Officers and Detectives:

On January 10, 2023 while conducting undercover surveillance with in the city of Euclid, Detectives Buchs #80 and Det. Horna #1, along with Cleveland detectives, observed a vehicle that had been reported stolen in the area of Briardale and E. 260 street. The vehicle was a red in color Kia Sportage that was occupied by multiple suspects and was actively driving around the area. Detectives coordinated with officers on patrol and guided the marked units into the area the vehicle was last seen operating. Ptl. Mausar #52 located the vehicle and observed it being driven in a normal manner and still occupied by multiple suspects. As other units converged on the area the driver accelerated without provocation and almost immediately caused an accident at the intersection of E. 260 Street and Farringdon Avenue.

After the vehicle caused the accident the occupants, later determined to be a juvenile female and a juvenile male known for multiple car thefts in the area, fled the scene on foot. Dursued the male on foot for several blocks through yards and over multiple fences, continuing to provide directions for responding officers. The male was ultimately detained by Det. Horna #1 and the scene of the female was also ultimately detained by SRO. Rodriguez #94.

All of the officers and detectives involved in this incident communicated in an effective and efficient manner. That quick exchange of vital information led to the arrest of two individuals that have repeatedly victimized the citizens of the city and the safe removal of a dangerous weapon from the hands of a juvenile. Everyone that responded to this incident worked exceptionally well as a team and you are all commended for your courageous actions that day.

Gentlemen,

You were all dispatched to a weapons offense on Priday Ave. The female victim reported her husband had shot her, and she fled from the house on foot. The victim was located several houses away from where the shooter was suspected of being.

The victim was located, treated, and transported to the squad which had staged and would not approach, ultimately saving her life.

Simultaneously, the armed suspect's residence was surrounded, and a perimeter was established. The perimeter was held until tactical units from the EDGE SWAT team arrived and ultimately located the suspect deceased inside.

During this roughly 3 hour long ordeal, there were also other priority calls for service that needed to be handled due to it being New Year's Eve. Two officers cleared this scene and began handling the most serious offenses in the city, taking an undue burden upon themselves.

You all acted with extreme professionalism and maturity. You are all to be commended for your quick response, and ability to quickly react and complete vital tasks with little to no direction.

I commend each of you for your diligent response to the shooting into the residence at 1555 E193rd Street. You rendered aid to the 15 year-old male who was shot in the head, and 21 year-old shot in the shoulder. Emergency Room doctors reported that the headshot was "a one in a million" chance that the wound was not debilitating or fatal. They expect the juvenile to make a full recovery. On scene you were resourceful and utilized nearby video footage and the FLOCK system to locate a viable suspect vehicle. Officers later observed the suspect vehicle a gray Jeep, and a second vehicle (white Kia) in association with the main suspect vehicle and gave chase. Officers' actions and radio traffic were measured and concise. You all did an outstanding job. Unfortunately, at this time, we were unable to catch the occupants of either vehicle.

I appreciate your drive, dedication and your efforts to bring those responsible for these crimes in our community to justice. Rest assured; you will see them again another day.







Chief Meyer,

It is with tremendous gratitude that I share my praise for Officer Jason Mausar's actions on Saturday, July 27, 2020 while visiting with her dying uncle at Hospice of the Western Reserve's Hospice House at 300 E. 185th Street, Cleveland. Officer Mausar was visiting with his uncle when a suspect brandished a gun on our private property, and according to some accounts, shot off multiple rounds into the air. The Hospice supervisor called Cleveland 911 at 8:09 pm, but Cleveland incorrectly argued that our address was in Euclid. This delay caused another Hospice staff member to inform Officer Mausar, who was off duty but in uniform, of the event. Officer Mausar immediately surveyed the situation and apprehended the suspect with handcuffs. The suspect fled, and after a foot chase, and the suspect's attempts to get into a moving car to escape, Officer Mausar used non-lethal force to subdue the suspect. Further events demonstrated that there was at least 10 people involved in this event. Officer Mausar was then assisted by Euclid PD back up, and several individuals attempted to argue the issue at hand. All officers remained calm and focused under pressure and escalating tensions. The event ended peacefully, without harm.

We are incredibly thankful for Officer Mausar's willingness to intercede, alone, and make the arrest. We are thankful for the professional manner in which Officer Mausar and other Euclid PD officers responded to this situation, in spite of the event occurring in the City of Cleveland. I worry that, should we have waited for Cleveland PD, there would have been a greater risk of injury or negative outcome. Please know of our profound gratitude for Officer Mausar's efforts, and request that this letter of commendation be placed in Officer Mausar's official file.

