OPINIONS

SECOND TRACT: Being a strip of ground approximately 85 feet in width included in the canal and its embankments, fronting on the northerly line of Bowery and Quarry Streets in said City of Akron, and extending thence northerly a distance of 125 feet measured along the center line of the State Canal property, as shown by G. F. Silliman's survey of said canal, made under the direction of the State Board of Public Works in the summer of 1912.

Upon examination of this lease, I find that the same has been properly executed by you in your official capacity and by the lessee above named. I further find that the provisions of this lease and of the conditions and restrictions therein contained are in conformity with section 13965, et seq., of the General Code and with other statutory enactments relating to canal land leases.

I am accordingly approving this lease as to legality and form, as is evidenced by my approval endorsed upon the lease and upon the duplicate and triplicate copies thereof, all of which are herewith enclosed.
