Narrative:

On October 12th, 2025, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) was requested by the City of Columbus Police Department (CPD) to investigate an officer-involved critical incident. As part of the investigation, Special Agent Doug Eveslage responded to the Columbus Police Department Zone 4 Midwatch Station at the above-mentioned address to process the involved officer.

SA Eveslage arrived at the annex at approximately 0700 hours. He was advised that one CPD officer had discharged his duty weapon. The involved officer was observed to be in their agency issued uniform and advised they were dressed as they were at the time of the incident. The specifics of the officer are detailed below:

- [REDACTED] (Officer #1) – CPD: Reportedly discharged his duty pistol during the incident. His duty pistol was a Smith and Wesson M&P 9mm (S/N: [REDACTED]) with a Surefire X300 Turbo weapon light attached to the frame. It was found with one Speer 9mm cartridge in the chamber and five Speer 9mm cartridges seated in the magazine. His duty belt contained two additional fully loaded magazines. His pistol, cartridges, and magazine were collected as Item #1.

SA Eveslage transferred [REDACTED] duty pistol to Crime Scene Special Agent David Hammond at approximately 0815 hours for further processing.
