This contract covers the construction and completion of general contract, not including plumbing or electrical work, on a sheep exhibit building located at the Ohio State Fair Grounds according to Item I of proposal dated February 3, 1930, and calls for an expenditure of eighty-seven thousand nine hundred and seventy-three (\$87,973) dollars.
