After the incident, a neighbor from 10240 Busenburg Road, John Campian (Campian), entered the residence unaccompanied until deputies on scene observed him a short time after entering and removed him from the scene. Campian was arrested and transported to KCSO. Upon being patted down, SA Bynum photographed and then interviewed Campian.









Once Campian was secured in a holding cell, SA Bynum advised him of his Miranda rights and asked if he would speak about his presence in the scene. The interview was audio-recorded but due to a malfunction, the recording did not start when the interview began. Campian agreed and also gave consent to SA Bynum to take his clothing and look at the contents of his cellular telephone to check if the crime scene unit could determine if the garments came in contact with any evidence inside the residence. Campian stated that he did not touch anything while inside.

The photographs taken by SA Bynum are also saved in the Reference Item A - Crime Scene Photos. The interview audio file was saved in the Reference Item E - Witness Interviews.
