Investigative Activity: New Franklin Police-Information Related to vehicle Pursuit-June 26, 2022

Activity Date: June 29, 2022

Narrative:

On June 27, 2022, during Special Agent (SA) Cory Momchilov's (Momchilov) initial briefing of this incident with Akron Police Department personnel, SA Momchilov was informed that the vehicle that Jayland Walker was driving (2005 Buick Century), prior to the shooting, was possibly involved in a vehicle pursuit in New Franklin on June 26, 2022.

However, it was indicated that the driver of the Buick Century that New Franklin attempted to pull over was possibly a white male.

On Tuesday, June 28, 2022, SA Momchilov made contact with the New Franklin Police Department in reference to obtaining reports and information related to the June 26, 2022, attempted traffic stop/pursuit.

SA Momchilov was later provided the following documents:

- New Franklin Police Department-Confidential Pursuit Driving Report.
- Incident Details (Dispatch Information).
- Memo from Officer Wagner to Chief Bickett that documents the pursuit.
- Supervisors Review Report.

SA Momchilov was advised that the actual police report was not yet completed, but a copy would be sent to SA Momchilov upon completion. However, the memo from Officer Robert Wagner (Wagner) to Chief Bickett regarding the pursuit did contain a narrative completed by Officer Wagner (Figure 1).

While on patrol on the above date and time I observed the listed vehicle with no plate lights and a white light to the rear. I initiated a traffic stop near 5031 Manchester Road. The vehicle slowed down almost to a complete stop just south of the Manchester Road at Vanderhoof Road intersection. The vehicle then drove northbound on Manchester Road a pursuit was called out at 02:30 vehicle was traveling at 34mph, committing multiple marked lanes violations then reaching a top speed of 49mph. There was no traffic. The vehicle then continued through the intersection on Manchester Road and State Route 619. The pursuit was terminated at 4261 Manchester Road at 02:31 hours by 104.

On June 30, 2022, SA Momchilov was sent New Franklin Police Department Report 2022-6260022. The narrative of that report reads:

NARRATIVE

While on patrol on the above date and time I observed the listed vehicle traveling southbound on Manchester Road. The listed vehicle had no plate lights, and the rear right tail light was exposed, showing white light to the rear. The listed vehicle pulled into 5105 Manchester Road. The vehicle then came back onto the roadway now headed northbound. I initiated a traffic stop for the equipment violation's at 5031 Manchester Road. The vehicle slowed and began to pull over to the right shoulder of the roadway. The vehicle then sped back up and continued driving. I followed the vehicle through the Manchester Road at Vanderhoof Road intersection with overhead lights and siren and called out a pursuit at 02:30 hours. Speeds reached 49 mph, with no traffic, and the vehicle had committed multiple marked lanes violations. The vehicle proceeded northbound through the Manchester Road at State Route 619 intersection. The pursuit was terminated by Sgt. Kaaikaula #104 at the northern city limits at 02:31 hours. I then shut my overhead lights and siren off and turned into 4261 Manchester Road. The listed vehicle continued northbound on Manchester Road.

The reports provided to SA Momchilov did not contain a description of the driver (other than the incident details-dispatch information, that list the driver as a white male with a black hoodie).

On June 30, 2022, SA Momchilov was able to speak with Officer Wagner, via phone. SA Momchilov asked Officer Wagner if he knew how many individuals were in the vehicle. Officer Wagner advised that there only appeared to be one occupant. SA Momchilov asked Officer Wagner if he could provide a description of the driver. Officer Wagner advised that it appeared to be a younger, black male driving.

On July 7, 2022, SA Momchilov obtained the radio traffic from the attempted traffic stop/pursuit from New Franklin Police Chief Daniel Bickett (Bickett). SA Momchilov learned that no body camera footage or dash camera footage exists for the attempted traffic stop/pursuit.

Also, on June 7, 2022, SA Momchilov formally interviewed Officer Wagner and Sergeant Robert Kaaikaula (Kaaikaula).

Officer Robert Wagner

On July 7, 2022, at approximately 1541 hours, SA Momchilov interviewed New Franklin Police Officer Wagner at the New Franklin Police Department, located at 5611 Manchester Rad, New Franklin, Ohio.

SA Momchilov asked Officer Wagner if he could explain what occurred involving the traffic stop/pursuit. Officer Wagner advised that he was sitting stationary at Akron Uniforms, located at 4410 Manchester Road, when he observed a vehicle pass him with a license plate light out and a "white light to the rear." Officer Wagner stated that he decided that he was going to conduct a traffic stop on that vehicle for an equipment violation. Officer Wagner pulled out and began traveling southbound on State Route 93; by the time Officer Wagner pulled onto the roadway, another vehicle was traveling between him and the vehicle that he intended to pull over.

Officer Wagner continued to follow the vehicles, when he observed the vehicle that he intended to pull over pull into Subway located at 5105 Manchester Road. The vehicle then turned around and re-entered the roadway, now traveling northbound on State Route 93. Officer Wagner stated he turned around in the carwash parking lot and got behind the vehicle. Officer Wagner then turned on his overhead lights.

Officer Wagner advised, when he turned on his overhead lights, "it looked like he pulled over to slow down, almost come to a stop and then basically, as soon as he pulled over, he just sped back off as I was getting ready to kind of put the car into park." Officer Wagner explained that he initially thought that the vehicle was going up to Southcrest Road to pull off. Officer Wagner advised that once they got through the light, the vehicle started to slow down and then speed up. Officer Wagner stated, "Once we got down the hill he sped up, he was all over the road, over the white line and then, um, we went down and he would slow down, speed up occasionally again and then once we got through the light at 619 and 93 he kind of maintained his speed and then, um, and when the pursuit was terminated, I shut my lights off, turned into the library and uh, it looked like he sped off even faster after that."

