influence of alcohol or drugs** – Officers may not possess or use any firearm or dangerous ordnance while under the influence of an alcoholic beverage, non-prescribed legal medications, or illegal drugs.
7. **Safe Handling of Firearms**
 - a. Except for general maintenance, storage or authorized training, officers will not draw or exhibit their firearm or point their firearm at any person unless it is to lawfully use the weapon in conformance with other sections of this policy.
 - b. Officers will not surrender their weapons to any person who is not a police officer for any reason except for reoccurring inspection and maintenance or when directed by an agency supervisor or above.
 - c. Officers will secure and store weapons both on and off duty in such a way as to ensure no unauthorized person will have access to or gain control over the weapon.

8. Training Exercises

- a. Officers may discharge their firearm for the purpose of practice-established shooting range.
- b. Officers will exercise all agency required safety precautions and adhere to all agency policy and procedures while practicing on the established range.

9. Animal Destruction

- a. The killing of an animal is justified for the following circumstances: Self-defense, to prevent substantial harm to the officer or others, when the animal is so sick or badly injured that humanity requires its relief from further suffering.

- b. Domestic Animals or Pets - If an officer is dispatched on an injured domestic animal, every attempt will be made to contact the owner. If the owner of the pet cannot be contacted or located, the Warren County Dog Warden or the Warren County Humane Association will be contacted to take control of the animal, if possible.
- c. Prior to euthanizing the domestic animal, the officer will notify the Watch Commander, if possible.
- d. If the complainant believes the animal should not be euthanized, they can take responsibility for the animal.
- e. If the officer determines it safe to do so, the animal can be moved out of the public view before euthanizing it.
- f. Sick animals will not be transported in a city vehicle to prevent contamination to the vehicle.
- g. Once the animal has been euthanized, the complainant or officer will arrange for disposal.
- h. An ***Animal Destruction Report*** will be completed anytime an animal has been killed under this section.

G. Use of Less Lethal Force (4.1.4) – When de-escalation techniques are ineffective or inappropriate, officers may consider the use of less-lethal force to control a non-compliant or actively resistant individual.

- 1. An officer is authorized to use agency approved, less-lethal force techniques and issued less-lethal weapons to:
 - a. Protect the officer or others from immediate physical harm,
 - b. Restrain or subdue an individual who is actively resisting or evading arrest,
 - c. Bring an unlawful situation safely and effectively under control.
- 2. Only officers specifically trained and certified by this agency are authorized to use the following less-lethal weapons:
 - a. **OC Repellant** – The 10% oleoresin capsicum (OC) agent is authorized for use when a person is actively resisting arrest, attempting to evade arrest by flight, or otherwise assaultive/combatative actions. Officers must use care to ensure they do not direct the stream of spray directly into a person's eye

at close range due to the intense pressure of the stream. In addition, the use of OC in crowded or enclosed areas is discouraged due to the effects to persons in close proximity to the exposure.

- b. **Expandable Baton** – The expandable baton is authorized for use primarily as a defensive weapon. Striking a suspect with a baton is presumed reasonable when an officer is protecting himself/herself or others from an assault or attempted assault. The authorized expandable baton is an ASP baton.
- c. **Conducted Energy Weapon (CEW)** – The CEW is authorized for use in probe or “drive stun” mode by those officers trained and certified in its use. The CEW is used to control or otherwise subdue a person who is actively resisting arrest (including threatening violence or potentially violent behavior), attempting to evade arrest/flight, assaultive/combative, or engaging in self-destructive behavior. The authorized CEW is a TASER X2.
- d. **Less Lethal Shotgun** – The less lethal shotgun is authorized for use as a less lethal alternative to apprehending a violent/or resistant suspect while maintaining officer safety. Utilizing the less lethal shotgun is reasonable when an officer is protecting himself/herself or others from an assault or attempted assault. The authorized less lethal shotgun is a Remington shotgun with an orange stock and kinetic “beanbag” rounds.

