APPROVAL, CONTRACT OF STATE OF OHIO WITH E. L. BRUEGGE-MAN, AKRON, FOR CONSTRUCTION OF REINFORCED CONCRETE WASTE-WAY AT WEST RESERVOIR, NEAR AKRON, OHIO.

Gentlemen:—The receipt is acknowledged of your letter of February 1, 1922, transmitting for my examination proposed contract, in triplicate form, with E. L. Brueggeman, Akron, Ohio, covering construction of a reinforced concrete wasteway at West Reservoir, near Akron, Ohio.

Papers submitted with the contract in question include the following:

- (1) Proof of publication showing insertion in the Beacon Journal, Akron, Ohio, for four consecutive weeks, beginning December 9, 1921, of notice of the receipt of bids on January 10, 1922.
