On Monday, November 17, 2025, at 1356 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Douglas Burke (SA Burke) and SA Ryan Emahiser (SA Emahiser) interviewed Findlay Police Department (FPD) [REDACTED] who was accompanied by his attorney, Yvonne Trevino, from the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (OPBA). The interview took place at 318 Dorney Plaza Suite 116, Findlay, OH 45840. The interview was only audio-recorded per OPBA Attorney Trevino's request

[REDACTED] read, understood, and signed the BCI Criminal Investigation Notification form without incident.

This report only summarizes the information deemed by the author to be of the most relevance to the investigation and does not purport to contain all questions and answers from the interview. Further, this report was placed in a chronology to aid the reader's overall understanding of the information elicited during the interview and may not be reflective of the actual sequencing of questions. It is suggested that the full recording be reviewed to clarify any content or contextual questions regarding the information from the interview.

In the days prior to this interview, Attorney Trevino (on behalf of [REDACTED]) granted permission for BCI to obtain and review a copy of [REDACTED] narrative report.

Supplemental Narrative of Involved FPD [REDACTED]

On 10-22-2025 at 1347 hours, [REDACTED] and I were dispatched to 1642 Cherry Ln. for a reported shooting. Dispatch advised that an elderly male called 911 and stated there had been a shooting. Dispatch said the caller had hung up and was not answering call back attempts. I began responding in emergency mode (lights and sirens) from the Findlay Police Department. While driving to the location, Dispatch said the call was mapping to 1649 Cherry Ln. and that this might be the actual location of the call.

I accessed Cherry Ln. from Tiffin Ave. I continued driving in emergency mode until I stopped my patrol vehicle on Plaza St. at Cherry Ln. Ofcr. Huber arrived at the same time as I did. We began to approach 1649 Cherry Ln. I asked him to check a license plate on a vehicle in the driveway at this residence. I approached the door of 1649 Cherry Ln. and knocked. A female answered the door, and I asked her if she had reported a shooting. The female seemed shocked and said she had not.

I looked across the street at 1642 Cherry Ln. and saw the main front door was open, but a glass storm door was shut. [REDACTED] was pulling up in front of 1642 Cherry Ln. at this time. His patrol vehicle had its overhead lights on and was parked directly in front of 1642 Cherry Ln. Anyone standing at the glass storm door in the residence would have been able to see a clearly marked Findlay Police Department patrol vehicle with its emergency lights on parked out front.

I left the front lawn of 1649 Cherry Ln. and proceeded towards 1642 Cherry Ln. I relayed to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] that 1642 Cherry Ln. was the residence I was going to check next. I advised Dispatch on the radio that I believed the actual call location was going to be at 1642 Cherry Ln. [REDACTED] and I proceeded at a light jog up the driveway of 1642 Cherry Ln. He accessed the sidewalk that connected with the driveway and led up to the covered front porch. He proceeded at an angle off the sidewalk and up onto the front porch. He approached the right side of the storm door. I stayed along the sidewalk and began to approach the home where the porch meets the front of the sidewalk (more straight on to the door). As I came more centered to the front door, I could see the right shoulder and leg of a person standing in the door. I noted that the person's right elbow was bent almost to 90 degrees and tucked into his chest/abdomen. The door cracked open several inches. [REDACTED] yelled, "Oh gun gun gun," and began to raise his firearm towards the door. I was directly in front of the door at this time, approximately 15-20 feet away. I saw an elderly man, later identified as Robert Norton, standing inside on the other side of the door. Robert had a black handgun in his right hand. Robert was now pointing the handgun directly towards me. I drew my duty weapon, a Glock 45, a .9mm handgun. I raised my weapon towards Robert and fired approximately three rounds while moving to my left, away from the front of the door. I saw the glass shatter on the storm door. I saw Robert appear to fall backwards onto the floor just inside the door. I continued moving to my left and sought cover on the southwest corner of the residence.