H. Rendering Aid After Use of Force (4.1.5)

1. Officers must make all reasonable attempts to limit injury to themselves, those subject to a use of force, the public, and other law enforcement personnel in all law enforcement related events.
2. Once the scene is safe and as soon as practical, officers shall provide appropriate medical care consistent with police division training to any individual who has visible injuries, complaints of being injured, or requests medical attention. This may include providing first aid, requesting emergency medical services, and/or arranging for transportation to an emergency medical facility.
3. When delivering a suspect to an institution, such as a detention facility, hospital, or mental health facility, the intake staff shall be informed of the method and extent of the officer’s use of force and any known or suspected injuries.

On May 22nd, 2018 at 2252 hours, I responded to the area of 930 Fairwinds for a report of disorderly subjects. The caller advised that 3 adult subjects were striking and abusing a male juvenile and that there was a possible weapon involved that was metallic and shiny. The caller also advised that they heard the female subject say "do you want mommy to choke you again?" As I got closer to the residence, dispatch advised that the adults were engaged in an active fight. Upon my arrival, I located 3 adults subjects in the front yard of 929 Fairwinds. One male subject was sitting on the ground and the other male and the female were standing up. As I approached I noticed a large metallic knife in the back pocket of the male subject who was standing. The male was identified as Dione Kellum. As I approached him, he was told not to reach for the item. Mr. Kellum then reached back for the item and I grabbed him by his arm and escorted him to the ground by his arms. The weapon was removed from his person as well as a second item that could be used as a weapon. Mr. Kellum had no other weapons in his person. Neither Mr. Kellum or I was injured.

The alleged abuses of the young male juvenile, who was the son of Ms. Cherry, were found to be unfounded although it was found that Mr. Kellum did lightly pat the male juvenile on the buttocks as he was telling him to go to sleep. The claims that the three adults were physically fighting was also found to be unfounded. All of the adult subjects were warned for Disorderly Conduct.

This incident occurred in the City of Lebanon, within the County limits of Warren.



On 11/7/20 at approximately 2215, police units were dispatched to 439 E. Mulberry St. regarding a subject with a weapon. While en route, dispatch advised that the caller stated that there was a male subject sitting on her front porch and that the male subject did have a gun. The caller also identified the subject as Dione Kellum.

It should be noted that on this same date at approximately 2121, police units were dispatched to Dione Kellum's residence at 315 E. Silver St. Apt. 4 for a welfare check on Dione. On that complaint, the caller stated that Dione was threatening to harm himself over Facebook Messenger. Police units attempted contact but none was ever made at the apartment. A BOLO was sent to surrounding agencies regarding Dione at that time.

Regarding the current complaint, Ptl. McMaken, Ptl. Brummett, Ptl. Rusche and I all arrived on scene and parked several houses away from the residence. As we approached the residence, I observed Dione sitting on the front step of the front porch. Ptl. Brummett and Ptl. McMaken advised that they could see a handgun sitting next to Dione on the step. Dione was extremely intoxicated and was falling in and out of sleep. We ordered Dione to put his hands up but he wasn't responding. After several attempts, it was clear that he was too intoxicated to follow orders.

At that time, I approached Dione and noticed the gun to his right side and I also observed that he had two knives on his person. I first attempted to remove a large knife that was on his belt while he was falling asleep. As I did this, he came to and was trying to move my arm. At that time, I moved the gun away from him and the other units approached. The knives were then taken off of Dione's person.

While we attempted to speak to Dione and waited for a squad, I then went and spoke with the resident of this address identified as Jane Ruffner. Jane stated that she knows Dione because they used to be in a relationship years ago. Jane stated that she does have a protection order against Dione because after they broke up, he made threats to harm her. Jane also stated that on this night, she observed Dione sitting on her porch and talking to himself. Jane stated that she did hear him say something about killing himself and taking five Xanax bars. Dione also had containers of alcohol with him on the porch.

Dione was transported to Bethesda Arrowsprings to be assisted medically. I later learned that Dione was transported to Bethesda North for further care.

After confirming that the protection order was still in place against Dione, I issued a warrant for his arrest on one count of violating a protection order. Jane completed a written statement regarding the incident and the knives were entered into evidence. The gun in Dione's possession was found to be a pellet gun with no markings to indicate that it was not a real gun. It too was entered into evidence.

This incident occurred in the city of Lebanon in the county of Warren.