Officer Wagner advised the speed limit was 45 miles per hour, and the fastest the vehicle traveled was 49 miles per hour.

SA Momchilov asked Officer Wagner if he got a look at the driver. Officer Wagner explained that when the vehicle initially passed him, when he was sitting stationary at Akron Uniforms, the driver looked to be a young, black male. Officer Wagner stated, "I couldn't tell facial features from that far to identify him as 100 percent the registered owner or not." SA Momchilov asked, "So you have seen a picture of Jayland Walker, the registered owner?" Officer Wagner replied, "Yes." SA Momchilov responded, "And you couldn't tell 100 percent." Officer Wagner replied, "I wouldn't say 100 percent, I would say it looked very similar though."

SA Momchilov asked Officer Wagner if he could tell what the driver was wearing. Officer Wagner replied, "Honestly, I just looked at his face, I never looked at his, you know the side of his face. I didn't really look at clothing or anything."

SA Momchilov asked Officer Wagner, if when the individual pulled into the Subway parking lot, if he sat there for a moment. Officer Wagner stated no and that it was an immediate turn around to get back on the road. SA Momchilov asked Officer Wagner if the driver of the vehicle appeared to be lost or looking for an address. Officer Wagner replied, "No, he maintained decent speed and it didn't look like he was, as far as I could see in the vehicle, it didn't look like he was looking around for anything."

SA Momchilov explained that based on his understanding, Summit County has a system that when you run a license plate, you could see who else had interactions with that vehicle. Officer Wagner advised that was correct. SA Momchilov asked Officer Wagner who enters that information into they system. Officer Wagner advised that he believed the dispatchers did. SA

Momchilov advised, in this circumstance, the driver was entered as a white male with a black hoodie.

Officer Wagner replied, "So, that's what my Sergeant believed he saw, that is not me who said that. He passed him on 619 and he said that he had his hoodie up, the strings were pulled and he was ducking down with his hands on the wheel, but I can't speak for him."

Sergeant Robert Kaaikaula

On July 7, 2022, at approximately 1553 hours, SA Momchilov interviewed New Franklin Police Sergeant Kaaikaula at the New Franklin Police Department, located at 5611 Manchester Road, New Franklin, Ohio.

SA Momchilov explained to Sergeant Kaaikaula that it was his understanding that he was the supervisor on duty when Officer Wagner attempted to initiate a traffic stop on June 26, 2022. Sergeant Kaaikaula advised that was correct. SA Momchilov asked Sergeant Kaaikaula if he could explain what occurred.

Sergeant Kaaikaula advised, from what he heard on the radio, he heard Officer Wagner attempt to conduct a traffic stop on a vehicle. The vehicle almost came to a stop and "he just took off again." Sergeant Kaaikaula advised that they were going north on Manchester, and Officer Wagner advised that the speeds reached about 49 miles per hour. Sergeant Kaaikaula advised that he was on State Route 619, sitting at a business, when Officer Wagner called out the traffic stop. Sergeant Kaaikaula stated he began heading towards Manchester and then stopped traffic at a traffic light. Sergeant Kaaikaula advised that Officer Wagner and the other vehicle passed him at State Route 619 and State Route 93. Sergeant Kaaikaula stated, "And from what I saw, the guy was wearing a black hoodie, he had his hood up, so really the only thing I could see was hands. So I assumed, I didn't assume, I thought I saw his hands white but it could of been the steering wheel because I don't really know."

Sergeant Kaaikaula advised the he got behind Officer Wagner and by the time they got to the library, he canceled the pursuit.

SA Momchilov advised Sergeant Kaaikaula that it was his understanding that there is a county-wide system that allows officers to see who else had interactions with a vehicle when the license plate is ran. Sergeant Kaaikaula advised that was correct. SA Momchilov stated to Sergeant Kaaikaula that it was entered into that system that the driver of the vehicle was a white male with a black hoodie. Sergeant Kaaikaula replied, "Yeah I gave, I thought, cause like I said I thought I saw his hands so, I thought his hands were white, I can't say for a fact they were, it could have been the steering wheel, I don't know."

INCIDENT SUMMARY:

Ptl. Wagner attempted to perform a traffic stop on a Grey Buick for no plate light and white to rear. Ptl. Wagner advised over the radio that the suspect was coming to a stop and then began to speed up. Ptl. Wagner then stated over the radio he was in a pursuit on Manchester Rd. near Vanderhoof Rd headed northbound. Ptl. Wagner then stated over the radio the pursuit had only reached 34 MPH at the time and the PC for the stop was no plate light and white to rear. Ptl. Wagner then continued northbound on Manchester Rd in pursuit. Ptl. Wagner then stated he reached 49 MPH and was passing Tweed Dr., heading towards S.R. 619. I then confirmed with Ptl. Wagner the PC for the stop and allowed the pursuit to continue due to speed and no traffic. I was stationary at the light on 619 at Manchester Rd. and observed the suspect and Ptl. Wagner pass me. Due to the PC and the vehicle leaving the city limits, I advised Ptl. Wagner to terminate the pursuit. I then observed Ptl. Wagner terminate the pursuit at 4261 Manchester Rd. after being advised to do so. Since I was on shift and heard the radio traffic, it appears the Ptl. Wagner written and verbal statements are consistent with each other. Ptl. Wagner was calm on the radio, continued to radio his speed and location and his decision to pursue the vehicle acted in accordance to this department's pursuit policy.
