## Narrative:

On Wednesday, September 14, 2022, at 0019 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Cory Momchilov (Momchilov) and SA Chuck Moran interviewed Akron Police Department (APD) Officer Geoffrey Parker (Parker), who was accompanied by his attorney, Jason Wells, from the Fraternal Order of Police. The interview took place at 1460 Triplett Boulevard, Akron, Ohio. Fraternal Order of Police Akron Lodge #7 President Clay Cozart was also present during the interview.

The interview was audio recorded.

Officer Parker was identified as being a police officer who had some level of involvement in the June 27, 2022, officer-involved shooting which occurred in the area of 1659 South Main Street, Akron, Ohio. Reportedly, Officer Parker did not discharge a firearm during the course of the incident and arrived on scene after the shooting. The purpose of the interview was to obtain all relevant information of the incident known or observed by this officer.

On June 27, 2022, Officer Parker was the passenger of marked APD cruiser, Car 10; his partner, Officer Luke, was the driver. Officer Parker was wearing his standard APD uniform.

Prior to the interview, SA Momchilov was advised that Officer Parker had typed a supplemental report that documented his involvement in the June 27, 2022, officer-involved shooting. Officer Parker wished to read the narrative out loud and then he would answer any follow-up questions if needed.

Officer Parker's typed narrative reads:

On 27 June, 2022 while working in car 10, I Officer G. Parker #1523 and Officer D. Luke #14 responded to a vehicle pursuit for a driver failing to stop for a traffic violation / equipment vio was was passenger and we responded from Kenmore Blvd and Victory St.	
While in route car radioed that shots were fired from within the suspect vehicle. We went Main Street and then got onto 76E to 77S. As we got onto 77S, car radioed that the vehi would be coming up to our side and to be careful. Our vehicle at this time was in the lead. It was behind us following us from S. Main St. I thought the suspect vehicle would continue go south on 77S. We were almost passed the exit to Archwood Ave. and the vehicle then got of were not able to get off of the exit without slamming on the breaks slightly to the left of the exit hat time we waited for all the cruisers that were following the suspect vehicle to pass us befor got off the exit.	cle Car <b>1</b> oing off. We then parallel the chase going west on Firestone Blvd. to S. Main Street. We then went s on S. Main Street and east on Wilbeth Road. We arrived on scene with the other officers at hours and 22 seconds. At that time the suspect was laying on he ground and officers began approach him with guns drawn. Seeing that there was plenty of officers on scene with the suspect, I looked around for the su vehicle. I spotted it a moment later, crashed into the north wall of the church on the south sid he street. I saw a couple officers starting to approach the vehicle to clear it. Seeing that the was being taken care of, I started to search the area between the suspect and he vehicle was any type of evidence the suspect might have dropped. Nothing was found.	le of vehicle

SA Momchilov asked Officer Parker what caused him to respond to the vehicle pursuit. Officer Parker stated, "We initially started towards the area, which we, a lot of officers normally do when a pursuit gets called out and then after the shots fired they called for a Signal 21, which is officers in assist, needs assistance and then we just proceeded from there. Kind of mirroring and following along."

SA Momchilov stated, "You said when your arrived on scene, the suspect was laying on the ground." Officer Parker responded, "Yes." SA Momchilov then asked, "Did you see or hear any portion of the officer-involved shooting." Officer Parker responded, "No."

SA Momchilov asked Officer Parker if he had any conversation with any of the involved officers; Officer Parker responded, "No."

SA Momchilov asked Officer Parker if he had an opportunity to look inside the individual's vehicle. Officer Parker replied, "Yes." SA Momchilov then asked Officer Parker if he observed anything or conducted a detailed search. Officer Parker responded, "I did not, I was not involved in the search. I did look into the vehicle and saw the gun, magazine and the ring on the driver's seat and then I assisted with shutting the car off, after Sergeant Orrand arrived."

Officer Parker advised that he was wearing a body-worn camera and that he has watched his body-worn camera footage one time.

At the end of the interview, Officer Parker was afforded the opportunity to view his body-worn camera footage. Officer Parker declined.