I radioed to Dispatch that shots had been fired. Ofcr. Huber and Ofcr. Stoner had been approaching the residence as the shots were fired. Ofcr. Huber took cover with [REDACTED] who was on the southeast corner of the residence. Ofcr. Stoner went to the north side of the residence for cover and overwatch. I advised [REDACTED] and Ofcr. Huber to hold their positions and wait for additional units to get on scene for assistance. I radioed for a drone to respond to the scene. While waiting on further assistance, I attempted to make verbal contact with Robert. I yelled several times that I was with the Findlay Police Department and asked Robert if he could hear me. I did not receive any response from him.

Sgt. Waldbauer and Sgt. Williams were the first backup units to join me on the southwest corner of the residence. Sgt. Waldbauer brought a shield with him. Additional responding units joined [REDACTED] and Ofcr. Huber. They also brought along a shield. Sgt. Williams advised that the drone car was still at the station and no drone was currently at the scene. We formulated a plan to approach the door using the shield for cover in case Robert was still armed and posed an active threat. Sgt. Waldbauer held the shield with Sgt. Williams and me behind him. We moved in a U-shaped pattern to the middle of the front yard, where we could see inside the door. We were able to see Robert lying on the floor. His feet were pointed towards the door. As we moved closer, we could see a black handgun on the floor at

Robert's feet. Determining that Robert was no longer an active threat, we moved in. We had to break some of the remaining glass on the storm door as we entered. The other group of officers approached from the southeast corner as well. One of them moved into the residence and picked the handgun up off the floor. The rest of the officers entered the residence and began to check it for other suspects or victims. There were no occupants in the residence.

Ofcr. Lehman had started first aid on Robert. I began to assist him. I used my knife to help cut Robert's shirt so his wounds could be accessed. I was able to see that Robert had two apparent wounds to his upper/ middle abdomen and one in his groin area. Ofcr. Lehman continued assessing Robert's wounds and began CPR on him. Ofcr. Bormuth approached me and told me to exit the residence with him. I left the residence with Ofcr. Bormuth and went to his patrol vehicle. My body worn camera was then shut off as we approached Ofcr. Bormuth's patrol vehicle.

When I got inside Ofcr. Bormuth's patrol vehicle, I placed my knife in one of the rubber gloves I had put on before using my knife to cut Robert's shirt. When Ofcr. Bormuth and I got to the Police Department we went to the Detective's Division. I turned my knife over as evidence. I also turned my duty weapon over for processing as evidence. I awaited initial contact with a BCI&I Investigator. I was later dismissed for the day by the BCI&I Investigator.

SA Burke reviewed [REDACTED] typed narrative prior to his interview. SA Burke asked [REDACTED] if he had reviewed his Body Worn Camera (BWC) prior to the in-person interview on this date. [REDACTED] said he had reviewed his BWC approximately a half dozen, {six (6) times} after the OICI on October 22, 2025. [REDACTED] stated that he viewed his BWC of the OICI as the event evolved when [REDACTED] typed his Incident Report (IR).

SA Emahiser asked [REDACTED] if this was standard procedure to review any BWC footage on any incident which a FPD Officer would be involved with and [REDACTED] said that was correct.

[REDACTED] then explained the events of the OICI from October 22, 2025, as he perceived them.

[REDACTED] indicated at the time of the call, [REDACTED] had been on station (FPD). Dispatch had dispatched the call to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] of a reported person with a **"gun or shooting and they needed help."** [REDACTED] said dispatch had radioed two (2) separate addresses, one (1) being 1642 Cherry Lane, but the Global Positioning System (GPS) from the 911 call stated the

house which needed responded to had been 1649 Cherry Lane, all within the city limits of Findlay, OH. According to [REDACTED], dispatch indicated that the caller had disconnected and dispatch had attempted a callback. However, no one answered on callback. [REDACTED] stated that dispatch had indicated the caller sounded like an "older" person.

In emergency response, [REDACTED] responded to 1649 Cherry Lane due to GPS mapping stating that was where the suspected "shooting" incident was taking place. Ofc. Nick Huber (Huber) arrived at 1649 Cherry Lane at the same time as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] Ofc. Huber checked a vehicle plate number and the rear of the residence at 1649 Cherry Lane, finding everything to be normal.

[REDACTED] said that he went to the front door of 1649 Cherry Lane and made contact with a female who did not seem to be "worried" about anything. [REDACTED] asked the female if she had reported a "shooting" and the female said she had not reported a "shooting."

At that time, [REDACTED] turned around towards 1642 Cherry Lane which was across the street and looked. [REDACTED] noted that the main door to be open, and the storm door shut, but noted the storm door to be all glass which allowed [REDACTED] to see inside the house somewhat. [REDACTED] stated on this particular day, it had been colder out and thought it to be "weird" the main door had been standing open.

According to [REDACTED] had arrived and parked right in front of 1642 Cherry Lane in his marked FPD Cruiser with the overhead lights still activated. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] conversed and decided 1642 Cherry Lane needed to be checked. Both officers took off on a light jog towards the front door of 1642 Cherry Lane.

Going up the asphalt driveway, then onto the curved sidewalk to the west of the driveway, [REDACTED] stayed on the curved sidewalk leading up to the front door. [REDACTED] had peeled off though the flower bed (landscaping) going up to the front porch. [REDACTED] stated that he observed what looked to be the "right side of a figure" just inside the glass screen door. The "figure" had been wearing tan pants or a cardigan of some sort and could now tell the "figure" was a human. The right arm had been bent up to a ninety (90) degree angle with the elbow tucked in.

[REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] had now made his approach to the front glass screen door and observed the front glass screen door just partially open. Immediately, [REDACTED] yelled, "gun, gun, gun" and started to back-up from the front screen door.

And within just milliseconds I was able to get a clear look at older gentleman standing inside the door. And he sucked the gun back inside the door and still had it tucked to his body, but it was pointing directly at me at that point. I seen a clear black handgun. Um so I drew my duty weapon at that time. Um, you know, presented it. Fired three shots, three to four shots at, at that time (19:23).

Snippets from [REDACTED] AXON 4 Body Worn Camera (BWC) upon approaching the front glass screen door of 1642 Cherry Lane, Findlay, OH, [REDACTED] observing Robert pointing the firearm towards [REDACTED] through the glass door.

Once [REDACTED] had made his way to cover by a tree, [REDACTED] had conversed with [REDACTED] and Ofc. Huber about their next tactical movement. [REDACTED] stated it had been decided himself, [REDACTED], and Ofc. Huber were going to "hold" until other FPD Officers arrived on scene. [REDACTED] indicated, he next started to "yell" towards the front door, "can you hear me" with no response. The verbal orders continued with no response until other FPD Officers arrived on scene.

Shortly thereafter, numerous other FPD Officers arrived at 1642 Cherry Lane and two (2) separate shield teams had been established to "clear" the house. [REDACTED] said the FPD Officers then approached the house and noticed the subject, later to be identified as Robert Norton (Robert) lying just inside the doorway. According to [REDACTED] FPD Officers then moved inside the house, stepping over Robert to "clear"

the house to make sure no one else had been inside. [REDACTED] said he stayed with Ofc. Eric Lehman (Lehman), who had started to render aid to Robert and Ofc. Lehman had used [REDACTED]'s knife to cut off Robert's t-shirt. [REDACTED] had carried a knife on his person while on duty.

According to [REDACTED] had observed Ofc. Lehman pick up the firearm, lying next to Robert and put it on a chair away from Robert. [REDACTED] said he could observe three (3) gunshot wounds to Robert's person, one (1) in the chest, one (1) in the abdomen area, and one (1) in the pelvic area. Once the house had been cleared and medics were at that time assisting Ofc. Lehman with first aid, [REDACTED] said he had been removed from the scene and went back to FPD.

SA Burke asked [REDACTED] if, during the time himself and [REDACTED] had approached the house at 1642 Cherry Lane, did Robert make any comments towards them. [REDACTED] said [REDACTED] never heard anything from Robert at any point during this event. SA Burke asked [REDACTED] if he at any point ordered Robert to drop the firearm/weapon. [REDACTED] said he did not, adding, "everything happened too fast." SA Burke asked [REDACTED] if Robert ever fired the firearm Robert had in his hand towards [REDACTED] or [REDACTED] said no weapon had been fired towards himself or [REDACTED] other than the firearm being pointed at [REDACTED].

SA Burke asked [REDACTED] if he had been familiar with Robert or Robert's house. [REDACTED] said he could not recall ever having dealt with Robert or been at Robert's house. SA Burke asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] felt he acted within the guidelines of the FPD Use of Force Policy. [REDACTED] stated he did with the firearm being pointed "directly at [REDACTED]" [REDACTED] added, [REDACTED] felt in fear of his safety and others around.

[REDACTED] stated on the initial approach to the house, Robert's focus had been on [REDACTED] due to [REDACTED]'s belief that Robert had seen [REDACTED] first and Robert pointing the firearm towards [REDACTED]. Once [REDACTED] fired his weapon and backed out of Robert's sight, [REDACTED] stated that he believed Robert observed [REDACTED] and at that point, Robert pointed the firearm in his hand towards [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] then fired his duty weapon at Robert, striking Robert.

SA Emahiser asked [REDACTED] what was his initial purpose of going up to the house at 1642 Cherry Lane. [REDACTED] stated that he noticed the main door had been open as though someone was inviting us inside the house. [REDACTED] said the way the actual call had been called into dispatch, [REDACTED] stated it was, "my

**brain initially thought that this was somebody that was taking their own life and
they were calling in so they would not be found at a later time,” adding [REDACTED]**

[REDACTED] had dealt with similar calls like this before. [REDACTED] said he felt, himself and the other FPD Officers were going to walk into a “**completed suicide.**” According to [REDACTED], “**he was on high alert due to the nature of the call,
but if you want my first initial thought, that’s what I thought was it as going to be
someone trying to get us out there to find them because they were killing
themselves,**” that was [REDACTED]’s true initial thought responding to 1642 Cherry Lane.

SA Burke asked [REDACTED] if he had his duty weapon unholstered as he approached the house at 1642 Cherry Lane. [REDACTED] said he truly could not remember, but [REDACTED] knew [REDACTED] had his duty weapon unholstered during [REDACTED]’s approach to the house. [REDACTED] was asked if he used any less lethal weapons during this event and [REDACTED] stated he did not.

SA Burke asked [REDACTED] if [REDACTED] had heard any other “commotion” inside the house during this event and [REDACTED] said he never heard anything being said by Robert or any other noises which had come from the inside of the house.

[REDACTED] had no other relevant information which pertained to the OICI at 1642 Cherry Lane and the interview concluded at approximately 1425 hours.

The interview was audio-recorded and was placed into Axon Justice as part of Reference Item C. NARRATIVE

On 10-22-25 at 1347 hrs. I heard a call go out involving a shooting that had just occurred at 1342 Cherry Ln. Due to the nature of the call, I also went that way to assist with the initial officers who were dispatched. While en route, dispatch advised that an elderly male was the complainant, and he stated there had been a shooting, and to please hurry. Dispatch advised a short time later that when the 911 call came in, it was GPS located to 1649 Cherry Ln.

[REDACTED] and I were first on scene. [REDACTED] and I both parked our marked police cruisers in the intersection of Cherry Ln. and Plaza St. to make sure we did not park in front of either of the houses. When we both exited our cruisers, we first went to 1649 Cherry Ln. based on the GPS location of the call. I ran a license plate check on the east side of the residence, with the driveway located off Plaza St., and it came back to someone who lived at that address. I stayed on the southeast corner of the house for a short period to ensure no one came out of the rear of the residence or that there was no one injured in the backyard.

I then started to walk back around the front of the house onto the north side, and when I did, I saw [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] jogging over to 1642 Cherry Ln. At which point I began to jog over there as well. When I was just about to cross over the curb into the lawn of 1642 Cherry Ln. I heard [REDACTED] yell "Gun! Gun! Gun!" From where I was standing, both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were standing on the porch when I heard multiple gunshots ring out, shooting through the glass storm door of the house. From the distance I was from the house, I did not see a person at the time of the shooting. I then pulled my department issued handgun (Glock 21) and began giving cover for [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I then attempted to call out over the radio that shots were fired. I am not sure if my radio traffic went out or not because multiple people were trying to get on the radio at that time.

As I got closer to the house, I began to proceed over to the southeast corner of the residence for cover, next to [REDACTED]. At this time [REDACTED] had moved over to the southwest corner of the house, and I could visibly see both of them. Due to where [REDACTED] was, I moved out away from the house to avoid a crossfire situation and got behind a tree to better see the front of the house while still maintaining cover.

All four officers on scene at this time maintained cover while we waited for additional units to arrive on scene. I continued to watch the front of the house and kept checking on [REDACTED] as he was the only one on that side of the house. When I asked him if he was ok, he said he was, and that he believed the male inside the door had taken at least one shot to the chest.

We all held the scene until additional officers started arriving on the scene. The ballistic shield was taken from my cruiser by Ofcr. Cooley and we began to make entry into the residence. As we prepared to approach the the residence, Ofcr. Cooley was first, as he was with the shield,

Ofcr. Lehman was to his left, I was behind Ofcr. Lehman, and Ofcr. Price was behind Ofcr. Cooley. We then began approaching the front door of the residence. When we made entry into the residence, we pushed past the male lying on the floor immediately inside the front door to clear the rest of the house. Once the house was cleared, and no other individuals were located inside, we began to exit the residence. On my way out, I observed medical aid was being rendered to the male in the doorway.

When I was standing outside, I went and obtained an evidence log for Ofcr. Collins to use for a crime scene log. I remained outside for a period of time before Ofcr. Hernandez took me back to the station due to being present when the initial incident occurred. This ended my involvement.

On 10-22-2025 at approximately 1347 hours, [REDACTED] and I were dispatched to 1642 Cherry Ln. for a shooting. Dispatch advised an elderly male called in, stated there had been a shooting, asked to hurry up, and then hung up the phone. Dispatch also explained the 911 cell phone ping was coming from 1649 Cherry Ln, and the caller was not answering the phone on several call backs.

Due to the nature of the call, Ofcr. N. Huber (#865) and Ofcr. Stoner (#2043) advised they were also en route. I was in the area of W. Trenton Ave. and Northridge Rd. when the call came out, operating a marked Findlay Police Department vehicle [REDACTED]. I activated my overhead lights and sirens and proceeded to the location in emergency mode.

While en route, I heard on the radio, [REDACTED] ask for Hanco EMS to stage in the area. At approximately 1350 hours, [REDACTED] and Ofcr. Huber advised on the radio they had arrived on scene. Ofcr. Stoner advised he would approach the house from the Plaza St side. [REDACTED] advised on the radio they were going to check 1649 Cherry Ln. first.

I arrived in the area and turned north onto Cherry Ln. from Tiffin Ave., directly behind a Findlay Fire Department fire truck. I turned off my sirens but left the overhead lights on. Near the bend on Cherry Ln. (the 1600 block), I passed the fire truck and advised Dispatch I was on scene at approximately 1351 hours.

I parked my Findlay Police Department vehicle across the street from 1642 Cherry Ln., with the overhead lights still activated. I noticed the front door to 1642 Cherry Ln was open, but the glass storm door was shut. As I was exiting my vehicle, I could see into the home from the front door, it appeared dark, and no one was visible.

