APPROVAL—RESERVOIR LAND LEASE AT BUCKEYE LAKE FOR THE RIGHT TO USE AND OCCUPY FOR COTTAGE SITE AND DOCKLANDING PURPOSES—B. C. SCHMITT, OF COLUMBUS, OHIO.

DEAR SIR:—This is to acknowledge the receipt of a recent communication over the signature of the Chief of the Bureau of Inland Lakes and Parks of the Division of Conservation in your department, submitting for my examination and approval a reservoir land lease, in triplicate, executed by the Conservation Commissioner, under the authority of section 471, General Code, to one B. C. Schmitt of Columbus, Ohio.

This lease, which is one for a stated term of fifteen years, and which provides for an annual rental of \$36.00, payable semi-annually, grants and demises to the lessee above named the right to occupy and use for cottage site and docklanding purposes only, the inner slope and waterfront and the outer slope of the westerly embankment of Buckeye Lake back to what is commonly known as the "State Ditch," that is included in Embankment Lot No. 26, south of Lakeside, as laid out by the Ohio Canal Commission in 1905, and being part of the Southeast Quarter of Section 17, Range 18, Fairfield County, Ohio.

Upon examination of this lease, I find that the same has been properly executed by the Conservation Commissioner and by B. C. Schmitt, the lessee therein named.

I further find upon examination of the provisions of this lease and of the conditions and restrictions therein contained, that the same are in conformity with the provisions of the sections of the General Code above referred to, and with those of other statutory enactments relating to leases of this kind.

I am accordingly approving this lease as to legality and form, as is evidenced by my approval endorsed upon the lease and upon the duplicate and triplicate copies thereof, all of which are herewith enclosed.
