Narrative:

On Monday, December 16, 2024, Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) Special Agent (SA) Jack Shea conducted a neighborhood canvass in the area of 3487 Belmont Avenue Youngstown, Ohio. The purpose for the canvass was to identify and interview potential witnesses to the officer-involved critical incident that occurred at 3487 Belmont Avenue, Liberty Township, Ohio on Monday, December 16, 2024. During the neighborhood canvass, SA Shea contacted the listed employees at stated location. The following is a synopsis of the interviews and questions asked and answered but is not a word for word translation of the interview or answers. None of the following individuals interviewed took any video recordings of the incident.

SA Shea spoke to Samarra Peques who is a Clerk at CITI TRENDS store located at 3489 Belmont Ave. Peques told Shea that she heard a crash and went outside and saw a car sticking out of the Harbor Freight store. When asked, Peques told Shea that CITI TRENDS don't have video cameras.

SA Shea also spoke to Kyle Webber (Asst. Mgr.) and Lori Wilson (Mgr.) at the Dollar Tree store located at 3495 Belmont Ave. Webber and Wilson told Shea they felt the building shake but did not hear any shots fired. Wilson went on to say the store has video inside the store but not outside the store.

SA Shea interviewed Ashley Schill who is the Director of Octa Pharma Plasma located at 3495A Belmont Ave. Schill stated she didn't hear or see anything that happened at the Harbor Freight store. When asked about video cameras, Schill told Shea they have video for the building, but the video system isn't very good. Schill went on to say the outside video barely shows the first row of parking spots in the parking lot.
