Narrative:

On Tuesday, February 24, 2026, at approximately 1530 hours, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agents (SA) Doug Burke (Burke) and Joe Lamping (Lamping) responded to the University Hospital Parma Medical Center to meet with Parma Police [REDACTED] and Chris Smith (Smith). The aforementioned officers had been transported to the hospital for medical evaluation following an Officer Involved Critical Incident (OICI) that occurred in the area of 10810 Brookpark Road, Brooklyn, Ohio 44130.

Upon arrival, the agents met with a large group of Parma Officers. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were identified as having been involved in the incident, whereas Officer Smith only witnessed it. SA Lamping spoke with [REDACTED] and Smith to inform them of the BCI investigative process. The officers were provided with the opportunity to make a statement to investigators at that time. However, all officers advised that they would be consulting with their legal counsel prior to offering any statements.

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had already been photographed by Parma Police Department's Crime Scene Officer James Mack (Mack). Officer Mack agreed to provide the photographs to SA Lamping via email. Those photographs were later uploaded to Axon Justice as stored as part of Reference Item C – Officer Documentation Photographs. Officer Mack also had possession of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] firearms in sealed firearm boxes. SA Lamping took the firearms into a conference room where they could be examined and repackaged. A round count was conducted on the spare magazines in the firearms boxes, and the full magazines which had no evidentiary value were returned to Parma Police Department's range master, Officer Tom Desmarteau (Officer Desmarteau), who was at the hospital. The firearms were examined, photographed, and packaged. A copy of the inventory receipt was provided to Officer Desmarteau.

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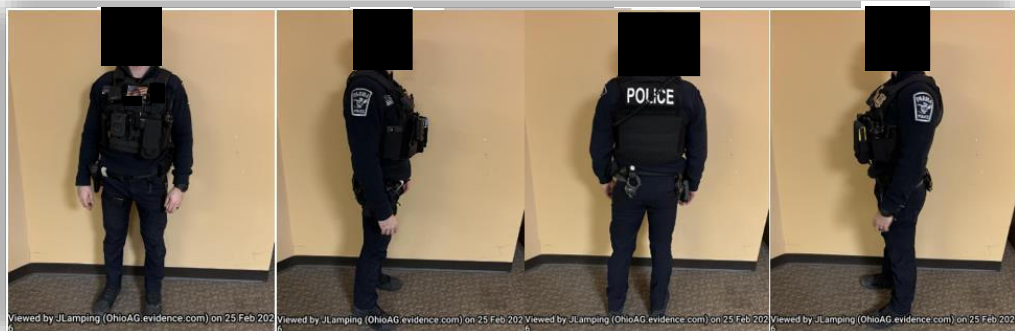
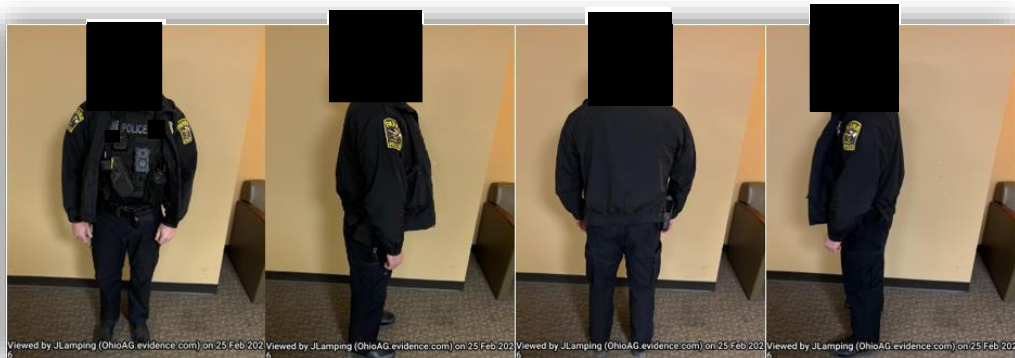
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SA Burke spoke with Ohio Patrolman's Benevolent Association (OPBA) Attorney Dan Leffler (Attorney Leffler) who had arrived on scene. A tentative interview date of March 19, 2026, at 1000 hours was set for the interviews at the OPBA Office located at 10147 Royalton Road, North Royalton, Ohio.

SA Bruke also spoke with Parma Police Department Chief Kevin Riley and Deputy Chief Tom Siedlecki. They were provided with an OICI handbook and advised of the investigative process.

SA Lamping took an additional set of photographs of each involved officer in the uniforms that they were wearing at the time of the incident:
