Re: Bonds of Nelsonville city school district, in amount of \$100,000 for purpose of acquiring real estate and constructing thereon a new school building, being 1 bond payable in 20 installments of \$5,000 each—6 per cent.

GENTLEMEN:—I have examined the transcript of the proceedings of the board of education and other officers of Nelsonville city school district, relative to the above bond issue, and find the same regular and in conformity with the provisions of the General Code.

I am of the opinion that a bond for said issue with combined principal and interest coupons attached, drawn in accordance with the bond resolution authorizing the same and in compliance with the resolution of the industrial commission adopted under authority of section 1465-58a G. C. will, upon delivery, constitute a valid and binding obligation of said school district.

The resolution of purchase adopted by the industrial commission provides that said bonds shall fall due, one bond on March 1st of each year of the years 1923 to 1942 inclusive. In order to meet the requirements of the Griswold law, the board of education has amended its bond resolution so that the bonds shall fall due one on the first day of September of each of the years 1923 to 1942.

I suggest that the industrial commission amend its resolution of purchase to conform to the change in the bond resolution referred to.