I saw [REDACTED] walk from the area of 1649 Cherry Ln towards 1642 Cherry Ln. I asked [REDACTED] if they had checked this one, pointing to 1642 Cherry Ln. He explained it was the last one they needed to check. At that point, I began jogging towards the front door with [REDACTED] following behind me. I removed my Findlay Police Department issued Glock 21 firearm from its holster and held it down by my right side due to the nature of the call.

The house was a white one-story ranch style with a small porch off the front door. I stepped onto the porch to the right of the front door. As I stepped onto the porch at approximately 1352 hours, the glass storm door opened up slightly, and the muzzle of a black handgun with a Picatinny type rail system under the barrel emerged and was pointed at my chest. At that time, I was fearful of my life, the lives of the other Officers on scene, and the public.

I yelled, "Whoa, gun, gun, gun" while walking backwards from the door along the porch at the same time firing approximately four shots towards the area where the individual was holding the gun. At the same time, I watched the gun slowly retreat into the home and point towards the front yard. [REDACTED] was in the front yard, and I also heard him fire towards the front door. I yelled for other Officers to back up from the front door to gain distance. I took up a position on the southeast corner of the

house while [REDACTED] was towards the southwest. Ofcr. Stoner took the northeast corner to cover the backyard while Ofcr. Huber came to my location.

Both [REDACTED] and I advised Dispatch over the radio of the shots fired. Ofcr. Huber and I moved from our location to behind two trees in the southeast corner of the property, so we were not in a crossfire with [REDACTED]. I asked [REDACTED] if we needed to bring up a shield, and it was determined we would wait until more Officers arrived on scene. I then asked Dispatch to have the Fire Department block off Cherry Ln., where they had staged, and move the individuals who were outside mowing. [REDACTED] advised us that a male was lying just inside the doorway and was not communicating with him.

At that time, several Officers arrived on scene and began a plan to approach the front door. The Officers began to move towards the front door, and I moved to the northeast corner of the home behind Ofcr. Stoner. At approximately 1401 hours, I was advised that the house was clear, and I placed my Glock 21 pistol in the holster.

I walked back towards my vehicle with Ofcr. Stoner when I turned off my Axon 4 body camera and the front dash camera. I was then taken from the scene by Sgt. Griffith (#731) back to the Findlay Police Department.

This ended my involvement.

On 10-22-2025 at 1347 hours, [REDACTED] and I were dispatched to 1642 Cherry Ln. for a reported shooting. Dispatch advised that an elderly male called 911 and stated there had been a shooting. Dispatch said the caller had hung up and was not answering call back attempts. I began responding in emergency mode (lights and sirens) from the Findlay Police Department. While driving to the location, Dispatch said the call was mapping to 1649 Cherry Ln. and that this might be the actual location of the call.

I accessed Cherry Ln. from Tiffin Ave. I continued driving in emergency mode until I stopped my patrol vehicle on Plaza St. at Cherry Ln. Ofcr. Huber arrived at the same time as I did. We began to approach 1649 Cherry Ln. I asked him to check a license plate on a vehicle in the driveway at this residence. I approached the door of 1649 Cherry Ln. and knocked. A female answered the door, and I asked her if she had reported a shooting. The female seemed shocked and said she had not.

I looked across the street at 1642 Cherry Ln. and saw the main front door was open, but a glass storm door was shut. [REDACTED] was pulling up in front of 1642 Cherry Ln. at this time. His patrol vehicle had its overhead lights on and was parked directly in front of 1642 Cherry Ln. Anyone standing at the glass storm door in the residence would have been able to see a clearly marked Findlay Police Department patrol vehicle with its emergency lights on parked out front.

