exclusive of the plumbing, heating, ventilating and electrical work in said second story. This contract calls for an expenditure of sixteen thousand, nine hundred and eighty-one dollars (\$16,981.00).

You have submitted the certificate of the Director of Finance to the effect that there are unencumbered balances legally appropriated in a sum sufficient to cover the obligations of the contract.

You have also submitted a bond with personal sureties, the auditor of Hancock county having certified that said sureties are worth in the aggregate in an amount beyond their debts above the contract price sufficient to insure the carrying out of the terms and provisions of said contract, and further that said sureties have property in Ohio liable to execution in the amount certified.

You have further submitted evidences indicating that plans were properly prepared and approved, notice to bidders was properly given, bids tabulated as required by law and the contract duly awarded. Also it appears that the law requiring the certificate of premium payment as certified to by the Department of Industrial Relations has been complied with.

Finding said contract and bond in proper legal form, I have this day noted my approval thereon and return the same herewith to you, together with all other data submitted in this connection.
