Narrative:

On Tuesday, December 20, 2022, the Marion County Sheriff’s Office and Marion Police Department requested the assistance of the Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI) with the investigation of an Officer Involved Critical Incident which occurred in LaRue, Marion County, Ohio. As the result of this investigation, Agents obtained the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission (OPOTC) Records for ██████████ (██████████). Special Agent Supervisor (SAS) Scott Stranahan then reviewed the records received from OPOTC.

██████████ attended the OPOTC training (basic police academy) on three separate occasions and was awarded OPOTC certificates each time. ██████████ attended the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy (class # JBT96-034) from November 4, 1996 through November 8, 1996. ██████████ received certificate number ██████████ as the result of this training session. ██████████ then attended the Marion Peace Officer Training School (class # BAS-97-099) from September of 1997 through March of 1998. Following this training, ██████████ received OPOTC certificate number ██████████ and was appointed by the Marion Police Department in September of 1997. Lastly, ██████████ attended the Marion Law Enforcement Academy (class # BAS-14-069) from August of 2014 through May of 2015. ██████████ received OPOTC certificate number ██████████ and was appointed by the Marion County Sheriff's Office.

OPOTC records showed ██████████ received the following "appointments" by Law Enforcement Agencies:
