Narrative:

On December 21, 2022, the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) was requested to investigate the facts and circumstances surrounding an Officer–Involved Critical Incident (OICI) that occurred at Sidney Foodtown, located at 1010 Wapakoneta Avenue, Sidney, Shelby County, Ohio. The OICI occurred when Sidney police officers encountered Todd I. Jordan (Jordan), who was armed with a gun inside Sidney Foodtown.

On December 21, 2022, at 1130 hours, BCI Special Agent Chris Hamberg (SA Hamberg) interviewed Virgie Calim (Calim) in an interview room at the Sidney Police Department. The interview was digitally recorded. The audio file is attached to the case file.

The purpose of the interview was to ascertain what Calim may have witnessed at the Foodtown grocery store in regard to the OICI incident.

Calim is an employee at Foodtown and works in the meat department. SA Hamberg asked Calim if she could describe how the events took place prior to the incident. Calim stated she was working back in her department when she heard two (2) gunshots inside the store. Calim stated right after the gunshots, she heard an employee "yell" for everyone to run and hide. Calim stated she, Andy Rempe (Rempe), Annette Wooddell (Wooddell) and her son [Dylan Wooddell (Dylan)] and another lady went inside the meat cooler and stayed there until the police arrived and told them they could come out. Calim added that Dylan told them while they were inside the cooler that, Todd Jordan (Jordan) shot at him (Dylan).

SA Hamberg asked Calim if she observed the shooter, when Calim stated no. SA Hamberg asked Calim if she called 911, when Calim stated yes and she called at 0803 hours, after they were inside the meat cooler. Calim stated she had nothing further to provide on the incident.
