AMENDMENT TO OHIO CONSTITUTION RELATIVE TO TAX RATES
—SUBSTITUTION OF WORD “EXTENT” AND INTRODUCTION OF
WORD “AMENDMENT” IN OPINION 3065, MAY 5, 1922.

DEAR SIR:—You have called my attention to two typographical errors occurring in the full text of the proposed amendment to Article 12, Section 2, of the Constitution, a synopsis of which has been approved by this department. These errors, both of which occur in that part of the section in which no change is made, consist of the substitution of the word “extent” for the word “amount” and the introduction of the word “amendment” between the words “alteration or repeal”. You advise it was not your intention to make these changes and that you desire before circulating the petitions to correct the text by substituting the proper words now found in the Constitution. You ask whether it will be necessary to resubmit the synopsis for the approval of this department.

In the opinion of this department the correction of these errors will in no wise affect the synopsis, which has been approved, so long as the change is made before any of the petitions are circulated. Therefore it may be done and the official approval of the synopsis may stand as relating to the corrected full text without the necessity of resubmission.

You are therefore authorized to use this department’s approval of the synopsis submitted in connection with the corrected full text.