I left the front lawn of 1649 Cherry Ln. and proceeded towards 1642 Cherry Ln. I relayed to [REDACTED] that 1642 Cherry Ln. was the residence I was going to check next. I advised Dispatch on the radio that I believed the actual call location was going to be at 1642 Cherry Ln. [REDACTED] and I proceeded at a light jog up the driveway of 1642 Cherry Ln. He accessed the sidewalk that connected with the driveway and led up to the covered front porch. He proceeded at an angle off the sidewalk and up onto the front porch. He approached the right side of the storm door. I stayed along the sidewalk and began to approach the home where the porch meets the front of the sidewalk (more straight on to the door). As I came more centered to the front door, I could see the right shoulder and leg of a person standing in the door. I noted that the person's right elbow was bent almost to 90 degrees and tucked into his chest/abdomen. The door cracked open several inches. [REDACTED] yelled, "Oh gun gun gun," and began to raise his firearm towards the door. I was directly in front of the door at this time, approximately 15-20 feet away. I saw an elderly man, later identified as Robert Norton, standing inside on the other side of the door. Robert had a black handgun in his right hand. Robert was now pointing the handgun directly towards me. I drew my duty weapon, a Glock 45, a .9mm handgun. I raised my weapon towards Robert and fired approximately three rounds while moving to my left, away from the front of the door. I saw the glass shatter on the storm door. I saw Robert appear to fall backwards onto the floor just inside the door. I continued moving to my left and sought cover on the southwest corner of the residence.

I radioed to Dispatch that shots had been fired. Ofcr. Huber and Ofcr. Stoner had been approaching the residence as the shots were fired. Ofcr. Huber took cover with [REDACTED] who was on the southeast corner of the residence. Ofcr. Stoner went to the north side of the residence for cover and overwatch. I advised [REDACTED] and Ofcr. Huber to hold their positions and wait for additional units to get on scene for assistance. I radioed for a drone to respond to the scene. While waiting on further assistance, I

attempted to make verbal contact with Robert. I yelled several times that I was with the Findlay Police Department and asked Robert if he could hear me. I did not receive any response from him.

Sgt. Waldbauer and Sgt. Williams were the first backup units to join me on the southwest corner of the residence. Sgt. Waldbauer brought a shield with him. Additional responding units joined [REDACTED] and Ofcr. Huber. They also brought along a shield. Sgt. Williams advised that the drone car was still at the station and no drone was currently at the scene. We formulated a plan to approach the door using the shield for cover in case Robert was still armed and posed an active threat. Sgt. Waldbauer held the shield with Sgt. Williams and me behind him. We moved in a U-shaped pattern to the middle of the front yard, where we could see inside the door. We were able to see Robert lying on the floor. His feet were pointed towards the door. As we moved closer, we could see a black handgun on the floor at Robert's feet. Determining that Robert was no longer an active threat, we moved in. We had to break some of the remaining glass on the storm door as we entered. The other group of officers approached from the southeast corner as well. One of them moved into the residence and picked the handgun up off the floor. The rest of the officers entered the residence and began to check it for other suspects or victims. There were no occupants in the residence.

Ofcr. Lehman had started first aid on Robert. I began to assist him. I used my knife to help cut Robert's shirt so his wounds could be accessed. I was able to see that Robert had two apparent wounds to his upper/ middle abdomen and one in his groin area. Ofcr. Lehman continued assessing Robert's wounds and began CPR on him. Ofcr. Bormuth approached me and told me to exit the residence with him. I left the residence with Ofcr. Bormuth and went to his patrol vehicle. My body worn camera was then shut off as we approached Ofcr. Bormuth's patrol vehicle.

When I got inside Ofcr. Bormuth's patrol vehicle, I placed my knife in one of the rubber gloves I had put on before using my knife to cut Robert's shirt. When Ofcr. Bormuth and I got to the Police Department we went to the Detective's Division. I turned my knife over as evidence. I also turned my duty weapon over for processing as evidence. I awaited initial contact with a BCI&I Investigator. I was later dismissed for the day by the BCI&I Investigator.
