Narrative:

On Tuesday, November 05, 2024, at 1340 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Allison Fletcher (Fletcher) and SA Matthew Armstrong (Armstrong) interviewed Ravenna Police Department (RPD)

who was accompanied by his attorney, Paul Siegferth, from the Fraternal Order of Police. The interview took place at 206 South Meridian Street, Ravenna, Ohio, 44266. The interview was audio and video recorded.

read, understood, and signed the BCI Criminal Investigation Notification form.

During the course of the interview, agents utilized tactics designed to illicit truthful responses and to test the veracity of information provided. As many of the details of the investigation into the incident were publicly available, it was necessary to utilize alternative tactics (beyond the typical methodology of retaining confidential "holdout" information regarding the incident and then comparing/contrasting witness statements with information that could only be known by those with actual knowledge of the incident). These tactics include developing rapport and potentially providing information known to be erroneous. Therefore, misstatements of facts or evidence in the recorded interview by the interviewing agents are intentional and align with the strategy for the overall investigative plan.

This report only summarizes the information deemed by the author to be of the most relevance to the investigation and does not purport to contain all questions and answers from the interview. Further, this report was placed in a chronology to aid the reader's overall understanding of the information elicited during the interview and may not be reflective of the actual sequencing of questions. After obtaining preliminary and demographic information, **provided** provided the following information related to the incident on October 22, 2024.

was working as the	on the date of the incident. Three	
other RPD officers were assigned to work patrol and and		
included	Officer Joshua Twigg (Twigg), and Officer

and Officer Twigg were dispatched to the hike and bike trail near North Freedom Street for a male victim who had possibly been stabbed. Additional information was provided that the victim had been stabbed multiple times in the buttock and arm.

began responding to the location due to the nature of the call. planned on providing scene security for fire personnel while they provided emergency medical services to the male victim.

and Officer Meyers arrived at the location at the same time. **Second Second Sec**

observed multiple pedestrians and bicyclists on the trail near officers and the approaching subject. The three officers were standing in a line spanning the hike and bike trail.

described the hike and bike trail as a narrow-paved path (only a few feet wide) with railroad tracks on one side and a split rail fence on the other. A dense wood line was behind the fencing.

ran up to the location of the other officers who had their firearms pointed at the subject and were yelling commands to drop the weapons. positioned himself in line with the other officers and pointed his firearm at the subject who was approximately twenty-five feet away. **Second 1** observed the subject holding a double-sided axe in one hand and a knife in the other hand. He began giving commands to the subject to drop the weapons. The subject did not comply and continued to approach in an aggressive manner.

described the subject as a white male with a shaved head, dark-colored pants, and a swastika tattoo on his chest. As the subject continued to approach "aggressively," he would also flex "like the hulk." The subject was using "profanity" and explicit language yelling at the officers.

The officers continued giving commands and attempted to back up from the subject. However, the stabbing victim and fire personnel were behind the officers, preventing them from being able to back up further. There were also pedestrians and bicyclists on the trail who were passing the subject in close proximity. **Second 1** said one of the bicyclists could have brushed elbows with the subject, he was so close to him.

The subject continued to approach and failed to comply with commands given by officers. The subject was approximately fifteen feet away from their location.

feared for the safety of himself, the officers, and others who were present at the location. At that time, he fired his gun at the subject aiming at his center mass. The subject fell to the ground.

approached the subject and assisted in clearing the knife and axe away from the subject. He then requested fire personnel who were already present to assist in rendering aid to the subject.

felt, when the subject was approaching officers in an aggressive manner, he was not only "walking with a purpose," but he was also "preparing to attack" [23:30]. felt he did not have any other options available to him other than the use of deadly force.

fired his gun in a northeastern direction. He believed his rounds struck the subject in the center mass area and possibly the legs. He also believed his actions were consistent with his training.

described the weather on the day of the incident as a "perfect day." He elaborated by saying it was a perfect day for people to be outside walking and riding their bikes.

did have two prior encounters with the subject who was later identified as Matthew Fries (Fries). **Second and Second Seco**

The second encounter mentioned by **Constant of** was on an unknown date in downtown Ravenna. Fries was at the courthouse because his girlfriend had been arrested on a warrant. **Constant of** said his interaction with Fries was very calm. Fries was able to communicate and seemed like a completely different person.

The interview concluded at approximately 1412 hours.