Upon interviewing the family members, Officers learned that the male held the handgun to his own head and was still inside of the home. Ptl. Edington was able to view the activity inside of the residence from an adjacent yard as Ptl. Amiott and Ptl. Leyde attempted to phone the male on his cell phone. Ptl. Gilmer attempted to speak with the male via police vehicle loud speaker. Ptl. Amiott was able to verbally de-escalate the distraught male via cell phone and convince him to exit the home (unarmed) so that he could be taken for a psychiatric evaluation. The male was secured in handcuffs and the firearm was located in the basement (unloaded) on top of his children's toys.

The Officers did an outstanding job and utilized great team work. I want to take this opportunity to recognize a job well done. The firearm was recovered and the male was taken for an evaluation. Most importantly all this was accomplished without using any force and no one was injured during this high stress encounter.

This letter will be sent through the chain of command to the Office of the Chief of Police and copies will be placed in their work files.



Recognition of efforts related to ongoing Rape Investigation (Re: on March 29, 2018)

I wanted to recognize and thank you for your efforts in assisting the members of the Euclid Detective Bureau in the ongoing investigation into a violent and brutal rape. On March 29th, 2018, you were asked to work as a team, assigned in both marked and unmarked units, to identify any suspicious behavior and try to identify parties in the area of the incident, in and around the E. 200 St. area.

A person of interest, Rodrigus Harmon, was identified. Within the first few hours of that information being disseminated, you affected the arrest of that party. Additionally, unbeknownst to you at the time, you identified another party that was at least at this time peripherally involved if not directly. Anthony Perrymond was arrested by you on a misdemeanor Euclid warrant. Perrymond was in the area and acting unusual which drew your attention. In the ongoing interviews with Harmon, he indicated that Perrymond was the party responsible for the rape. Your observations of his activity led to the arrest which allowed the Detective Bureau to follow-up on this lead. Although the investigation is still ongoing, these leads need to be followed up on in expeditious manner to conclude the investigation in order to bring the responsible party/parties to justice.

On 3/12/18 a Black Toyota Camry (HIB7946) was stolen at gunpoint near 27701 Mills (18-1423). On 3/14/18, Ptl. Kovach #25 attempted to stop this car travelling South on East 185th from Lakeshore Blvd. The car refused to stop and sped up to around 60+ MPH travelling South in the Northbound lanes. Knowing traffic was heavy and the speeds excessive, Ptl. Kovach made the difficult but informed decision to terminate the pursuit. After terminating, Ptl. Hogrefe #65 located the car minutes later crashed into a telephone pole at E. 185th and Harland.

CPD 5th District Commander Morris witnessed the MVA and observed the 2 suspects running south through backyards on Harland. Commander Morris stayed with the crashed car for the duration of this incident. Responding Euclid and Cleveland cars did an excellent job of continuing updates from neighbors and witnesses. EPD K9 Chase and Ptl. Blakemore began a suspect track after the first male was arrested by Ptl. Kotlar and others nearly a mile away from the crash site. Ptl. Kocsis located a grey hoodie worn by one of the occupants.

A strong perimeter was established and the K9 track continued until the second suspect was flushed out and arrested on Nottingham at Creek View Drive.

All of the officers listed above were instrumental in helping to get these 2 armed and dangerous suspects off the streets. The suspects had a running head start of at least 3 minutes after the crash, and instead of giving up, all officers involved continued the search. This was the finest example of police teamwork I have seen in a while. These officers are to be commended for their actions during this arrest.



On 12/8/2016 at 0246 hrs you were actively patrolling the area of Indian Hills Senior Community. While travelling on Euclid Avenue passing East 193rd Street you observed a vehicle driving at a slow speed N/B on East 193rd. With knowledge of recent violent armed street crimes and drug sales in the area you decided to follow up on your suspicion and watched the vehicle. The vehicle pulled into the parking lot of 1491 East 191st. After a few moments you pulled into the above lot and observed the vehicle idling adjacent to the east side of the building. Upon seeing your patrol car the occupants immediately fled the vehicle on foot. You were able to detain one occupant, a juvenile, and give a description and direction of travel for the other occupants. Upon searching the vehicle you recovered two loaded handguns along with suspected narcotics. One of the handguns was recovered in the map pocket of the driver's seat directly in front of the occupant you detained.

Due to your suspicion and your willingness to follow your "street hunch" that the vehicle was involved in criminal activities several loaded handguns were removed from the hands of potentially violent individuals. The suspect you apprehended was on probation with the Juvenile Court for several Burglaries recently committed in our city. While responding Officers were advised the owner of Mitchell's was remotely viewing that a suspect was inside the business. Officer's arrived within one minute of the alarm being broadcast and immediately set up a perimeter. Once additional officers and a canine from South Euclid Police Department arrived, Officers began a search of the very complex interior of the business. It was learned that there were two suspects in the building via the camera footage. Officers completed an initial search of the building and while doing so located a loaded handgun, dropped by one of the suspects. A secondary search was conducted because officers were confident the suspects were still within the building. While conducting a secondary search, the suspects had doubled back on officers and were located hiding in a restroom and subsequently taken into custody.

I'm extremely proud of the dedication, team work and professionalism you displayed in the course of your duties. I am also thankful that none of you were injured by these armed intruders. You can take pride in the role you played bringing two dangerous individuals to justice.

On July 21, 2023 at 1605 hours you engaged in the pursuit of a vehicle that was believed to be stolen at gunpoint from Cleveland on July 9, 2023 and later suspected to be used in a shooting in Lake County on July 20, 2023. The pursuit reached speeds in excess of 100 mph and resulted in another motorist being struck from behind while traveling about 70 mph.

Your traffic conditions descriptions were limited and not updated as the conditions changed during this incident. You updated the flow of traffic to be "Medium" as you were approaching St. Clair Ave. and the review of the dash camera shows traffic lined up on both the north and southbound side of the road. That is obviously heavy traffic conditions. The highest speed you updated on the marginal was 80 mph when you in fact reached at least 98 mph in that portion of the pursuit. While the time on the highway prior to the accident was brief, you never provided an update on the speeds as you and the suspect traveled over 100 mph. Traffic was yielding when possible, however, the suspect nearly struck several vehicles at various points during the pursuit and none of those actions were broadcast via the radio.

These actions constitute a clear violation of Policy and Procedure **#442 Pursuit** section **IV. Notifying the Dispatcher subsection C. 3.** Which states "Pursuing officers will continue to update the progress of the pursuit throughout the entire pursuit. Location, direction, and speed are critical updates."

The impact on the highway caused significant damage to the suspect vehicle, and the other motorist's vehicle and ultimately disabling damage to your patrol vehicle. After the impact, you immediately acknowledged over the radio that your patrol vehicle was disabled. Despite that fact, you continued operating the vehicle at over 70 mph as the suspect vehicle sped out of view quickly.

This is a clear violation of Rules and Regulations section **10.48 OPERATING VEHICLES** which states "Members of the Police Department shall operate official vehicles in a careful and prudent manner and shall obey all laws and all departmental orders pertaining to such operation (reference P & P #440 & 442)."

Lastly, you were not wearing your department-issued Body Worn Camera properly at the time of this pursuit. It did not activate at all when your lights and siren were turned on, which means it was either still docked in the syncing station or never synced with the in-car system. Either of these would be a violation of the **Mobile Video Recording Police #419**.

Providing accurate updates is critical for the documentation of suspect actions for potential charges and for the continued evaluation of the safety of the general public. The condition and speeds present in this pursuit warranted a much earlier termination based on the facts and evidence that were available at the time of the incident. While I commend your enthusiasm to make the community a safer place by arresting those most violent criminals amongst us. I must also remind you that it is our duty to consider the safety of everyone around us when these criminals choose to run from the consequences of their previous decisions.

As part of this discipline, I am ordering you to attend an Advanced Dynamic Vehicle Operations course through OPOTA, or a similar course. This training should be completed before the end of the calendar year.

I hope this written reprimand and the ordered training serve as reminders for you to accurately update, via the radio, all of the factors involved in these intense and dangerous situations.

This City and surrounding area have been recently plagued by juveniles stealing Kia's and using them to perpetuate other property crimes and crimes of violence throughout our community. You did a great job locating and attempting to stop the stolen Kia occupied by two juveniles in this incident. The driver of the Kia drove over several curbs in the City Municipal lot and flattened the right front tire. When it became apparent that the suspects were not going to yield to police, officers shut down the lights and siren. You continued to follow at a distance as the suspects drove with traffic looking for a place to bail out of the vehicle. The follow continued north on E222nd Street to Babbitt Rd south to N. Lakeland westbound. The vehicle entered I-90 west and the damaged tire came apart leaving debris in the roadway. Officers turned on overhead lights to warn traffic of the unsafe condition. The suspects exited the freeway driving the wrong way down the entrance ramp. You followed. The radio traffic did not reflect this, but at this point, this clearly turned into a pursuit situation as you continued to chase the Kia across the Gateway Campus. The suspects bailed out of the vehicle and were taken into custody. The passenger gave up at the vehicle, and the driver was apprehended after a short foot pursuit.

There were no injuries and no property was damaged in this incident.

The tenacity of yourself and the officers involved is commendable, however, the end does not justify the means. The community expects us to not just do the job, but to do it correctly. In this incident, there were several sections of the Pursuit Policy that were not followed.

Just because we enforce the law, does not exempt us from following the rules while we do it. I very much appreciate your efforts. That said, I can't help you if I don't know what you are doing and I want to make sure that you get home safe at the end of the shift.

Please familiarize yourself with the selected sections of the Pursuit Policy below:

#442 Pursuit Policy

Policy Statement (excerpt)

The public expects that the police will apprehend offenders, but public support is necessary to accomplishment of law enforcement goals. Public acceptance of risks inherent in vehicular pursuit is related to the severity of the offense that causes police to pursue. While support remains strong for police pursuit where the fleeing suspect is known to be violent and the offense for which they are pursued is perceived as serious, this support wanes when officers, suspects and innocent persons are harmed as a result of crashes after pursuit for offenses that are perceived as relatively minor.

"Vehicular pursuit" means "an attempt to apprehend a suspect who is actively attempting to elude apprehension".

II Determining when to initiate or continue a pursuit

A. Absent extraordinary circumstances, officers may pursue fleeing vehicles only when there is probable cause to believe that a person in that vehicle fleeing from having committed a recent (or "fresh") violent felony.

III Requirements and Prohibitions

D. At no time will officers pursue the wrong way on a freeway or one-way street.

IV Notifying the Dispatcher

A. The unit initiating the pursuit will notify the dispatcher that a pursuit situation exists.

Subject: Oral Reprimand

On 8-30-20 you were involved in the pursuit () of a vehicle which contained possible suspects from a shooting in our city. The pursuit went through several cities then it came back into Euclid. The vehicle eventually stopped at the Sunoco at 940 E222. Police officers surrounded the vehicle and the scene was very chaotic. The vehicle had tinted windows and the air bags had deployed from an MVA during the pursuit. You had an AR 15 in hand and you approached the front of the vehicle. You were able to order two suspects in the vehicle to show their hands and they complied. You were able to see both suspects through the front windshield of the vehicle but you did not have a clear view of the rest of the vehicle. You stepped up onto the hood of the vehicle and you moved up to the windshield. After the suspects were removed from the vehicle you got off the vehicle. A weapon was recovered from the vehicle and you handled the weapon without gloves. You removed a bag from the vehicle and went through the bag without gloves. The evidence was removed from the vehicle after Sgt Novitski broadcasted that the vehicle would be towed to the processing garage and to do a visual search of the vehicle. Your initial report was incomplete and the finished report does not describe many aspects needed for the report. You do not explain who found what evidence. There were officers that assisted from other agencies on scene. Some of these officers went into the suspect vehicle but they are not listed on the report.

I understand that visibility inside the vehicle was limited but video shows that you had a clear view of the suspect's hands from the front of the vehicle. When you got on top of the vehicle, it was still running; and, it limited your view of the vehicle even further. The vehicle rolled forward several feet while you were on the hood. This shows that not only was the vehicle running but it was not in park. You getting on the hood put yourself at risk from a tactical standpoint and it jeopardized the safety of everyone around you. A cross fire situation was present during the entire situation. The handling of the scene was very poor. Numerous officers went in and out of the vehicle. The chain of custody for evidence was not maintained. The names of many officers involved in the report are not listed. The Sgt on scene left because of an injured officer located elsewhere. The management of the scene falls to the reporting officer.

Your unsafe actions, lack of controlling the scene and the poor report writing shows an unsatisfactory performance. This is in violation of rule 10.14 Unsatisfactory Performance.

This oral reprimand will be forwarded through the Chain of Command to the Chief of Police and a copy will be placed in your personnel file.

Counseling / Training

On May 2, 2018, I had a formal counseling session with a second in regard to a traffic stop is assigned to the Fourth Platoon which is encouraged to be proactive, conduct criminal interdiction, directed patrol as well as routine patrol functions. The stop resulted in the arrest of an armed felon who was in possession of a loaded stolen firearm. During the arrest the suspect assaulted and attempted to access the firearm he had on his person. Counseling was in the form of suggestions made for best practices on traffic stop.

In review of the available video surveillance, I noted that the officer did not initially call out / advise dispatch of the stop. The dispatch center was notified of the stop after the initial approach. I advised him that for his safety it would be best to call out the stop if possible prior to approaching the car. Additionally, per policy 437 "Prior to stopping a motorist or pedestrian, the officer shall notify the communications center in accordance with applicable communication protocols, and shall observe applicable safety precautions in selecting the site for the stop, signaling the individual to stop, positioning the police vehicle and approaching the motorist or pedestrian. Upon concluding the stop, an appropriate notation should be made of the stop and the enforcement action taken." This information was shared with

Additionally, after the initial observations at the car, noted indicators that the subject was involved in illegal activity. noted that he observed what he believed to be narcotics in the car and the male had what appeared could possibly be a weapon in his sweatshirt. Although backup was requested and was in route to assist, he approached the car a second time before backup officers were on scene and readily available. It was apparent that wanted to have the driver step out of the car in order gain control of him and further search the car. attempted to use a diffusing tactic of asking the suspect to step to the rear of the car to show him the violation for the stop. The suspect was reluctant to exit the car and became argumentative. He stood up out of the car and immediately sat back in the car. When he tried to get back in, stopped him from doing so, now telling him to exit the car. The first backup unit arrived as this was going on. Again, I advised to slow down and control the stop. Waiting for backup to arrive prior to making the second approach would have been best. Additional officers on scene could potentially have deterred the suspect from launching the attack.

Two articles were provided to **Second Second Second**

This counseling was conducted to offer training and provide suggestions on best practices in the noted safety issues to be corrected in future traffic stops / encounters. A copy of this report will be maintained in personnel file.

Although police officials have long recognized the need for two officers to respond on any kind of call with a potential for danger, a new study found that 34 percent of officers killed while responding to calls over a recent five-year period did not have backup when they were slain. In many of the cases, they were dispatched alone, and sometimes they simply did not wait for a second officer to arrive The study also found that domestic disputes resulted in the highest portion of officer killings, 22 percent, followed by "disturbance" calls at 18 percent.

The new study, released Friday by the Justice Department's Office of Community Oriented Policing Services, comes as the nation is reeling from the slaying of five officers in Dallas and three officers in Baton Rouge earlier this month, and then the killing of a gang-suppression <u>officer in San Diego</u> on Thursday night. So far this year, 34 police officers have been shot to death, compared with 19 during the same time last year, a 79 percent increase, according to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund.

The NLEOMF provided the authors, Nick Breul and Mike Keith, and the data for the new analysis of 684 lineof-duty deaths in law enforcement from 2010 to 2014, to include not only police and sheriff's departments but also corrections, federal and regulatory agencies across the country. The NLEOMF is widely recognized as the definitive source on tracking law enforcement fatalities.

Of the 684 law enforcement deaths in that five-year period, 272 were traffic related, most of which were not related to responding to a call, the study found. One hundred thirty-four other officers were shot while not

the public over five years, and Cordner said that makes it harder for every officer to be vigilant on every call, no matter how minor it seems.

Of the 91 dispatched cases studied, 31 of the officers, or 34 percent, were alone when they were killed. Of those 31 officers, 12 had been dispatched alone. In 41 of the 91 cases, or 45 percent, the officers had been advised that the suspect might be armed or threatening. In 18 of the cases, or 20 percent, the suspects were classified as having mental illness, the study found.

The study also looked at 41 cases where officers initiated the activity and died. Of those, 63 percent were traffic stops, and 17 percent were "suspicious person" and 12 percent were "suspicious vehicle" stops.

In the 26 fatal traffic stops, 11 were killed while speaking to the occupants, and half of the 26 cases involved only one occupant in the vehicle. Overall, the shooter was a passenger 54 percent of the time, and the driver 46 percent of the time. Breul and Keith noted that officers making traffic stops are at risk and should run the vehicle's license plate before making contact and that "dispatchers must continually check on the welfare of officers who have marked out on a traffic stop." They recommended that officers wear radio earpieces so wanted suspects cannot hear information about their status and to approach from the right side to protect against "struck-by crashes" as well as gain some distance and protection from an armed driver.

The study found that 81 percent of the officers killed in the 132 cases studied were wearing body armor, 14 percent were not and 5 percent were unknown. Most police body armor does not protect against the largest and most high-velocity rounds, nor does it protect every part of the body. The study found that 21 percent of the slain officers were killed by high-powered rifles.


Although most police departments long ago moved from two-officer to one-officer patrol cars, the debate over that switch never ended. Many departments recently moved temporarily to two-officer cars in the wake of the Dallas and Baton Rouge ambushes. Breul and Keith wrote that they "are not emphasizing two-man patrols but believe there is inherent safety of having multiple officers on the scene of those calls for service that are potentially dangerous and violent."

NOTE: This post has been updated to clarify that one-third of the officers killed while alone were responding to calls for service, not all officers killed in all situations.

The remaining cases of officers killed while engaged in self-initiated activity involved officers stopping to assist a disabled vehicle or to investigate an apparent traffic crash. In these instances, officers were reacting to an incident they came across while on patrol. These were not the result of a dispatched call for service or a request from another police unit for assistance.



Traffic Stops: A Closer Look

Traffic Stops accounted for 26 (63 percent) of the 41 self-initiated cases that lead to line of duty fatalities. Enforcing traffic regulations represent the most common form of contact the public has with law enforcement.

These cases provide valuable training points and lessons learned for lawenforcement through dashboard camera footage that also includes an audio recording of the incident. Though painful and disturbing to watch, the research team reviewed those available videos to gain a full understanding of what happened during the fatal encounter.

The research team analyzed the cases involving vehicle stops to try and discover how each fatal encounter unfolded. The research team looked at the circumstances of each case and tried to glean what vehicle information the officer obtained prior to making contact with the driver, whether they notified the dispatcher of their location, and at what point during the stop was the officer killed.


Officers killed while placing a suspect under arrest, or after the subject was in custody, following a traffic stop, represent the smallest number of cases, with five and two, respectively.

The cases where officers were killed while making an arrest involved shootings that occurred as the officer went to place the subject in handcuffs. In one of those cases, two officers were shot and killed when they asked an individual with an outstanding arrest warrant, to exit the vehicle.

One case that accounted for two deaths was the result of a suspect who was in custody following a traffic stop and arrest for impaired driving. The two officers, who were seated in the front of the patrol car, were shot by the suspect who had been put into the rear seat of the vehicle with his hands cuffed in front of him. The suspect retrieved a pistol that was hidden on his person and shot both officers. This tragic case is one of those whose circumstances, though rare, was notable and re-emphasizes the necessity of thorough searches and handcuffing prisoners behind their back.

Number of Occupants

The research team also looked at the number of vehicle occupants involved in fatal cases. This was examined to provide a perspective on what the breakdown was for officers being assaulted when stopping a vehicle occupied by just a driver or when stopping a vehicle with multiple occupants. Figure 9 details this information.

It is a general practice in law enforcement that officers stopping a vehicle will notify the dispatcher how many people are in the car. This information alerts the dispatcher and other officers monitoring the radio that the officer conducting the stop is outnumbered. This usually prompts swift backup assistance and will guide how the stop is conducted as there are now multiple people to monitor. This is tied to the assumption that the presence of multiple officers can present a greater threat than a lone driver. However, of the 26 *Traffic Stops* cases, 13, or

approaching the vehicle. The trooper made a passenger-side approach and made contact with a male driver and female passenger.

The trooper asked the driver for his license, registration and proof of insurance, and as the driver pretended to reach for his glovebox with his left hand, he drew a handgun in front of the female passenger's face and fired at the trooper. His shot struck the trooper in the head, killing him.

The suspect then fled the scene in the pickup. Assistance was sent to the location of the trooper's stop because the dispatcher could not raise him on the radio. A local sheriff was the first to respond and found the trooper in a ditch by the side of the road. The subsequent investigation, which was initiated off of the vehicle license information the trooper had provided the dispatcher, resulted in the shooter killing himself before being taken into custody.

The trooper, in this case, had no way of knowing that he had stopped an agitated and paranoid drug user who simply decided to kill him. By the trooper reporting the location of the stop and providing a description of the pickup and license number, he left an investigative trail to follow.

The passenger-side approach can be safer than the driver-side approach and can catch suspects off guard. It can protect officers who may be struck by passing traffic and depending on the type of vehicle, offers more protection to the approaching officer.

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Red Flags and Recommendations

- Officers making traffic stops are at risk from an unexpected assault as they do not always know who they have stopped and how someone may react.
 - Officers must notify the dispatcher of their location and vehicle description, including license plate number and the number of occupants.
 - Officers with Mobile Digital Computers should run the vehicle's license plate before making contact with the driver and, if not, await the dispatcher's response information on the vehicle.
- Dispatchers must continually check on the welfare of officers who have marked out on a traffic stop and send backup to the officer's location upon verifying a wanted status on a vehicle or suspect.

Further incidents of a similar nature will result in progressive disciplinary measures.

Simultaneously, in your left hand, you held your Taser.

Procedure <u>#08-001-425 TASER</u> section (I)(C)(3) states:

"NO OFFICER SHALL MANIPULATE BOTH A TASER AND A FIREARM SIMULTANEOUSLY."

Additionally while you were conducting this arrest, another officer made inappropriate comments on the radio which you made an inappropriate response, making a "whining" noise provoking a further inappropriate response.

I am issuing you a written reprimand due to the safety concerns by manipulating both taser and firearm at the same time and your inappropriate behavior on the radio.

I have full confidence that this situation will not re-occur. Your desire to be aggressive and take dangerous criminals off the streets is commendable, but it must be combined with adherence to safety protocols, departmental policy and rules.

Further violation of this policy will result in progressive discipline.

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POLICY AND PROCEDURE ACKNOWLEDGMENT

Policy and Procedure 441 covering the use of police vehicle mobile video systems and body cameras is currently under review for an update. Until such time that a new Policy and Procedure is issued, the current Policy and Procedure remains in effect.

Policy #441, Section IV

IV. Mobile Systems

- A. When an Officer is assigned a police vehicle that is equipped with a mobile video system, that officer will set up and use the system throughout the tour of duty.
- B. The wireless microphone will be used to provide audio narration at all times when the recording equipment is in operation.
- C. The mobile video system will be used during all enforcement and investigative contacts when these contacts are in sufficient proximity to the police vehicle to obtain sound and video. The system may be used to provide audio recordings of the officer contacts in circumstances that do not permit video recording.
- D. Once the system is activated during an officer contact, the officer will not stop the recording until the contact has concluded.
- E. The digital mobile video system, when activated, will automatically record all video and audio to the systems hard drive.
 - 1. Each officer will ascertain that the digital recordings of DUI's, pursuits and arrests are saved in DVD format.
 - An officer may request that a DVD copy be made of other types of incidents or of any incident when he believes such recordings may serve evidentiary or documentary purpose or has training value.
 - 3. Each officer will make written notification to their supervisor requesting a DVD copy of any digital recording that is needed for any of the above stated purposes.



Dear Chief Meyer:

As you are aware, Euclid Police Department (hereinafter "EPD") was involved in a shooting on June 7, 2023 while in the course and scope of his employment with the EPD in the area of Fox Avenue and E. 222nd Street, Euclid, OH (EPD Report No. . On the same date, the EPD requested assistance from the Ohio Attorney General's Office Bureau of Criminal Investigation (hereinafter "BCI") in investigating this officer-involved shooting involving and subject Kevin Idom.

On or about September 28, 2023, the City of Euclid received the BCI Prosecutor Summary of the Officer-Involved Critical Incident-Fox Avenue & E. 222nd Street, Euclid, (hereinafter "Prosecutor Summary from BCI Special Agent Joseph Goudy. The written report is thorough and includes 48 pages of facts and analyses of the incident. SA Goudy reviewed items including, but not limited to: recorded interviews of the officer who discharged his weapon and others who were involved or had relevant information on the incident; recorded interviews of the subject and others involved; interviews of civilian witnesses; footage from dash cameras, body cameras, surveillance videos; 3D scans, scene and vehicle processing records; 911 communications and dispatch logs; medical and EMS records; Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission certification status and EPD policies and procedures. Additionally, a search warrant was obtained for cellular telephones and the electronic evidence was analyzed. Forensic laboratory exams were also conducted on the firearm, casing, bullets and DNA.

For purposes of this decision, the pertinent portions of the BCI Prosecutor Summary state as follows:

On Wednesday, June 7, 2023, at approximately 11:20 am, was notified by the FLOCK system that a vehicle was stolen in the area of the Euclid Amazon facility. The FLOCK system was activated when the stolen license plate from the silver Hyundai was scanned as it drove

by the area of Lakeland Boulevard and Babbitt Road. After receiving the alert, **and** notified the other EPD patrol vehicles to be on the look-out for the Hyundai. Shortly thereafter, Ptl. Gabrielle Crombie located the vehicle travelling Northbound on Babbitt Road from Lakeland Boulevard. *See* Prosecutor Summary **1**, 3.

After locating the vehicle, Crombie followed said vehicle and advised she observed four "kids" in the vehicle at the time. was then following behind Crombie. When the stolen silver Hyundai Sonata turned Westbound onto Fox Avenue from Babbitt Road, it reached the intersection of E. 222nd Street and Fox Avenue and stopped at the traffic signal. *See* Prosecutor Summary p. 3-4

At this point, an unmarked EPD detective's vehicle driven by and with passenger got into position behind the stolen Hyundai Sonata as it was stopped at the intersection. After the detective's vehicle got into position, and Crombie drove their marked EPD units around the front of the stolen Hyundai Sonata in an attempt to box in the vehicle to prevent it from fleeing. After the marked units made their move, the stolen vehicle drove in reverse to attempt to escape, struck the unmarked detective vehicle and injured in the process. *See* Prosecutor Summary **1**, p. 4

As the stolen Hyundai Sonata was driving in reverse, it struck another parked vehicle in addition to a telephone pole before it came to a stop. After the vehicle came to a stop, stopped his vehicle next to the stolen Hyundai and exited his vehicle to detain the occupants. While doing so, according to body camera footage and apartment building surveillance video, the back-seat occupant of the stolen Hyundai exited the vehicle at the same time. The back-seat passenger was later identified as Kevin Idom (Idom). *See* Prosecutor Summary

As Idom exited from the stolen Hyundai, he is observed having a semi-automatic handgun in his left hand. As the tried to detain Idom, Idom continued to run while still holding the semi-automatic handgun in his left hand. Started a foot pursuit of Idom and started a ran towards Idom at an angle to cut off any possible path of escape. *See* Prosecutor Summary 1997, p. 4

Shortly thereafter, we yelled out that Idom had a gun. Then fired three rounds at Idom. According to the body camera footage from the direction of the semiautomatic handgun in the direction of the and the on multiple occasions as he was running away from them trying to elude capture. Idom was struck one time in the right leg. As Idom was falling to the ground, he threw the semi-automatic handgun which landed on the ground near where he laid. The secured Idom and began to render first-aid treatment until EMS arrived. Idom was transferred to the hospital to be treated for non-life-threatening injuries. *See* Prosecutor Summary 1990, p. 4

The interview with subject Idom is not credible. Idom was a passenger in the Hyundai but was allegedly unaware it was stolen. He believed the car was abandoned property. After the police pulled up on them and subsequent crash, Idom fled from the Hyundai because he was "scared for his life because he didn't know what was going on." He also did not know why the officer shot him, but he cooperated after he was shot. He even apologizes to officers while in the ambulance en route to the hospital. *See* Prosecutor Summary p. 18. Idom admits to being in possession of a gun but said it was in his pocket and he never reached for it—not even to discard it. This is

refuted by body camera and video surveillance evidence. The body camera photos from included in the report are very clear and show the gun being pointed in direction on multiple occasions. *See* Prosecutor Summary p. 11-12.

Other interviews conducted of EPD officers (Crombie, Crombie, and witnesses are consistent with those of and the forensic evidence recovered in this matter. *See* Prosecutor Summary p. 15-18.

Based on the facts and analyses of the incident involving and the and Kevin Idom as investigated by outside agency BCI and set forth in Prosecutor Summary the City of Euclid will NOT be referring this matter for review by a special prosecutor. This shooting was justified. In fact, the engaged in extreme restraint on a couple of occasions when the subject's handgun was pointed at the Hyundai (*See* Prosecutor Summary p. 14) and then pointed at the foot pursuit (*See* Prosecutor Summary p. 15).

This individual has undergone a qualifying program consisting of various handgun and rifle Tests. The time and accuracy standards of these Tests are among the strictest standards within the entire training industry. The reactive targets used in this Testing program range from human torso size to partial head-sized targets. The student ratings that can be obtained in this Testing program are Basic, Intermediate, and Advanced.
This course required the shooter to use cover and shoot accurately from a stationary position or while moving and shooting. It also demanded that they reload immediately and tactically with both weapon systems. They learned to transition to their handgun when their AR15 rifle went down and learned to go back and forth between each weapon system seamlessly. They were required to perform two-handed drawing and shooting, along with one-handed-only drawing and shooting with their handgun. In addition, they had to complete one-handed-only handgun reloads quickly and safely.
The standards required the students to react within fractions of a second in realistic time constraints, with multiple targets at various ranges. They were unaware of the location or distance from which the target would appear or the number of targets they would be required to engage. They were required to immediately react to the target stimulus, unaware of how long each target would be exposed. The targets included a difficult hostage situation requiring both speed and accuracy to complete successfully.


