Firearms Range Safety Rules

- 1) All weapons will be unloaded prior to arriving at the range. You can have a loaded side arm as long as it is **secured** in its holster.
- 2) Upon needing to unload a weapon, officers will advise the range master that they have a loaded weapon, which needs to be unloaded. The weapon will then be unloaded pointed down range.
- 3) No alcohol, drugs or tobacco are permitted at the range.

Classroom Safety

- 1) **KEEP FIREARMS ALWAYS POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION!**
- 2) **KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER.**
- 3) **HANDLE ALL FIREARMS AS IF THEY ARE LOADED AT ALL TIMES.**

- 6) Any horseplay or other inappropriate action is cause for immediate expulsion from the training and/or range.
- 7) When firearms are out of their holsters or cases; being handled by the officer (outside the firing line area), handed to another person (outside the firing line area), or laying on a table, etc., the firearms should be in the following condition:
- Semi-automatics: Will have the magazine removed and the slide locked back
 - Shotguns: Will have the slide open, and all rounds removed from the magazine.
 - Rifle: Will have the magazine removed and the action open, bolt locked back.
- 8) No weapon will be drawn, loaded or fired except on the command of the firearms instructor. Dry firing will only be conducted while under the supervision of a firearms instructor, or certified armorer, with permission of firearms instructor.
- 9) Officers will not chew gum, chew tobacco, or have any other items in their mouth while shooting. No food or drinks on the firing line.
- 10) Officers will remain in their assigned shooting area.
- 11) While training is in progress, officer will limit talking to the firearms instructor only.
- 12) All officers must wear ear and eye protection while on the firing line. The Union Township Police Department will provide eye and ear protection if needed. However individual officers can bring his or her own wrap around type eye protection and adequate ear protection to wear, but firearms instructor must approve it.
- 13) Pay strict attention to the range officers/instructors commands. **NEVER ASSUME!**
- 14) Be familiar with, and make sure you understand, the range officers command before firing.
- 15) Before firing, make sure that no one is down range; be especially cautious, if shooting barricades are in place.
- 16) Load, when and as instructed.
- 17) Never draw the weapon, or re-holster the weapon, with the shooting finger on the trigger, or inside the trigger guard.
- 18) Anytime you have a misfire, or a malfunction:
- (a) If you have any malfunction you are expected to clear the problem immediately by using proper methods.
 - (b) Keep the weapon pointed down range!
 - (c) Let the firearms instructor know you are having a problem.
 - (d) **When you fire, IF ANYTHING does not feel right or sound normal, DO NOT fire the next round!**
 - (e) If you have any problems, the instructor will talk you through the problem.
- 19) If you leave the firing line, your weapon will be holstered, secured, pointed in safe direction for long guns and safety on if it applies.
- 20) **Strictest discipline must be maintained; carelessness cannot, must not, and will not be tolerated.**



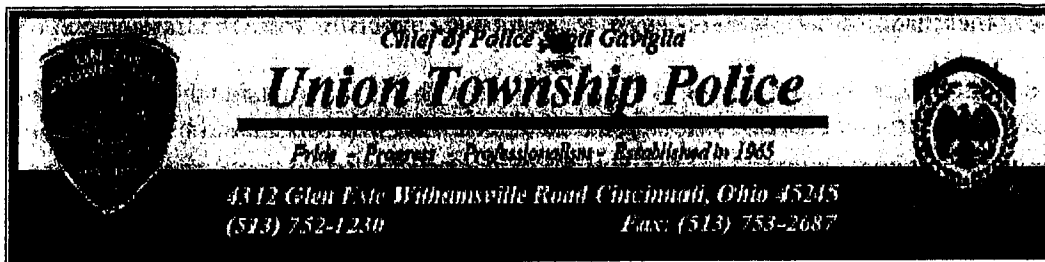

Firearms Range Safety Rules

- 1) All weapons will be unloaded prior to arriving at the range. You can have a loaded side arm as long as it is **secured** in its holster.
- 2) Upon needing to unload a weapon, officers will advise the range master that they have a loaded weapon, which needs to be unloaded. The weapon will then be unloaded pointed down range.
- 3) No alcohol, drugs or tobacco are permitted at the range.

Classroom Safety
